### *Evangelization and Retreat Centers*

The Catholic Church has a long tradition of evangelization, and it is seen as a response to the great commission of Jesus to "...go and make disciples of all nations..." Not just about converting people to the Catholic faith, evangelization also involves publicly living out the faith so as to be a witness to others. At the Diocese of Venice, this is done through the **Office of Evangelization**.

Conferences, Bible study, Theology on Tap, and Eucharistic Congresses are just a few ways the Diocese brings hope, healing, and the opportunity for salvation to those in need in Southwest Florida.



Bringing the Joy and Truth of the Gospel to the new generation is the primary mission of the **Office of Youth and Young Adult Outreach**. It helps coordinate large scale Diocesan events and pilgrimages to help create opportunities for youth and young adults to grow closer to the Lord. This office offers guidance and support to parishes and schools to empower those ministering to young faithful.



**Our Lady of Perpetual Help and Campo San José Retreat Centers** offer a variety of spiritual growth experiences for individuals and groups seeking to deepen their faith, refocus on their spiritual lives, develop a relationship with Christ or encounter God in a peaceful and supportive environment.



Although heavily damaged by Hurricane Ian, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Retreat Center is now open for individual, group, and parish retreats.

The Campo San José Retreat Center primarily hosts groups with the focus directed to spiritual enrichment and growth.



With assistance from the Diocesan **Department of Communications**, a televised Mass is made available weekly for the homebound, hospitalized, and all those unable to attend Mass at a local parish.



## Safe Environment & Volunteers Needed

### DIOCESE OF VENICE - SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.

He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, “Take these out of here, and stop making my Father’s house a marketplace.”

His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him,

“What sign can you show us for doing this?”

Jesus answered and said to them,

“Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up.”

The Jews said,

“This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and you will raise it up in three days?”

But he was speaking about the temple of his body.

Therefore, when he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

## Gospel Reflection with Fr. Tom

The Gospel scene depicts Jesus angry, with a whip in his hand. This image of Jesus doesn't sit well with the traditional image of a meek and peaceful Jesus. It seems to be so out of character with what we know of Jesus from the rest of the Gospels that we might be tempted to dismiss it. It would be a mistake to dismiss it. It shows us that there was another side to Jesus' character. Of course Jesus was gentle. But that doesn't mean he was weak. When the occasion demanded it he could be very strong and very assertive.

Still, it comes as a shock to see Jesus furious. And to see him resort to what looks like a form of violence. We may have been taught that all anger is sinful. But in itself anger is just a feeling, and as such is neither good nor bad morally.

It's true that anger is a dangerous thing and can result in us saying or doing things we later regret. But anger can also be a good thing. It can spur us to put right something that is blatantly wrong. There are times when we ought to be angry. An unjust situation should make us angry. Anger can be an expression of love.

We have to look at the things that make us angry. It is said that you can measure the size of a person's soul by the size of the things that make him angry. Most of our anger is motivated by self-interest and we get angry about petty things.

A man lived on the outskirts of a village. About thirty feet from his house, a large lime tree grew. The tree was something of a village landmark. However, it was getting old. It was clearly only a matter of time before it came crashing down. Every time there was a storm, the man feared for his house and his life. One day, unable to bear the strain any longer, he cut the tree down. He felt sure that the villagers would understand. But he was wrong.

"Shame on you for cutting down such a splendid tree," said one. "You've deprived the village of part of its heritage," said another.

It's amazing how worked up people get when their own interests are threatened, however marginally. But how few get worked up when it's their neighbor's interests that are threatened.

Jesus didn't get angry on his own account. His anger resulted from his love of God and of his neighbor. His action in the temple has been seen as a protest against the commercialization of religion and the desecration of the temple. But it went deeper than that.

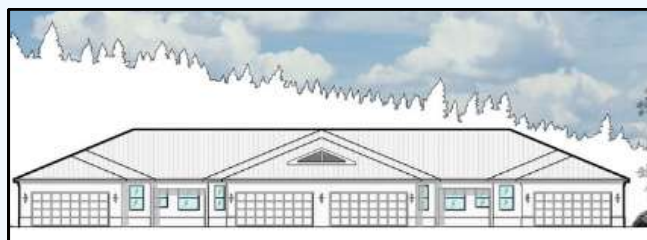
Firstly, he was protesting that Israel had failed to fulfill her universal mission to humankind. Religion had become narrow, nationalistic, and exclusive. The Temple was meant to be a house of prayer "for all nations." Jesus was doing away with the notion of exclusiveness. Salvation was not just for the Jews, but for all people.

Secondly, he was attacking the very nature of their worship. The whole temple worship with its ritual and animal sacrifices was irrelevant and cold, did nothing to bring people to God. He was replacing sacrificial worship with spiritual worship. Worship demands a lot more of us than the offering of things to God and the performance of certain rituals. What God wants above all is the worship of our lives.

May the Lord help us to make this house a house of prayer, joy, and unity. And may what we do here help us to give God the worship of our lives.
