

DIOCESE OF VENICE SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.

Amen.

Fr. Tom's Gospel Refelction

In today's Gospel, although it is still early in Jesus' public ministry, the things He is saying and doing already are making waves among the religious Establishment. In general, the crowds Jesus is attracting are impressed with His power to heal and to "cast out devils." But the religious authorities see Him as a dangerous, risk-taking non-conformist — a potential threat to their authority. They seem convinced that Jesus' power comes from the "Evil One." The Scribes from Jerusalem are saying, "Beelzebub is in Him. It is through the prince of devils that He casts devils out". Moreover, when Jesus' own relatives hear of the things He is saying and doing, they think He has gone mad. As the Gospel writer puts it, "... they set out to take charge of Him, convinced He was out of His mind".

If this seems a bit weird, try making a list of some of the risks Jesus asks us to take in our relationships with others. Then show it to some people who know you well, even some close relatives. Tell them you are going to live in this manner. And don't be surprised if they seem convinced that you have gone mad — that you are out of your mind.

We gather together around the Table of the Lord. We experience the Lord's Presence in our midst. But He is not here to tell us that everything is right with the world and we do well to conform to its standards. Rather, He invites us to partake in the Mystery of the Cross. He invites us to follow Him and accept the consequences — even at the risk of convincing others that we are "out of our minds."

Down through the centuries, Jesus has been analyzed and characterized and categorized like no other person in human history. Some see him as a great teacher. Some see Him simply as a "good man." Some see Him as a "social reformer." And some, of course, call Him "the Son of God." In our time, no one seems to see Him as insane, but almost everybody, it seems, including ourselves, fails to fully understand Him. His teachings will make sense at some other time and in some other place, we reason, but not in this real world.

Is it madness to trust in the Jesus who tells us that He will raise us up "on the last day?" Is it madness to trust in the Jesus who says, "I am the Bread of Life. No one who comes to Me shall ever hunger, no one who believes in Me shall ever thirst?". Is it madness to believe in the Jesus who tells us, "I am the living Bread come down from heaven. If anyone eats this Bread he shall live forever?" Or is it, as the Gospel writers are telling us, the very heart of reality — indeed, the "sober truth."

Those who genuinely trust in Jesus Christ may come off as different, strange, even a little mad, in the eyes of the world. And yet, because they are different, they make a difference in the world. They make a difference not because they say they are Christians but because they act like Christians. They make a difference because of their attitude and approach to the needs of other people. They make a difference because, in imitation of Christ, they are a healing presence in the world.


Mary and Joseph trusted in you and welcomed Jesus into
