

DIOCESE OF VENICE SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.



While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?"

Disregarding the message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue official,

"Do not be afraid; just have faith."

He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official, he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them,.

"Why this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but asleep."

And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all out. He took along the child's father and mother and those who were with him and entered the room where the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to her, "Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!"

The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded. He gave strict orders that no one should know this and said that she should be given something to eat.





Fr. Tom's Gospel Reflection

The woman in the Gospel had been sick for twelve years. That's a long time, a huge chunk of life. But she was a woman of faith.

Patients who have no faith are at a disadvantage. They endure a threefold suffering: they suffer their disease; they suffer on account of its meaninglessness (for them it is nothing but a vexation, the result of blind chance); and they suffer because it suspends their life. They see their illness as something to be endured rather than lived. Their lives are on hold as they wait passively for things to get back to normal so that they can begin to live again. They are living in the future rather than the present.

On the other hand, patients with faith are in a much better position. Though faith may not deliver them from their disease, or diminish the suffering it causes them, believers continue to live as intensely as before, and even more so. They can seek God in sickness as well as in health, and their sickness can turn out to be such a fruitful experience that they will bless that sickness.

Nevertheless, it's not easy to deal positively with illness. But unless people do, the time of illness becomes a complete waste, just so much junk. They throwaway the vital raw material instead of trying to transform it.

The sick must be helped to see their illness in the larger context of their life. To see it, not as some unfortunate episode in their life, but as an intrinsic part of it. This is not the junk of life. This is as true as any other part of life, and has the potential to enrich them.

Patients must be helped to tap into their spiritual resources in times of crisis. Spirituality can thrive in a hospital environment. Here the human spirit, stripped of power and status, is at its most vulnerable. It is then especially that spiritual resources can become available to us. It is then that we are forced to draw on them. So an enrichment, a deepening of the person can result.

God's love can be experienced even in suffering. God's presence does not necessarily take away suffering, but gives us the power to transform it. We need God to help us so that our souls are not reduced to pure passivity, to being mere objects, acted upon but never acting.

We are not caring for the soul when we protect ourselves from the impact of illnesses, visits to the doctor and/or hospital. The soul is nurtured by want as well as by plenty.

From our illnesses we can derive a new understanding of our vulnerability as human beings. 'Illnesses exist to remind us that we are not made of wood' (Van Gogh). A painful experience causes us to reflect on our lives, and teaches us to be compassionate towards other sufferers. Compassion is not learned without suffering.

FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT EXPLAINED

Why Floridians Should Vote NO on Amendment 4

WHAT IT SAYS

BALLOT SUMMARY

No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion

before viability

or when necessary to protect the patient's health,

as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

WHAT IT DOES

ALLOWS SECOND & THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS

Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb*, generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.






FAITH CHAT BIBLE STUDY




