Statement on the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children January 22, 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our fidelity to Christ calls us to uphold and protect the inviolable dignity and sanctity of all human life from the moment of conception until natural death. Great progress has been made in recent years to protect women and their preborn children in Florida. That progress, as noted below, is at great risk.

We are encouraged that our state's 15-week abortion limit remains in effect as the Florida Supreme Court considers a challenge to it. The legislature's passage of a bill to further limit abortion to six-weeks of gestation during the 2023 session and its approval by Governor DeSantis is a momentous achievement. This legislation also increases resources to pregnant women and young families through the Florida Pregnancy Care Network almost six-fold. If the 15-week law is upheld, the further limit to six weeks will go into effect thirty days later, ushering in a new era. Much remains to be done to properly recognize the dignity of the child in the womb, but this marks tremendous progress in the legal protection of preborn children in Florida.

This progress, as well as gains made over the past several decades to protect women and their preborn children from the harms of abortion, is at significant risk. An extreme ballot initiative proposing to amend our state constitution to legalize full-term abortion is of grave concern. If ultimately passed, the amendment would legalize abortion up until birth, including when the baby is capable of feeling pain. While the proposed amendment permits parental notification, the amendment would eliminate the current law requiring parental consent for a minor daughter to receive an abortion.

As is required of the petition initiative process, the proposed ballot language is under review by the Florida Supreme Court. In our briefs to the Court, we contend that the ballot title and summary are misleading, which should preclude its placement on the ballot. The title states the amendment "limits" government interference with abortion when the amendment actually prohibits all regulation before viability. Neither does the language provide fair notice of its impact on existing statutory protections for women. If this extreme amendment ultimately appears on the November 2024 ballot, we urge all Floridians to "vote no."

A healthy society can only continue to flourish if based on a consistent recognition of the rights of each individual, especially the weakest and most defenseless. With this in mind, we remain committed to pursuing full legal protection of preborn children and continue to support efforts to offer practical assistance and accompaniment to women and their families experiencing difficulties during pregnancy and beyond. We invite all people of good will to join us in these endeavors.







Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.

After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

As he passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them,

"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Then they abandoned their nets and followed him. He walked along a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They too were in a boat mending their nets. Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him.



Gospel Reflection with Fr. Tom

St. Mark gives the impression that the call of the first disciples was a very formal event, and one that came out of the blue without any previous knowledge of, or relationship with, Jesus. But St. John shows that this was not the case. John makes it clear that their relationship with Jesus passed through a stage of growth and development. People don't just up and follow a complete stranger. It's clear that the four (Simon and Andrew, James and John) had previous contact with Jesus. They probably began by standing in the crowd, listening to him. That would have resulted in admiration, which made them want to get to know him personally. Once they met him, and felt the magnetism of his personality, they were attracted to him. This is what made possible their decision to follow him.

This explains why, when the call finally came, their response was so immediate and complete. They left everything -- livelihood, possessions, security, family ties -- and devoted themselves exclusively to the following of Jesus. Down the ages many believers have made the same total commitment to Christ. Even though his call 'Follow me' sounds like a command, it was of course not a command but an invitation.

Who were these men? They were fishermen. Fishing was an important occupation. But Jesus called them to an even more important occupation. He offered them not just a new work but a cause to which to dedicate their lives. They knew he wasn't calling them to a life of ease. Quite the contrary. But as fishermen they would have been well acquainted with hardship already.

They understood also that Jesus' call was a call to service of others: 'I will make you fishers of people.' When the leaders of cults call people to follow them, they turn them into their personal slaves. Jesus called the apostles, not to service of himself, but to service of others.

His call meant sacrificing their own plans, ambitions, securities, and so on. It was a dangerous adventure, because they were moving from the known to the unknown. But they also knew that his call offered an opportunity to live a fuller and more worthwhile life. Up to this they had a career. Now they would have a vocation.

A career and a vocation are different though not mutually exclusive. We might express a vocation through a specific career ... teacher, nurse, doctor ... But a vocation can never be reduced to these activities. It is something deeper. It involves vision, motivation, dedication. A career usually means furthering oneself. But a vocation means serving others.

The fact that they accepted this challenge so whole-heartedly tells us a lot about the kind of men they were. Yet they weren't supermen. They were just ordinary people. No one ever believed in the ordinary people as much as Jesus did. One doesn't have to be an exceptional person to be a disciple of Jesus.

The Lord still calls people today, and the need is just as great today. And there still are those who respond. Some people, like the four apostles, are called to dedicate themselves totally and in a 'professional' way to the following of Christ. But not all Christians are called to follow Christ in this way.

The idea of a call runs counter to the prevailing culture. The thinking today is that we can live an uncalled life one not referred to any purpose beyond oneself. It's not easy to allow oneself to be chosen. Left to ourselves we tend to follow the line of least resistance. Hence, we need someone to challenge us, who has our best interests at heart, and who will not let us settle for anything less than the best that we are capable of.

What does the following of Christ mean for the ordinary person? It means to be a Christian where you are and in your chosen profession.

A Rectory for St. John the Evangelist

Dear Parishioners,

On November 4 & 5, I announced a fundraising campaign to fund construction of a Rectory on our grounds for our 3 Priests and one retired Priest. We are getting closer and need continued support to reach the Diocesan goal in order to begin construction. Included here are depictions of the planned structure.

For some time, the question of a rectory has been raised in various parish forums. We currently own a very nice house that I occupy, an owned condominium and a rented



apartment for our Priests. Maintenance and operating costs are increasing and there is inefficiency in the frequent travel back and forth to the church. Additionally, area housing costs are high and retired Priests are increasingly priced out from being able to reside in the area and help us out.

As I have considered this, I also see the advantages of a Rectory in building cohesion in the Brotherhood of Priests. Simply getting together to share a meal is made complex by our different locations. A Rectory would enhance our priest's availability to one another and the parish. Once construction is complete we would exit and sell currently occupied residences. Our fundraising goal is \$2.5 million dollars.

I'm heartened by the support and energy of those involved to date in the planning process. Everyone has enthusiastically endorsed the concept including Bishop Dewane. I hope you too would get behind this project and consider supporting the effort with a contribution. I believe it will make us more effective, efficient and bring us closer together as we pursue our mission: To Know, To Love, and To Serve God in His Church and Our Community.

Contributions should be made to Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church – Rectory Campaign. Alternatively, pledges can be made on a pledge card (available in the Narthex) and paid by April 1, 2024. In order to begin construction, we will need to be at 80% of our goal.
