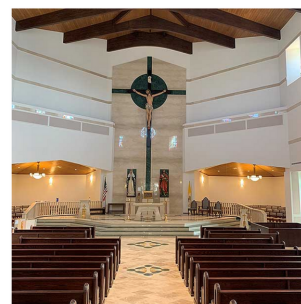

Safe Environment Training

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.

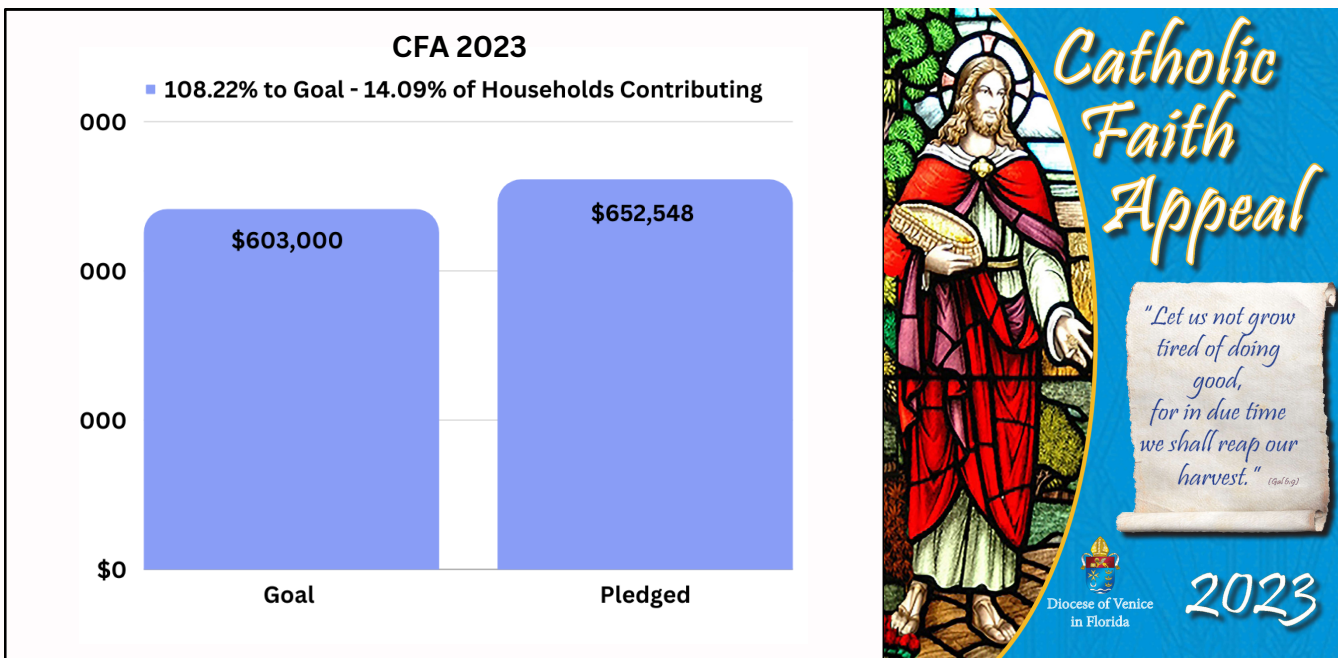


Dear Parishioners,

Thank you! Because of your continued generosity and support, we reached our **first** 2023 CFA goal, with \$652,548 pledged to date. We now shift our focus to **reaching 125% of our original goal**. As a reminder, when we surpass our goal, all donations up to 25% over our goal are returned to the Parish to further support our ministries and programs. Anything over that 25% is split, meaning half is returned to the Parish, and half is donated to a Catholic School or Charity of our choice.

This year, we have an additional goal: to increase the number of contributing households. Last year, we surpassed our goal with just 20% of households contributing. We are currently at 108.22% to our goal, with 14.09% of households contributing. Please prayerfully consider donating, within your means, to support our CFA goal. Gospel Reflection with Fr. Tom

In today's Gospel, Jesus is instructing the disciples on their need to be open and fearless in what they say. In this Eucharistic celebration, God has gathered us together to experience the immediacy of His Presence. We enter into deep communion with God in this unique, life-enriching way. But this gathering together is not the total experience. There is a second part to it, without which the first part loses its meaning.

The same God who gathers us together to experience His awesome Presence, scatters us out into the world to witness to His Love for mankind — and to openly and fearlessly proclaim His message of love from the housetops!

The same God who reveals Himself to us here, reveals Himself to the world through us. The same God who makes it possible for us to breathe in the Holy Spirit, requires us to breathe out the Holy Spirit. If we only breathe in, and never breathe out in this sense, our New Life in Christ is radically diminished.

The Gospels clearly tell us, over-and-over again, that the God who loves us so much, and has given us so much through Jesus Christ, sends us out to share this Jesus with the world. To the whole creation — to family, neighbor, friend, stranger and enemy alike — to all nations everywhere, we are commissioned to speak His, openly and fearlessly.

