



## DIOCESE OF VENICE SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.

including emergency assistance, food and housing, counseling and mental health services, as well as programs for seniors and children.


Within a span of a year, Casa Maria Soup Kitchen's dedicated volunteers serve an average of 35,000 hot lunches each year to the impoverished and hungry.

Our Mother's House provides housing for mothers with children who are homeless. The program offers on-site child care and ensures that the mothers receive the professional training and resources they need to lead stable and independent lives. For children, an on-site "Early Head Start" program is available.

Guadalupe Social Services provides "The Clothing Room" which is open to anyone in the Immokalee community to choose items

that have been donated. At the same site, "The Shower Program" serves the chronically homeless or individuals living in substandard housing. Those in need receive a change of clothes, hygiene products, a towel and, of

course, access to clean showers.



example is the "Weekend Power Pack Food Program" which provides homeless elementary students with food to sustain them through the weekend when school meals are not available.

Catholic Charities strives to create a safe and nurturing environment where individuals can regain stability and work towards a better to-



I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."

#### FR. TOM'S GOSPEL REFLECTION

Loving is not always easy, but it is what we are called to do.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples: Love one another as I have loved you. It sounds so simple. But it can be very difficult. Still, Jesus' words can help us step back from these difficulties and try to find that foundation of love from which we are to begin all inter-actions with one another.

This is what we see demonstrated in today's reading from Acts. There was controversy in the early Church about what requirements would be made for someone asking to be baptized in the name of Jesus. God reveals to Peter that whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him, Gentile or Jew.

In our second reading, taken from John's first letter, love is again put forth as the mark of one who knows God and follows the teachings of Jesus. In this letter, the words of Jesus are reiterated - that love originated with God, in fact, that God is love. And God loved us, his creation, so much, that he sent his only begotten Son to redeem us and make it possible for us to have life everlasting in heaven. But God has also loved us enough that he has given us free will, to accept or reject the love he has offered. If we accept it, we will, in turn, love others as he has loved us. And how has he loved us? Generously, lavishly, sacrificially.

To love others in this manner-generously, lavishly and sacrificially-is how we are to love one another. However, to love in this manner does not always come easily. Love like this takes courage. At times we need to be the first one to extend an act of goodwill in a painful situation. To love like this means that our sense of what is fair and right is not dependent on someone else's actions. Our love is given because it is ours to give; it is our choice.

We do not merit God's love and grace. They are freely given to us. The more we receive those gifts of love and grace, the more we are able to choose to offer them to others. To love like God loves us means we need to pray to God to discern his will in our lives, and we need to receive the sacraments. The Eucharist nourishes us and strengthens us and the sacrament of reconciliation softens our hearts, and helps us experience our own sinfulness so we are open to receive God's pardon, mercy and love. In doing so, we can foster a disposition of the heart that will enable us to recognize when we need to offer compassion and mercy to those we encounter.

Today, let us consider how we love one another. How we love those who are difficult to love. How we love those who wish us harm. How we love those who are different from us. How we love those we do not really know. It is easy to love those who love us. The true sign of one who loves as Jesus taught us to love is that he or she loves those who are a challenge to love. The payoff is worth the effort, because we are reminded that whoever loves as Jesus taught will find their joy complete.

The four pillars for St. John the Evangelist Year of Parish Revival are: Reinvigorate Worship, Personal Encounter, Robust Faith Formation, and Missionary Sending.

#### **Reinvigorate Worship**




#### **Robust Faith Formation**








## From The International Eucharistic Miracles of the World Exhibit, designed by Carlo Acutis: Mogoro, Italy, 1604

In Mogoro, on the Italian island of Sardinia, on the Monday after Easter 1604, Father Salvatore Spiga, pastor of the church of Saint Bernard, was celebrating Mass and after the consecration began distributing Communion to the faithful. At a certain point, he saw in the Communion line two men who were well-known for the dissolute lives they led. The pastor gave them Communion and as soon as they had taken the Host in their mouth, they spit them out on the stone floor below the altar rail. The two men justified themselves by saying that the Hosts had become as hot as burning embers, and that they were burning their tongues. Then, taken by remorse at not first having gone to Confession, they ran away. Father Salvatore went to gather the Sacred Hosts that had fallen and saw that their imprints remained in the stone as if they had been sculpted there. He ordered the stone to be thoroughly washed in the hope that the imprints would be erased. But every attempt failed miserably. Many historians, including Father Pietro Cossu and Father Casu, described the findings made by the bishop at that time, Antonio Surredo, and by his successors.

Among the most important documents that confirm the miracle is the a public act written by the notary Pedro Antonio Escano on May 25, 1686, in which the rector of Mogoro stipulates a contract for the construction of a wooden tabernacle over the main altar. At the base of the tabernacle, there was to be an opening for the "stone of the miracle," which was to be enclosed in a decorative case and placed in such a way that the faithful could see it. The stone bears the imprint of the Hosts to this day.
