Fr. Tom's Gospel Reflection

Physical presence is a great thing. We don't always realize this until a loved one is absent. And it is brought home to us more forcefully still when a loved one dies, leaving a great emptiness.

Physical presence is a great thing. But it is not everything. Physical presence doesn't always produce the intimacy we long for. In fact, people can be sitting side by side without being really present to one another. There may be no communication, much less communion, between them. Indeed, for all that passes between them, they might as well be miles apart. But then the opposite can happen. People can be separated by a great distance and yet be very much present to one another.

We believe that Jesus is present in the Eucharist. But he is not physically, present. Nevertheless, he is really and truly present. The mode of his presence is beyond our understanding. We call it "the real presence" because it is presence in the fullest sense. To receive the gift of the Eucharist is to receive the Lord himself.

Of course, an act of faith is required. But for those who believe that God is present in all things and in all places, his unique and special presence in the Eucharist ought not to be a big problem. Besides, we have the word of Jesus: "This is my body ... this is my blood." St Cyril says: "Do not doubt whether this is true, but rather receive the words of the Savior in faith, for he cannot lie."

The expressions "to eat his flesh" and "to drink his blood" must not be taken with a crude literalism. "Body and blood" stand for the whole person. When we eat the bread and drink the wine of the Eucharist we are not receiving a body and blood. We are receiving a person, a living person.

In the Eucharist Jesus comes to us, not under the form of something like a radio, or a coat, or even medicine. He comes under the form of something more basic still, something which is essential for life - food. More specifically he comes under the form of bread. Bread nourishes us and gives us life. But it is also something which we can take into ourselves, and make part of ourselves. Through the food of the Eucharist Jesus nourishes in us the undying life of God which we received in baptism. This is why he says, "Anyone who eats this bread will live forever."

When we receive the Eucharist, Jesus comes to each of us personally, as though each of us was the only person in the world at that moment. We are able to enter into a deeper intimacy with him than if he were physically present. We are not merely in communication with him, but in communion with him, a holy communion. Through the Eucharist a spiritual bond is forged between us and Jesus. The Eucharist enables us to grow in intimacy and friendship with the Lord.

And through our shared intimacy with Jesus in communion, we are united also with one another, something which we must try to live out in our ordinary lives through mutual love, forgiveness and concern.

