

DIOCESE OF VENICE SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.

EASTER SEASON'S BIG BANG

THE FEAST OF PENTECOST

Together our church family unites and celebrates on major Feast Days. On Christmas we celebrate the Gift of God the Son coming to earth. On Easter we celebrate the resurrection of God the Son, and our New Life in Christ. (John 3:16) On Pentecost, we celebrate God the Holy Spirit descending to earth upon the disciples during the Jewish Feast of Pentecost.

It is worth noting that the lewish Feast of Pentecost is the lewish Feast of First Fruits (first harvest). So too, the Christian Feast of Pentecost is the Feast of First Fruits or first Christians and the birth of the Church when the Holy Spirit ignited Faith in the hearts and minds of all who were present, including Mary, Mother of Jesus, the disciples in the Upper Room, and the crowd of 3,000 Jews who were in Jerusalem to celebrate Pentecost.

The crowd thought that Peter and the disciples were drunk when they spoke with other tongues. The disciples' previous fear during and after the resurrection completely vanished on Pentecost. Now the disciples spoke boldly and courageously how Jesus Christ was crucified, died, and was buried, and rose from the dead in three days as the prophets had foretold, thereby giving eternal life to all who believe in Him. When the crowd heard Peter's testimony in ACTS 2: 14-41, they all repented and were baptized.

Without the Holy Spirit, the Church could not have been born. Without the Holy Spirit the Church could not grow to the "ends of the earth". (Acts 1: 4-5) John the Baptist revealed that Jesus will baptize with the Holy Spirit. Jesus revealed that He had to go before He could send forth the Holy Spirit (John 16:7). Six weeks following the resurrection of Christ Jesus, the Holy Spirit made His powerful entrance to earth on the Day of Pentecost. The Church has been growing ever since due to the activity of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit gives us faith in Jesus and leads us to draw closer to Jesus. At each Mass, we are fed God's Holy Word and God's Body and Blood from the Table of the Word and Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. We celebrate God's very presence in His Word, in Holy Eucharist, and we celebrate the presence of the Holy Spirit within the faithful, Jesus prayed in John 17:21 "...that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me."

We see evidence of the Holy Spirit's activity in the Church in the homilies we hear, in the mercy shown to the poor, in the catechists' teaching, in the leadership and organization of the Church, in the generosity of all who give financially, in the counseling given by spiritual directors, in the work of missionaries around the world, and in the sanctification and spiritual charisms (healings, tongues, discernment, dreams, prophesies, and most importantly, the overwhelming Love) that the Holy Spirit places within the faithful. (Romans 12: 1-8 and 1 Corinthians 12: 1-11).

The lives of the faithful blossom by surrendering to the Holy Spirit and by giving ourselves as a "Living Sacrifice" (Romans 12: 1-3). We are empowered in unique ways and blessed with abilities to serve God and others, including spiritual charisms (gifts) we previously did not possess.

The whole world spoke the same language, using the same words. While the people were migrating in the east, they came upon a valley in the land of Shinar and settled there. They said to one another, "Come, let us mold bricks and harden them with fire."

They used bricks for stone, and bitumen for mortar. Then they said,

"Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the sky, and so make a name for ourselves; otherwise we shall be scattered all over the earth."

The LORD came down to see the city and the tower that the people had built. Then the LORD said:

You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation. That is what you must tell the Israelites."

"Everything the LORD has said, we will do." On the morning of the third day there were peals of thunder and lightning, and a heavy cloud over the mountain, and a very loud trumpet blast, so that all the people in the camp trembled. But Moses led the people out of the camp to meet God, and they stationed themselves at the foot of the mountain. Mount Sinai was all wrapped in smoke, for the LORD came down upon it in fire. The smoke rose from it as though from a furnace, and the whole mountain trembled violently. The trumpet blast grew louder and louder, while Moses was speaking, and God answering him with thunder. When the LORD came down to the top of Mount Sinai, he summoned Moses to the top of the mountain.

Moses went up the mountain to God. Then the LORD called to him and said,

The hand of the LORD came upon me, and he led me out in the spirit of the LORD and set me in the center of the plain, which was now filled with bones. He made me walk among the bones in every direction so that I saw how many they were on the surface of the plain. How dry they were! He asked me: Son of man, can these bones come to life?

I answered, "Lord GOD, you alone know that." Then he said to me:

Prophesy over these bones, and say to them: Dry bones, hear the word of the LORD!

See! I will bring spirit into you, that you may come to life. I will put sinews upon you, make flesh grow over you, cover you with skin, and put spirit in you so that you may come to life and know that I am the LORD. I saw the sinews and the flesh come upon them, and the skin cover them, but there was no spirit in them. Personal Encounter



Missionary Sending



Eucharistic Miracle of








The city of Bergen is famous not only for its characteristic canals but also for a Eucharistic miracle that took place there in 1421. For many months, the pastor of the Church of Saints Peter and Paul had experienced doubt about whether the Body and the Blood of Christ was truly present in the consecrated Host. The priest showed no devotion towards the Blessed Sacrament, so much so that one day after celebrating Mass he took the remaining consecrated Hosts and threw them in the river. Some months later the Hosts were found again floating in the water and stained with blood.













ergen op Zoom (City on the Border), is located along the estuary of the Schelda River and has many canals running across it. In 1421, on the Sunday before the Feast of Pentecost, the pastor of the Church of Saints Peter and Paul, not believing the truth of the transubstantiation, threw consecrated Hosts left over from Mass into the canal.

Several months later, some fisherman found the Hosts floating in the water and soaked in coagulated Blood. News of the miraculous recovery of the Hosts spread quickly, and immediately many pilgrims came to see. Devotion was approved by the bishop and, though it was banned for a long period during the Protestant

Reformation, Catholics silently continued to keep alive memory of the miracle. Devotion was restored in the twentieth century and there are numerous public events to commemorate it.

A Eucharistic Procession, just like Eucharistic Adoration, is an extension of the worship of Jesus Christ, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. In Eucharistic Processions, the missionary aspect of the Eucharist is emphasized as we go forth into the world. Not only gazing upon our Eucharistic Lord, but walking with him, we experience what the disciples did 2000 years ago as they walked with Jesus, proclaiming the Good News to the world. A parish community that undertakes a Eucharistic Procession has made the decision to publicly proclaim its belief in Jesus' True Presence in the Eucharist. By this public witness of faith, the parish invites people in the community to encounter the Risen Lord present in the Eucharistic Host.





