

Gospel Reflection with Fr. Tom

When John the Baptist said of Jesus, "There is the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world ... " he uttered a great truth about the mission of Jesus. Jesus" mission was directed at sinners. Jesus was that Servant, whose coming was foretold by Isaiah, and whose mission would be to bring sinners back to God. But how was he to do this?

In Old Testament times, on the day of atonement the Jews would choose a goat. The priest made a list of the sins of the people, while at the same time calling on them to repent. Then placing his hands on the goat's head, he pressed down, thereby imposing the sins on the goat, as if he and he alone was guilty. Then, laden with the sins of the people, the goat was sent into the desert.

Is this the kind of thing John the Baptist had in mind? That all we have to do is dump our sins on Jesus and then forget about them. Could it be that simple? That easy?

Jesus does indeed take away our sins in the sense that through him we have forgiveness for our sins, and so are able to put them behind us. When we are forgiven, a very real load, a great burden, is lifted from us, and we are able to go forward freely and joyfully.

But we also have to accept responsibility for our sins. And even when we are forgiven, everything doesn't magically come right for us. We don't suddenly become new people. Our old weaknesses, habits and compulsions are still with us. Which means we still have to struggle.

Sin is not an object that can be removed from us. Sin is a condition in which we live, a condition from which we need to be redeemed. Jesus came to redeem us from that condition, and to enable us to live a new life.

How did he get sinners to change their way of life? He did so, not by condemning them and keeping his distance from them, but by befriending them. He put them in touch with that core of goodness which exists in everyone. Through his own luminous goodness he evoked goodness in them.

Jesus befriends us too. And he evokes goodness in us too. That is the only way to go if we wish to overcome sin. Evil can be overcome only by goodness. Here the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is a great help. It is a place where we can experience the love of Jesus for us in our sins. It is not an impersonal getting rid of sins. Rather, it is a loving encounter with Jesus our Savior, who calls us away from sin to goodness of life.

Victory over sin comes about as a lifelong struggle. We must not become depressed when we see ourselves making what seems like very little progress. What is important is the struggle for goodness. The purpose of a good life is not to win the battle, but to wage it unceasingly.
