Safe Environment Training

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist


Catholic Faith Appeal supports Youth Ministry



Gospel Reflection with Fr. Tom

It gives us joy to know an important person. However, to know often simply means to know facts about the person. But to know another person in this way is to have a very shallow knowledge of that person.

To really know means to have a relationship with the person, a relationship based on trust and love. And also to know that we too are known and loved by the person.

In his biography of George Washington, Richard Brookhiser says:

George Washington is with us every day, on our dollar bills and quarters. He looks down on us from Mount Rushmore. In the national capital that bears his name he has the most prominent memorial. More schools, streets and cities bear his name than that of any other American, and historians rank him among the greatest Presidents America has had.

However, the omnipresence of Washington does not translate into familiarity. He is in our textbooks and our wallets, but not in our hearts. The fault is partly Washington's, since he tended to distance himself from the people.

Some see God as distant and remote, not really concerned about us and our sufferings. Worse still, others see God as a judge, or a spy ready to pounce and punish.

Jesus knows the Father and is known by the Father. This fills him with joy. Because Jesus knows the Father he is able to reveal him to others, especially to those who, like children, are open and receptive. Jesus revealed God as a loving, compassionate, forgiving Father. A God who is passionately interested in us. A God whose concern is not to judge and condemn, but to heal and to save. Many of the so-called wise people rejected Jesus, but the simple people accepted him. The intellectuals had little use for him, but the humble accepted him. Intellectual pride is a dangerous thing. Simple people are often nearer to God than clever people.

Jesus said, "I bless you, Father, for hiding these things from the learned and the clever and revealing them to mere children."

Jesus is not condemning intellectual power, but intellectual pride. It is not cleverness that shuts God out; it is pride. And it is not stupidity that enables God to come in; it is humility.

Because of the coming of Jesus we no longer see God as someone remote. We see him as someone who is very close to us, who knows each of us and is concerned about each of us, because we are his children. He is the God especially of the weak, the poor, the overburdened.

When faith is a matter of the head alone, it becomes a cold, intellectual thing. The result is that God remains outside us, a distant, aloof figure. But faith is not just a matter of the head. It is more a matter of the heart. When faith is rooted in the heart, God is seen as close and loving. Then faith becomes a warm relationship with God.

To know God in this way, and to have a close and loving relationship with him, should be a cause of great joy to us. God is like a spring within us from which we can drink and refresh ourselves.

Miracle of the Week - Eucharistic Miracle of Tumaco, Colombia

From The International Eucharistic Miracles of the World Exhibit, designed by Carlo Acutis:

On January 31, 1906, on the small island of Tumaco at 10 o'clock in the morning the earth shook violently for almost ten minutes. All the inhabitants of the village ran to the church and begged the pastor, Fr. Gerardo Larrondo, to lead a procession with the Blessed Sacrament. The sea was rising and had already engulfed part of the beach. It had plunged inland a kilometer and a half and a mountainous wall of water was building up and threatening to drown everyone and everything in one gigantic wave. Fr. Gerardo, consumed the small Hosts in the ciborium and set the large Host aside. He called out to his people: "Let us go, my people, let us go toward the beach and may God have pity on us." Comforted by the presence of the Eucharistic Christ they began their march weeping and crying out to God. Scarcely had Fr. Larrondo reached the beach with the monstrance in hand when he advanced courageously to the water edge and as the wave came rushing in he calmly raised the Sacred Host and traced the sign of the cross. It was a moment of tremendous solemnity.

The wave hesitated, paused and backed off. Fr. Larrondo and Fr. Julian along-side him saw what was transpiring, and the people overjoyed cried out "miracle, miracle". In truth, a force beyond that of nature prevailed, the mighty wall of water that threatened to wipe the village Tumaco off the face of the earth was halted and began to recede and the sea resumed its normal level. The inhabitants of Tumaco were overcome with overflowing joy at having been saved from death by the favor of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Prayers of fervent thanks poured out. The Miracle of Tumaco became known across the world and Fr. Larrondo received letters from Europe asking for his prayers.


Adult Faith Formation / Young Adult Groups
