

## Gospel Reflection with Fr. Tom

If the light becomes darkness, what hope is there for the world? Oskar Schindler was a German industrialist. During the Second World War he set up a factory in Poland. He saved over a thousand Jews by giving them work in his factory. When the Germans surrendered at the end of the war, Schindler abandoned the factory and escaped westwards to avoid the Russians who were approaching from the east. Meanwhile the liberated workers waited in the factory for the arrival of the Russians. While they waited, they found a German officer by the name of Amon bunkered inside the factory. Amon had been responsible for several brutal killings. A group of men dragged him out and enthusiastically and mercilessly hanged him. Some inmates tried to intervene, but the executioners were in such a rage that they could not be stopped.

This was the first homicide of the peace. It was an event which would be abhorred forever by those who witnessed it. The hanging of Amon sickened them as profoundly as any of the executions Amon himself had carried out. After all, Amon was a Nazi, and beyond altering. But these hangmen were their own brothers. Instead of reaping satisfaction from it, all it did was sadden and depress them.

Our pain and hurt can so easily turn into rage, with the result that we inflict on others the injuries inflicted to us. Hatred is a very dangerous thing. It burns up a hundred times more energy than love. It drives out everything else and corrodes and warps the soul. "Love your enemies" - this is one of the most revolutionary things ever said. All the revolutionaries said the enemy must be destroyed.

Love our enemies? Most of us find it hard enough to love our friends. How then can we be expected to love our enemies? All of us have some enemies, or at least some people we positively dislike. Why is that we dislike these particular people? It may be because of something they said or did to us. But there is a deeper reason. It is because they bring out the worst in us. Enemies expose a side of us which we usually manage to keep hidden from our friends, a dark side of our nature which we would rather not know about. The enemy stirs up ugly things inside us. This is the real reason why we hate him.

To love one's enemy is not in the first place to do him good. Rather it is to allow him to be different, to be himself, and not try to turn him into a copy of ourselves so that we may be able to love him. We are not expected to feel love for our enemy. Love is not a feeling; it is an act of the will. We can make a decision to love someone even though we do not have feelings of love for that person.

To love an enemy goes clean contrary to human nature. Only God can help us to love in the way Christ asks of us. When Christ asks us to be perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect, the perfection he is talking about is the perfection of love. God loves his children unconditionally. He loves them not because they are good but because he is good.

## **Vision Care Report**

The eye care division continued to support ophthalmic services to the people of Kingston despite being unable to travel to Jamaica due to covid-19 restrictions. Several eye surgeries performed in Jamaica were funded by the JOP and parishioners of St. John the Evangelist. Funds and supplies were sent to our affiliate surgery center in Kingston and four eye surgeries (corneal transplants or cataract or Laser) operations were performed in Naples on JOP patients. The eye care team plans to visit the clinic at St. Pius before the end of the year and intends to reinstate eye clinics and surgical procedures in Kingston before the end of the first quarter of 2023.

**Dr. Jeffrey Zimm** is JOP's Eye Care Coordinator, he has been going to Jamaica for 18 years and is part of the JOP Advisory Board. There are many patients still waiting for eye surgery and vision care. For more information contact: Dr. Jeffrey Zimm 239-592-5511

## **Housing Report - 17 NEW HOMES FOR NEEDY JAMAICAN FAMILIES**

Even with the COVID pandemic raging in Jamaica, JOP had a banner year in building houses for the poor. Through the generosity of our faithful sponsors, we constructed 17 new homes throughout the island. This was a 40% increase from the previous year.

The houses although small, come equipped with sanitation, cooking area, sink, lighting, and water. In addition, basic furnishings are also supplied. The dwellings are built with sturdy walls and water proof roofs. These units are built with structural elements to withstand bad storms.



Previously, many of the families lived in shacks with tarps and metal sheets, they now have real floors that don't turn to mud when it rains. It is heartwarming to see the look on the faces of the children when they first

see the JOP houses. The houses not only provide a secure home but also a new sense of dignity and hope for the future.



