## CFA SUPPORTS: Marriage & Family Life



The Diocese of Venice's Office of Marriage and Family Life strives to equip the Faithful to live out God's plan for marriage and family in all stages of life.

Each year, couples celebrating 25, 30, 35, 40, 45, 50 and 50 plus years in marriage are invited to a Mass where they are honored and recognized. The ceremony is a spiritual celebration of the beauty of a couple's fidelity, sacrifice, and joy in their sacramental commitment to one another.

For engaged, newly wed, and long married couples, marriage conferences, such as Together in Holiness, are available. These conferences aim to inspire couples to grow together in faithful union.

Safe Haven Sunday as well as a variety of workshops are offered to parents seeking assistance in addressing the current culture issues with their children.

The Office of Marriage and Family Life encourages couples planning for marriage to utilize a virtues-based, mentor-led program, Witness to Love. This program integrates modern principles of psychology and the virtues to help couples facilitate and talk about their relationship to one another and to God. The newly engaged choose a married couple from the Parish to serve as mentors before and through the early stages of their marriage. This relationship has two purposes: it deepens the understanding of the Church's theology of marriage for the engaged couple and, for the married couple, it reawakens an appreciation for the Church's understanding of marriage in their own lives.

Further, those seeking comfort after suffering the death of loved one are encouraged to attend bereavement seminars.

In addition, a 14-week workshop is available to support individuals experiencing the pain and loneliness of a divorce.

## **Christian Initiation**

The first Sunday of Ash Wednesday marked a milestone for OCIA candidates, as they were blessed and affirmed by the parishioners of Saint John in the Rite of Sending at 5 p.m. Mass on Saturday evening. On Sunday afternoon the candidates traveled to Venice to celebrate the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion with Bishop Frank Dewane at the Cathedral of the Nativity in Venice. Along with candidates from 46 other parishes in the diocese, they were blessed, affirmed by Bishop Dewane and sent forth to journey through Lent to begin their final phase to be fully initiated in the Catholic Faith at the Easter Vigil on April 9 by the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation-- Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.



## Gospel Reflection with Fr. Tom



Picture an old oil lamp covered with layers of dust and dirt. How wretched and useless it looks. Then someone comes along, cleans off the layers of dirt, polishes it until it begins to sparkle, and then lights it. Suddenly the lamp is transformed. It positively glows, radiating light and beauty to every corner of the room. Whereas prior to this it was disfigured with dust and dirt, now it is transfigured with beauty. Yet it is the same lamp. When an object or a person is loved and cared for, it is redeemed, and rendered brighter and worthier.

As Jesus went about Galilee his divinity was cloaked by his humanity.

But on Mount Tabor God's light burst forth from the body of Jesus, and he was transfigured. The three apostles got a glimpse of his divinity, hidden in the depths of his humanity. They were overcome with the beau and brilliance of it. It was not a surface thing, but an inner essence shining through. God was in Jesus.

There are two potentialities within us - the potentiality for evil and the potentiality for good. Take the potential for evil. We are capable of such things as hatred, bitterness, cruelty, greed, envy, lust ... These are ugly things and bring out the worst in us. They corrupt the heart. And corruption of heart coarsens the face and darkens the eyes. Evil disfigures us.

Take our potential for good. We are capable of such things as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, mercy, compassion ... These are beautiful things and bring out the best in us. They purify the heart. And purity of heart softens the face and causes the eyes to shine. Goodness transfigures us.


Basically, we are transfigured by what we love, what excites us, what moves us, what rouses our spirit, what causes us to be awake and alive. What shows us at our brightest and best.

Van Gogh was not noted for his physical beauty. In fact, his face was described by some as being repulsive. Yet as soon as he began to speak about art, his melancholy expression would disappear, his eyes would sparkle, and his features would make a deep impression on those around him. It wasn't his own face any longer; it had become beautiful. It seemed that he was breathing in beauty.

At times all of us can feel down, a prey to feelings of failure and worthlessness. But then suddenly something nice happens to us - a friend calls, or we get a letter with some good news in it - and suddenly everything is changed. The truth, of course, is that nothing has changed. It's just that a spark of joy or hope or love has been kindled in our hearts, and we see ourselves and our lives in a new and better light.

We are made in the image of God; we carry the splendor of divinity within us. However, sin tarnishes that image and so disfigures us. But virtue causes that image to shine and so transfigures us. We are at our best when we are good.

Like the apostles on Mount Tabor, we too can experience rare moments of light and joy. We get glimpses of the promised land towards which we are traveling in faith. In his love for us, God allows us to taste on earth the joys of the world to come.



On the third anniversary of his passing, we pray for Fr. Tom Glackin. May he rest in peace. Amen.

May the wind be always at your back.

May the sun shine warm upon your face;
the rains fall soft upon your fields and until we meet again,

may God hold you in the palm of His hand.
