

# Memorial Garden Notes

As a reminder, Please refrain from placing rocks, artificial flowers, and other non-natural items in the Garden. When the landscapers are there, these items can become projectiles and/or damage equipment. We will routinely remove items left in the Garden that are not natural.

#### Safe Environment Training

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

**St. John the Evangelist** also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.

# **Gospel Reflection with Fr. Tom**

At the end of today's Gospel there is a very telling sentence. It goes: "Mary stored up all these things in her heart." And after the visit of the shepherds to the manger, we find a similar comment. Luke says that "Mary treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart." Mary kept the memory of these events in her heart with a view to discerning the hidden meaning behind the marvelous happenings.

It's clear that Mary didn't immediately understand the meaning of what was happening to her and what God was asking of her. But that's how it always is. Profound lived experience always begins with perplexity. We never know at the time what is happening to us. It's only afterwards, perhaps long afterwards, that our eyes are opened and we begin to understand. Hence, the importance of reflection.

More than once we read in the Gospels that Mary was perplexed. So what did she do? She pondered, reflected and prayed, seeking to understand what was happening to her and her child. This pondering was not free from uncertainty and anxiety.

Mary comes across as a silent, reflective person. All her life she pondered and prayed over how God dealt with her. When she doesn't understand, she ponders in her heart until she insight comes. And she pondered the painful events even more to discern the purpose of God in them. In this way she acquired insight and wisdom.

Emerson says: 'Life lies behind us like a quarry from whence we get the tiles and copestones for the masonry of today.' Only by reflecting can we come to understand our experiences. We could have the experience but miss the meaning of it because we don't reflect on it. But with reflection, we can derive precious insights from our experiences.

It's easy to recall pleasant experiences, but not so easy to recall painful ones. We are tempted to suppress our painful memories. Even so, they can still influence us. They can distil a poison into us. We need to recall the painful experiences too: it's how we recall them that matters. They can provide the raw-material from which we derive understanding, compassion, and wisdom. The incident in which Jesus got lost in Jerusalem was a painful one for Mary. Yet she stored it in her heart, and, by so doing, learned from it.

Sadly, there are people who seem to learn nothing from experience. But for others experience is the real school. No one has become wise in a day or even in a year. Wisdom is the fruit of much pondering.

Parents need a lot of wisdom. What Mary learned from her praying and pondering she passed on to her child, who St Luke tells us, 'increased in wisdom, in stature, and in favor with God and men.' Jesus was taught, nourished, and formed by a wise woman who loved God with all her heart and soul.



# A Rectory for St. John the Evangelist

Dear Parishioners,

On November 4 & 5, I announced a fundraising campaign to fund construction of a Rectory on our grounds for our 3 Priests and one retired Priest. Included here are depictions of the planned structure.

For some time, the question of a rectory has been raised in various parish forums. We currently own a very nice house that I occupy, an owned condominium and a rented apartment for our Priests. Maintenance and operating costs are increasing and there is



inefficiency in the frequent travel back and forth to the church. Additionally, area housing costs are high and retired Priests are increasingly priced out from being able to reside in the area and help us out.

As I have considered this, I also see the advantages of a Rectory in building cohesion in the Brotherhood of Priests. Simply getting together to share a meal is made complex by our different locations. A Rectory would enhance our priest's availability to one another and the parish. Once construction is complete we would exit and sell currently occupied residences. Our fundraising goal is \$2.5 million dollars.

I'm heartened by the support and energy of those involved to date in the planning process. Everyone has enthusiastically endorsed the concept including Bishop Dewane. I hope you too would get behind this project and consider supporting the effort with a contribution. I believe it will make us more effective, efficient and bring us closer together as we pursue our mission: To Know, To Love, and To Serve God in His Church and Our Community.



#### Miracle of the Week - Montserrat, Spain 1657 From The International Eucharistic Miracles of the World Exhibit, designed by Carlo Acutis

In 1657, the Most Reverend Father Don Bernardo de Ontevieros, general of the Benedictine order in Spain, and Abbot Don Millán de Mirando, ended up in the Monastery of Our Lady of Monteserrat in order to participate in some conferences. During one of the conferences, a woman and her young daughter showed up and the daughter began to beg the Abbot Millán de Mirando to celebrate three Masses in memory of her deceased father, whole-heartedly convinced that with these Masses the soul of her father would be freed from the pains of purgatory. The good abbot, moved to tears by the girl, began to celebrate the first Mass of suffering the next day, and the girl, who was present with her mother, confirmed seeing her father kneeling, surrounded by frightening flames, at the step of the main altar during the consecration. The priest and general dubious, asked the girl to put a tissue close to the flames that surrounded her father in order verify her story. Following their request, the girl put the tissue into the fire, which only she could see, and the tissue began to burn with a lively flame. During the second Mass the girl confirmed having seen her father dressed in a vibrantly colored suit standing next to the deacon. At the third Mass, the father appeared to his daughter dressed in a snow-white suit. As soon as the Mass ended the girl exclaimed, "There is my father going away and rising into the sky!" The girl then thanked the community of monks on behalf of her father as he had asked her to do. The Most Reverend general of the Benedictine order in Spain, the Bishop of Astorga and numerous citizens of the town were present.


