



Safe Environment Training

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.



A Rectory for St. John the Evangelist

Dear Parishioners,

On November 4 & 5, I announced a fundraising campaign to fund construction of a Rectory on our grounds for our 3 Priests and one retired Priest. Included here are depictions of the planned structure.

For some time, the question of a rectory has been raised in various parish forums. We currently own a very nice house that I occupy, an owned condominium and a rented apartment for our Priests. Maintenance and operating costs are increasing and there is



inefficiency in the frequent travel back and forth to the church. Additionally, area housing costs are high and retired Priests are increasingly priced out from being able to reside in the area and help us out.

As I have considered this, I also see the advantages of a Rectory in building cohesion in the Brotherhood of Priests. Simply getting together to share a meal is made complex by our different locations. A Rectory would enhance our priest's availability to one another and the parish. Once construction is complete we would exit and sell currently occupied residences. Our fundraising goal is \$2.5 million dollars.

I'm heartened by the support and energy of those involved to date in the planning process. Everyone has enthusiastically endorsed the concept including Bishop Dewane. I hope you too would get behind this project and consider supporting the effort with a contribution. I believe it will make us more effective, efficient and bring us closer together as we pursue our mission: To Know, To Love, and To Serve God in His Church and Our Community.

Gospel Reflection from Fr. Tom



We are called to live our gift of faith and to use it for the greater good of all God's people.

Anyone who has ever visited an old cemetery has seen how there was once great care taken in writing epitaphs, short little sayings, engraved on the headstone. These epitaphs often capture the essence of the deceased's life. Some are pithy, amusing and even whimsical, others profound and full of praise.

As we come to the end of this liturgical year, the Church moves us toward reflecting on the great questions of life and death. As we heard in today's Gospel reading, the Holy Spirit may prod us to ponder what might be said about us after we are gone. Given the opportunity, what would those we leave behind chisel on our headstones; what might we be remembered for?

Our readings today offer some good ideas in terms of what we should want as our legacy. The first reading, from the Book of Proverbs, tells of the ideal woman, gifted not just with physical attributes, but with gifts of ingenuity, hard work, generosity and love of others. She is presented as a model of what is possible when someone uses their gifts and skills well. The point of the reading lies not in the fact that she is gifted, but in what she chooses to do with those gifts and skills.

The Gospel takes up this theme in the parable of the three servants entrusted with their master's talents. In this case, a talent was a coin of great value. To be entrusted with five, or two, or even one talent meant that you were entrusted with something of great value.

As we heard the Gospel passage proclaimed, we might have been drawn to side with the one who simply buried the talent and presented it back to his master. After all, he did show some degree of prudence and care in dealing with another's property. As we know from the current economic climate, the cautious, and even timid, approach can often be the better path.

Yet, as with many of the parables of Jesus, he ultimately turns the story upside down. In the twist of events, the one who buried ends up losing everything, including what was entrusted to him. All is taken away and given to the others, for only those who take risks in faith can be given greater responsibilities and ultimately be invited to share the Master's joy.

So what is the moral of the parable to us? If we see this as an exhortation to work diligently and without fear for the return of Christ, then now is the time to use all that God has placed at our disposal to this end. Now is the time to use our gifts, talents, our sense of hope and our commitment to charity for the sake of the Gospel. This is the sacred task entrusted to each Christian by virtue of baptism - to invest ourselves totally in the work of the kingdom and to bring others to Christ.

Today, as we are encouraged to reflect on our own inevitable death, we are to assess how well we are fulfilling this task. We are to live each day as if this were the day the Master is calling us to account. If today were that day, what would our epitaph say? Would it announce that we were a bold servant of God, using all we were given to build up his kingdom on earth? If this is not what it would say, now is the time to make a change.

Eucharistic Revival

Bishop DeWane says of the Year of Parish Revival "It is in a precise way, in the Eucharist, the Lord is given to us, and we receive Him. We must also have the strength to spend time in front of the Eucharist. Let the strength that Jesus Christ is; let His presence in the Eucharist, fill your heart, fill your mind, fill your soul."

The four pillars for St. John the Evangelist Year of Parish Revival are: Reinvigorate Worship, Personal Encounter, Robust Faith Formation, and Missionary Sending.

Reinvigorate Worship

Attentiveness to full preparation, reverent celebration, and offering many opportunities for parishioners to experience the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist more profoundly.

Personal Encounter

Active encouragement and facilitation for increased participation in Eucharistic Adoration by our parishioners.

Robust Faith Formation

Providing opportunities in our Faith Formation and Youth Ministry for instruction about the Eucharist; and personal engagement for our children, young adults, and their families. Providing parishioners resources to learn more about the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

Missionary Sending

Welcoming our parishioners and their families when they are drawn to the Church for sacraments. Proactive outreach and welcome to non-Catholics to join our Church. Attentiveness to our Eucharistic Ministry to encourage ongoing learning and to engage more volunteers for Eucharistic Ministers who bring Christ to all in our Parish, both at Mass and to those who are not able to attend Mass.

Eucharistic Procession - Feast of Christ the King Sunday, November 26, 2023 - St. John the Evangelist

Christ the King Eucharistic Procession Route

Following a brief period of Adoration in the church at the conclusion of the 1:00pm Mass, the Monstrance is processed out and the Procession forms at 2:15pm outside of the church main entrance.

The Procession heads east and then north around the Memorial Garden for the first of two Adoration/Benediction stops.
Limited seating will be available at the first Adoration/Benediction stop for those who would like to participate but prefer not to follow the entire route.



After a brief Adoration & Benediction, the Procession then continues along the boundary of the parking area around the Claussen Center to the northern boundary, and then proceeds all the way south to the 111th Street boundary for the second Adoration/Benediction stop.

After another brief Adoration & Benediction, the Procession then continues along the west parking boundary and returns to the church main entrance. The Monstrance is processed inside to the Altar for a final Benediction and Reposition of the Body of Christ in the Tabernacle.

A brief reception for Procession participants will be help in the Pulte Center immediately following final Benediction & Reposition.

Miracle of the Week - Cimballa, Spain, 1370 From The International Eucharistic Miracles of the World Exhibit, designed by Carlo Acutis

Most Holy Doubtful Mystery" is what they call in Cimballa the Eucharistic Miracle that took place in 1370 in the church of the Purification of Our Lady. The pastor of the church, Don Tommaso, had been for many months plagued by doubt concerning the true presence of Christ in the sacrament of the Eucharist. During the celebration of Holy Mass on Sunday, after having pronounced the words of the consecration. Don Tommaso saw the Host transformed into flesh and the blood began to flow from it, so much as to soak the altar-linens. The penitent priest began to weep from remorse. The faithful, seeing how he was troubled, quickly looked to the altar and saw the miracle. The relic was then taken in procession and the news spread everywhere. There were many miracles attributed the "Most Holy Doubtful Mystery" and since then has always been a great object of devotion on the part of the faithful. The relic of the altar-linen soaked in the blood has been exposed the 12th of September of every year on the day of the anniversary of the feast of the blood Miracle




Prayer Vigil Join our Respect Life Team




