

The prophet Isaiah talked about the coming of a very special child (First Reading). But there is no reason to believe that he knew just how special that child would be. Every king of David's line was an embodiment of God"s promise to be "with us". But Christians believe that Isaiah's prophecy only found its complete fulfillment in Jesus. The Second Reading and the Gospel reveal to us the true identity, in fact, the double identity, of this special Child (Jesus). No prophecy is fully understood until after its fulfillment.

Both St Paul and St Matthew make it clear that, in the first place, Jesus was the Son of David. This was so because Joseph, his legal father, was descended from the line of David. David is one of the greatest figures in the Old Testament. He succeeded Saul as King of Israel. It was he who united the scattered tribes and formed them into a nation. Even though he sinned, he repented. Many times in the Gospel Jesus is referred to as "Son of David".

To say that Jesus came from the line of David was already a great thing. But he is more than that. He has another, and infinitely greater, identity. He is "Emmanuel", which means "God is with us." He is not just the Son of David but also the Son of God. Hence he is able to save his people from their sins.

The second identity of Jesus was something which was only gradually revealed and gradually understood. In fact, it was only after he had been raised from the dead that he was accepted as "the Lord" (see Second Reading). He himself said this identity could not be recognized unless it was revealed by the Father. It is a matter of faith, which is a gift of God.

We believe then in the double identity of Jesus. He is Son of David and Son of God. But we too have a double identity. As children of our parents we are human beings, which means we have a human dignity. That in itself is a great thing. But through Jesus we have become children of God, which means we also have a divine dignity. However, our divine dignity, like that of Jesus, is a matter of faith.

Christmas is a wonderful time. It recalls the greatest event in history: namely, the Incarnation, when God's Son came down on earth to confer on us the dignity of children of God. It's not true that Christmas is just about children. It's about us all. We may consider ourselves very ordinary. But nobody is ordinary any longer, not since Christ came to earth.

The world today is in danger of drowning in bad news. It is crying out for good news. But the best news of all is the news brought by the angel to the shepherds: "Behold I bring you good news of a great joy for all the people. This day a Savior is born to you. He is Christ the Lord." Let us open our hearts to receive the good news.



Readings for the Fourth Sunday of Advent

Reading 1 Is 7:10-14

The LORD spoke to Ahaz, saying: Ask for a sign from the LORD, your God; let it be deep as the netherworld, or high as the sky! But Ahaz answered, "I will not ask! I will not tempt the LORD!" Then Isaiah said: Listen, O house of David! Is it not enough for you to weary people, must you also weary my God?