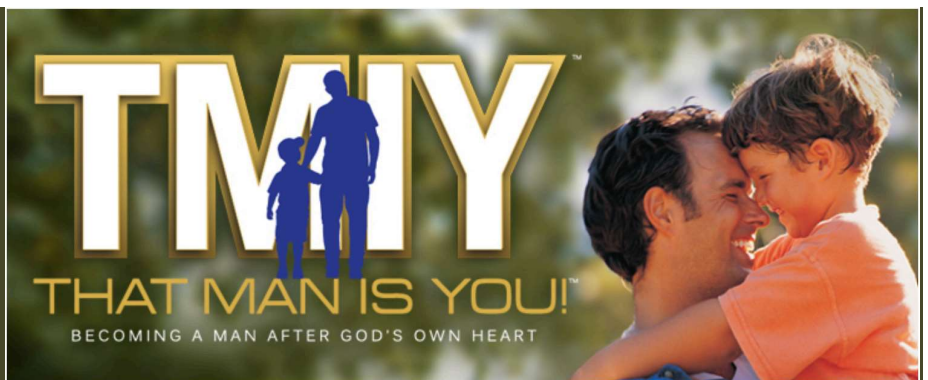

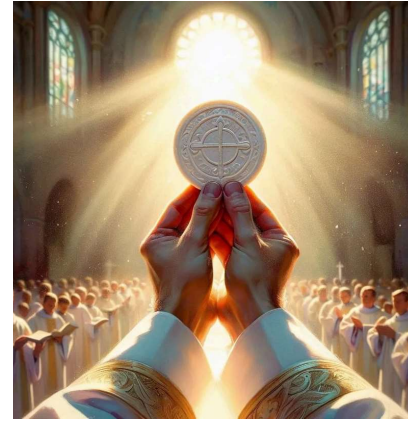

Transubstantiation

Transubstantiation is the process by which the bread and wine of the Eucharist is transformed into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Catholics believe that through transubstantiation, the risen Jesus becomes truly present in the Eucharist. The word transubstantiation is made up of two parts: 'trans' and 'substantiation.' The first part is a prefix that means 'across', 'beyond', or 'through'. It suggests that some kind of change has taken place. The second part of the word, 'substantiation,' refers to the philosophical term substance. According to the Greek philosopher Aristotle, substance is a thing's deepest being, what it is, in and of itself. The substance of a thing is what it really and truly is beyond all appearances. Aristotle calls those appearances accidents. An object's accidents are its external characteristics, what we can see, smell, touch, taste, and hear. Those accidents can help us identify and describe an object, but they do not necessarily capture the inner essence of a thing, its substance.



Let's look at an example. A teenager decides to dress up as a zombie for Halloween. His costume is highly realistic, complete with torn clothing, heavy makeup, and lots of fake blood. He groans like a zombie and even has an earthy, musty smell. To all appearances, in his accidents, this young man seems like a zombie, but deep down, in his substance, he is, of course, a human teenager.

In transubstantiation, then, the substance of the bread and wine changes into the body and blood of Jesus Christ. The accidents of the bread and wine, their taste, smell, and appearance, remain the same, but deep down, the bread and wine no longer exist. They are completely Jesus Christ.

Brief History of Transubstantiation

Catholics have always believed that Jesus Christ is truly present in the Eucharist, that the bread and wine really become his body and blood. Jesus Himself said so at the Last Supper, when He took bread and said, 'This is my body,' and wine and said, 'This is my blood.' Catholics take Jesus at His word. The church teaches that through consecration by a priest, the sacrificial bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ. The manner in which the change occurs, the Roman Catholic Church teaches, is a mystery

This whole mystery is preserved in the Most Holy Eucharist and the Sacrifice of the Mass. We take unleavened bread and wine, two sources of nourishment. By the will of the Father, the work of the Holy Spirit, and priesthood of Jesus entrusted to His ordained priests, and through the words of consecration, that bread and wine is transformed into the Body and Blood of Jesus. Yes, the bread and wine do not change in characteristics they still look the same, taste and smell the same, and hold the same shape. However, the reality, "the what it is," the substance does change. We do not receive bread and wine; we receive the Body and Blood of Christ. We call this "change of substance" transubstantiation

Our belief in the Holy Eucharist is rooted in Christ Himself. Recall the beautiful words of our Lord in the Bread of Life Discourse in the Gospel of St. John: "I myself am the living bread come down from heaven. If anyone eats this bread he shall live forever; the bread I will give is my flesh, for the life of the world. Let me solemnly assure you, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you. He who feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has life eternal, and I will raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood real drink. The man who feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in him. Just as the Father who has life sent me and I have life because of the Father, so the man who feeds on me will have life because of me" (John 6:51, 53-57). Note that none of this language is symbolic—Jesus meant what He said.

The meaning of Bread of Life Discourse becomes more clear at the Last Supper on the first Holy Thursday. There Jesus gathered His apostles around Himself. According to the Gospel of St. Matthew, Jesus took unleavened bread and wine—two sources of basic nourishment. He took bread, blessed it, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to the apostles, saying, "Take this and eat it; this is my body." He took the cup of wine, gave thanks, gave it to His apostles and said, "All of you must drink from it for this is my blood, the blood of the covenant, to be poured out in behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins." If we extracted the words of consecration recorded in the Last Supper accounts of the gospels and distilled them, we would have our words of consecration used at Mass. (Confer Matthew 26:26-30; Mark 14:22-26; and Luke 22:14-20.)

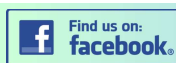

DIOCESE OF VENICE

SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist

Report any abuse against minors to the Florida Department of Children and Families at 800-962-2873. If Diocesan personnel or volunteers are involved, also notify the Diocesan Victims Assistance Coordinator, Susan Benton, at 941-416-6114.