If we should call the sun “moon,” and the moon “sun,” neither sun nor moon would change one bit. The change would be in us. The same is true of our images of the Divine. The truth of the statement, “God made the world,” does not depend on whether or not we call Him “Creator.” The truth of the statement, “God will not abandon us” does not depend on whether or not we refer to Him as “Divine Providence.” The truth of the statement “God wills us to share in his eternal happiness” does not depend on whether or not we say His name is ‘Love’.

The Divine Titles we use are of no consequence, in themselves. They are meaningful only to the extent that they truly reflect our own understanding. The Divine Title, “Creator,” is just another name until it becomes an acknowledgement of our dependence upon God for life itself. The Divine Title “Providence” is just another name until it represents an attitude of trust in God's promise that we do not live and die in vain. The Divine Title “Love,” is just another name until it professes an understanding of the relationship we have to God which Paul describes in Galatians. “God has sent forth into our hearts the spirit of His Son which cries out Abba”: ‘Father!’”.

As the Lord's followers, we have received a formal invitation to celebrate right here and right now — in the Kingdom of God on earth — the Good News of a gracious God who will never abandon us. The early disciples of Christ were filled with a burning desire to share this marvelous Message. They felt a pressing need to tell all the people that in and through Jesus Christ, God was doing something marvelous — something unexpected. This sense of urgency spilled over into the Early Church. Those early Christians were people seized by this Message, captivated by its power, and uplifted by its promise to spread the joy and the peace and the Love of God throughout the world.

Each time we gather together in Christ's Name, we need to ask ourselves: Have we lost our sense of urgency? Have we lost our way? Do we know in which direction to go? Are we a God-centered — Christ-centered — people?



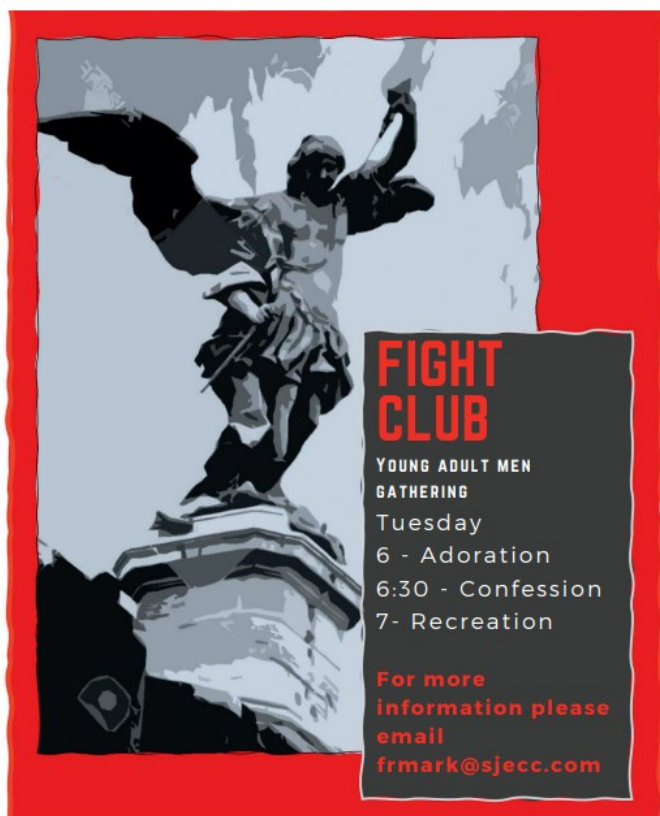

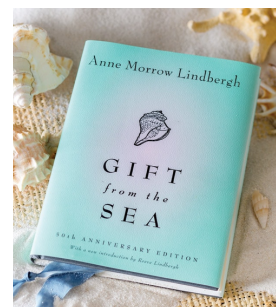
Adult Faith Formation

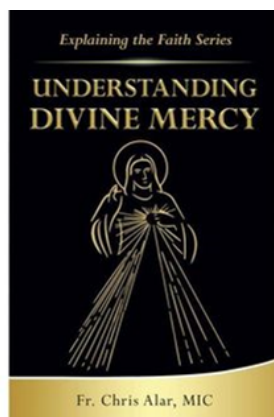

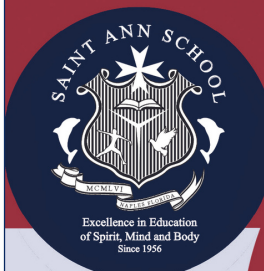

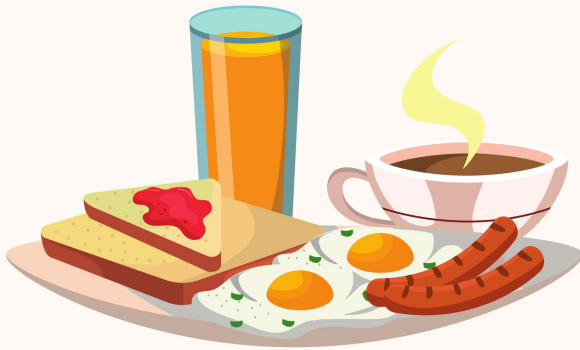
