

DIOCESE OF VENICE SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.



The **Office of Vocations** has the primary responsibility to foster and support individuals who feel called to serve the Church as priests or members of religious communities. This is accomplished through discernment retreats, prayer, reflection, and fellowship with others on a similar journey. The Office actively collaborates with the Office of Youth and Young Adult Ministry, Catholic schools, and parishes in a joint effort to provide a nurturing environment for young people discerning a religious vocation.

The formation process of seminarians involves several years of academic study, spiritual development, hu-

man formation, and pastoral training. These studies aim to provide a solid foundation in Catholic Theology and prepare them for the responsibilities of

priesthood.

Seminarians experience life as a priest by assisting a pastor in a parish, bringing communion to shut ins, visiting the elderly, and serving the youth of the Dioceses during the summer months.

Religious sisters working within the Diocese of Venice have dedicated their lives to serving God and oth-

ers through prayer, ministry, and various works of charity. They often serve as teachers, administrators, and directors of Religious Education. The sisters bring their spiritual commitment, virtues, and training to Catholic education, nurturing the

intellectual, moral, and spiritual formation of youth. Often, they are assigned to locations where they can serve the most in need.

The Permanent Diaconate Program serves to facilitate the formation of men called to the roll of Permanent Deacon. Once ordained,

these men receive pastoral care and ongoing formation.

Baptism: The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, please call the office at (239) 566-8740.





I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd. This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again. This command I have received from my Father."



FR. TOM'S GOSPEL REFLECTION

As Christians, we recognize Jesus as the Good Shepherd, who has laid down his life for us. All four Gospels use the metaphor of Jesus as shepherd. Indeed, the image is deeply woven into the language of the Old Testament, where God is often described as a shepherd and Israel as his chosen flock. The language of the image continues to give us some of our most beloved spiritual images. We need only recall the opening words of Psalm 23, The Lord is my shepherd, to see this.

In first century Palestine, the picture of grazing sheep, protected by their shepherd, was a common one. Given the rockiness and aridity of the highlands of Judea and the dangers from wild animals and thieves, the protection and welfare of one's flock was considered of number one importance for shepherds. For their part, the sheep seemed to know that their welfare depended on staying close to the shepherd because they responded only to his call. It was a relationship of reciprocity: the shepherd directed the sheep to fertile green pastures and kept a close eye out for danger, while the sheep listened and followed his voice. So, the image of the Church as the flock conjures up the idea of a community united with a common purpose and identity, and gathered together under a self-giving and protective leader.

Given the familiarity of this image and its deep biblical roots, it is no surprise that Jesus chose this metaphor when addressing the Pharisees about his mission to Israel. What is new, however, is how he uses it not just to speak of himself, but to contrast the Good Shepherd with the shepherd who is merely the hired hand. The difference is that the Pharisees and Scribes behave as though they are temporary shepherds, hired from an agency. Yes, they fulfill their basic duties to Israel, but they have no lasting or loving commitment to the people entrusted to their care - God's Chosen People. When the duties become too onerous or dangerous they will, like hired help, simply abandon their post and their flock. While they are keen to enforce religious law and duties, they are not keen to bandage the wounded, carry the lame, defend the powerless or place themselves between the flock and impending danger.

In direct contrast, Jesus gives us a powerful insight into how he sees his mission to Israel and, by extension, to the whole world.

Like the Good Shepherd, he is faithful and will offer up his own life for the sake of those entrusted to his care. Those who hear his voice will know that he is trustworthy, and he will lead and guide them along the right path, the path that will lead to everlasting life.

If we apply this idea of good and bad shepherds to today's Church, we might think the challenge is meant only for priests and bishops. In reality, though, it applies to all of us. We are challenged to look into our hearts and judge the generosity of our service to the people around us. Each one of us, by virtue of our baptism, is called to share the Good News and live faithfully the teachings of the Gospel. We are also called to imitate Jesus, the Good Shepherd. This means what we say should be true, and our lives should be full of compassion and concern for others. By living in this way, Jesus can use us as an instrument of his love, providing those around us with the opportunity to hear and respond to his call. Then he will be able to shepherd them, as well, on the way to eternal life.



The Stone Rejected by the Builders




You may be interested to know that the actors in this movie are deeply religious. The actor who plays Jesus is a devout Catholic and daily communicant.





Eucharistic Miracle of SIFNA


ITALY, 1730



In the Basilica of San Francesco in Siena, 223 consecrated Hosts are kept intact for 276 years. Archbishop Tiberio Borghese closed unconsecrated hosts in a sealed tin box for ten years. The scientific commission put in charge when the box was reopened, found only worms and rotted fragments. The Siena event is against any physical and biological law, the scientist Enrico Medi stated: "This direct intervention from God is the miracle [...], accomplished and maintained for centuries, to testify to the permanent reality of Christ in the Eucharistic sacrament".




















This painting of Master Stefano di Giovanni, known as "il Sassetta," is preserved in England in the Bowes Museum in Barnard Casde. It depicts the scene of another Eucharistic miracle that took place near Siena in a Carmelite monastery. The painting depicts a Carmelite monk who, tormented by doubts regarding the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, is freed from the devil after receiving Communion

mong the most important documents that describe the miracle, there is a memoir written by a certain Macchi in 1730, in which is written that on August 14, 1730 some thieves were able to enter San Francesco's Church in Siena, and stole the chalice containing 351 consecrated Hosts. After three days, on August 17th, in the alms box of the sanctuary of Santa Maria in Provengano, in the dust, were found the 351 consecrated Hosts intact. The entire population celebrated the finding of the consecrated Hosts which were right away taken back to the church of San Francesco in a solemn procession. With the passing of time the Hosts were not altered. Many times, distinguished men examined them with every means available and the conclusions were always the same: "The sacred Hosts are still fresh, intact, uncorrupted, chemically pure, and do not

present any sign of alteration". In 1914, Pope St. Pius X authorized a test to which many professors of health, chemistry and pharmaceutics, among whom was also the well-known Professor Siro Grimaldi.

The final conclusion of the edited report stated: "The sacred Hosts of Siena are the classic example of the perfect conservation of particles from unleavened bread consecrated in the year 1730, and constitute a unique phenomenon, full of interest which reverses the natural laws of conservation of organic matter, [...] It is strange, surprising, abnormal: the laws of nature have been reversed, in the glass there was mold, the unleavened bread has been more refractory of the crystal [...] it is a unique fact contained in the annals of science."

Additional tests were done in 1922, in occasion of the transfer of the Hosts in a cylinder of pure crystal, in 1950 and 1951. Pope John Paul II, during a visit in the city of Siena on September 14, 1980, said regarding the Hosts: "It is the Real Presence!" The permanent miracle of the sacred Hosts is kept in the Chapel Piccolimini in the summer months and in the Chapel Martinozzi in the winter months. Numerous are the initiatives that induce the citizens of Siena in honor of the sacred Hosts: the tribute of the political districts, the respect of children having recently made their First Holy Communion, the solemn procession in the celebration of Corpus Christi, the Eucharistic ceremony at the end of September, the day of the Eucharistic adoration of the 17th of each month in memory of the finding of August 17, 1730.






