When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. —So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?"

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### Fr. Tom's Gospel Reflection

Only a fool would wash the outside of a cup and ignore the inside. We make sure to wash at least the inside, whatever about the outside. Jesus said we should do the same with ourselves. We should get the inside clean, whatever about the outside. In fact, if the inside (the heart) is clean, the outside (our behavior) will also be clean. But if the inside is unclean, then the outside will be unclean too. The outside will reflect the state of the inside.

The Pharisees saw evil as something outside themselves -- in things and especially in other people. They prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else. If evil was outside themselves, then they could protect themselves from it by avoiding contact with people, or where this was not possible then by ritual washings.

The Pharisees were sincere people. It's just that their efforts were directed at the wrong target. For them the exterior was everything. Hence, their concern about outer cleanness, and neglect of what was more important - inner cleanness, or cleanness of heart.

Jesus said that the source of evil is within us. It has its roots in the heart. We can't guard ourselves from it by separation from others. All those horrible things he lists, and which we read about in the newspapers -- unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride -- all these things start inside a person. Their seeds are within us all. These are the things which make a person unclean in the eyes of God.

This is a very disturbing truth, and one we ignore at our own peril. A great problem of our time is our failure to know ourselves, to recognize evil and deal with it within ourselves. Yet there is a kind of comfort and freedom in knowing and accepting this humbling truth.

Today there is a huge preoccupation with cleanness of body. Hence, all the ads about soaps and perfumes. And there is great preoccupation with the environment -- with the quality of the water we drink, the food we eat, and the air we breathe. It's not that these are unimportant. It's just that there is another environment which is even more important -- the moral environment. Evil is the worst kind of pollution of all.

But if the source of evil is within us, so too is the source of good. All our thoughts, words, and deeds flow from the heart like water from a hidden spring. If the spring is clean, then all that flows from it will be clean. We must purify the source.

There is a story about a master who one day put the following question to some of his disciples: "What is the thing that one should avoid most in life?"

"An evil eye," said the first.

"A treacherous friend," said the second.

"A bad neighbor," said the third.

"A bad heart," said the fourth.

The Master liked the last answer best, because it included all the others. Then he said, "And what is the most desirable thing to strive for in life?"

"A good eye," said the first.

"A good friend," said the second.

"A good neighbor," said the third.

"A good heart," said the fourth.

The Master liked the last answer best, because it included all the others.

We must strive for cleanness of heart. Total purity of heart is unattainable here on earth. It is a struggle that will always go on. A pure heart is not the same as an empty heart. A heart that is full of love is a pure and healthy heart.

#### DIOCESE OF VENICE SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist



## Examining The Issues of the Day ...IN CHURCH?!

### **Catholic Social Teaching**

In the Catholic Tradition, responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation. "People in every nation enhance the social dimension of their lives by acting as committed and responsible citizens" (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 220). The obligation to participate in political life is rooted in our baptismal commitment to follow Jesus Christ and to bear Christian witness in all we do.



### The Church's Role in Matters of State

The Church is non-partisan and would never presume to tell you for whom to vote. However, the Church plays an important role here, which is not only to encourage the faithful to carry out their responsibilities in political life, but to help them to do so. Bishops, aided by priests, deacons, and lay ministry, must share pertinent Catholic Social Teaching and guidance on the moral dimensions of the issues of the day, particularly involving public decisions with real and lasting consequences. Church Teaching and Mission, such as the defense of human life, the dignity of every human being, and the protection of the weak and vulnerable, must be shared, and advanced.

### Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship

The U.S. bishops offer a teaching document to guide Catholics in the exercise of their rights and duties as participants in our democracy, *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship.* 

"Some question whether it is appropriate for the Church to play a role in political life. However, the obligation to teach the moral truths that should shape our lives, including our public lives, is central to the mission given to the Church by Jesus Christ.

Indeed, our Church's teaching is in accord with the foundational values that have shaped our nation's history: 'life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.'"

The Church's obligation to participate in shaping the moral character of society is a basic part of the mission we have received from Jesus Christ, who offers a vision of life revealed to us in Sacred Scripture and Tradition. This kind of political participation reflects the social teaching of our Church and the best traditions of our nation.