Even with inflation we were able to maintain the cost of a houses at \$9800. The price includes beds, mattresses and other furniture which are provided prior to the family moving in. Understanding that this price point is more than one donor can provide we are able to match donors with each providing \$4900.

Donors truly transform the lives of desperate families struggling to survive.

## **Education Report**



In the aftermath of the COVID 19 pandemic, the schools in Jamaica are slowly getting back to operation. Many Jamaican students have missed in person learning for nearly 30 months. This was a huge setback for both students and teachers. During this period the educational, social and spiritual guidance that the schools provide has been missing.

This year, JOP financially supported many schools in order for them to meet COVID protocols enacted by the government. Air exchange systems, water filtration and medical supplies were purchased by schools with JOP funds.

At the St Mary Basic School, the Msgr. Wilson School and Marcus Garvey School, we subsidize the cost of teacher salaries and utilities. During the pandemic, job loses were catastrophic; parents

were unable to pay tuition and JOP assistance kept schools open and operating.

In the Archdiocese of Kingston, we sponsored scholarships at four different parishes for students. In total, over 50 students attend high school with the help of JOP funding. In Jamaica, student fees for books and transportation are not funded by the government and, due to the poverty level, these fees can be a major obstacle to have these youngsters furthering their education.

In the Diocese of Montego Bay, under the direction of Bishop Burchell, JOP provided \$35,000 for educational funding. The funds were used to subsidize salaries and costs of overall operation, all in an effort to make Catholic education affordable for the needy.

We firmly believe that education is the key to transforming the Jamaican society.

## **Medical Report**

#### Fall 2022 Mission



Our medical director, Dr. Joseph Vento, led the first post COVID medical mission to Jamaica on September 29, 2022 - the day after Ian hit Naples. The team also included 2 nurse practitioners and an assistant. Local volunteers also assisted. They saw 188 patients, many with hypertension, diabetes, asthma, STDs, skin rashes, arthritis, depression. The clinicians checked blood pressure, pulse oxygen, vision and more. Physical exams were performed and when needed mobile EKGs, finger stick glucose test and urine analysis test were performed.

At the board's request, the team visited the Village of Antonio Gabriele where a group of elderly Jamaicans are cared for and housed. It is an inspirational and effective community in the midst of a dangerous area of Kingston.

In Kingston, the team went to St. Pius and Immaculate Conception in Kingston. This was the first time a team visited Immaculate Conception Church in Stoney Hill area of Kingston. The reception by the community was overwhelming. Patients waited cheerfully to be seen under an outdoor tent - even in the rain. The trip from Kingston to Montego Bay was long and rainy - but well worth it. One day was spent in Seaford Town. It was wonderful to finally be back at Sacred Heart Parish.

The last day of the mission, the team went to St. Mary's Church in the town of Revival about 2 hours from Montego Bay.

Franciscans - Father Colin King and Brother John were our hosts. We were happy to be there on the feast of St. Francis. It was a very meaningful mission, and the team is anxiously awaiting the moment when they can head out on their next mission.

## **Dental Clinic Report**

We finally did a mission trip to Jamaica this past fiscal year! The first one since Covid disrupted prior dental services. From September 26 to September 28, 2022, our team worked at the VanDomelen Dental Clinic on the grounds of St Pius X. They included 6 dental assistants, 4 hygienists and 3 dentists. They treated 189 patients in the clinic. with cleanings, fillings, extractions, and referrals. In addition, 495 students at the DuPont School were given oral education, screening for cavities and fluoride varnish treatments.

Thanks to the generosity of our supporters, we are able to provide some financial reimbursement for our missionaries although they do bear some of the cost in addition to the generous donation of their lost wages at home plus their valuable time and energy.

We are annually in need of some 2,000 toothbrushes, (sample size) paste and floss and about the same amount of fluoride varnish applications.... donations of which are always appreciated.
