Fr. Tom's Gospel Reflection

This Sunday each year the Church invites us to embark on a great journey -- the journey of the Liturgical Year.

When we start the liturgical year, we are setting out to follow in the footsteps of Christ. In the course of the year, the whole of his life and teaching will pass before us. We will re-visit all the mysteries of his time on earth: from his expectation (that is what Advent is about), to his birth, his life, death, resurrection, ascension into heaven, and his sending of the Holy Spirit.

In the course of the year we will relive his whole story. But we have heard the story many times. Hence, there is a danger that we may see it as old and stale. We must try and see it as new and present and alive. It's not like playing an old video. The celebration of each feast brings back the event in its original clarity and vitality, never allowing it to grow cold and lifeless or fade into oblivion.


Besides, we are not spectators but actors in all of this. The mysteries of Christ's life are represented in such a way that we are drawn into them, and become participants in them. That makes it more demanding, but more enriching and exciting too. God is not just a God of the past, but of the present and the future. Each year we ought to hear the Christ story better, understand it more deeply, and make it more our own. In hearing his story we ought to hear our own stories too. Our stories merge with his and are illuminated by it. His story enables us live our own story more fully and more joyfully.

Even though we've made the journey before, we must try to embark on it today as if for the very first time. This Sunday is a God-given chance to make a new beginning in our following of Christ.

Today the readings concentrate on the second coming of Christ and the end of the world. The reason for this is that before we commit ourselves to a journey we need to know the goal of the journey. So on this day the liturgy directs our eyes towards the goal of our own journey and that of the world, namely, the second coming of Christ.

The early Christians believed that the Second Coming was near, and would be preceded by cosmic signs. We are not so sure about that. All the false prophets speak of the end as a time of gloom and doom. But Jesus spoke of it as a day of liberation and salvation for his followers. The world is not heading for catastrophe or mere ending. God has a goal for the world. That goal is the coming of God's Kingdom in all its glory. Therefore, we should not be afraid of the Lord's coming, but await it with confidence, vigilance and prayer.

However, we should worry more about the end of our own individual world at death, which is certain, than about the end of the whole world, which is out of our hands.





"The Gift of Sight"

During our October-2024 eye care mission to Kingston, I found 12-year-old Deaghane and his mother hanging around outside the St. Pius X eye clinic. They had no appointment to see the eye doctor and we were already overbooked; we couldn't squeeze him in because we had already cancelled some patients' appointments. One look at this young boy's busted eyeglasses, held together with super-glue and packing tape, and I knew we had to do something.

After some probing, I learned his mother could obtain a copy of his old <u>prescription</u> but she couldn't afford the \$25 fee the local clinic charged to get a copy. We gave her <u>\$25</u> and they came back later with the record. We chose a new frame for <u>Deaghane</u> and he will get new glasses from JOP in a few months. BUT WAIT, THERE'S MORE!

Paul Connor is JOP's Optical Chairman, our own Mr.-Fix-It, and he loves a challenge. One of Deaghane's lenses was still intact, so Paul took it out and put it into a temporary frame. The left lens was useless but, fortunately, Paul's old stock of lenses included Deaghane's prescription. However, the lens cutting machine Paul used in the past was broken, so Paul spent most of the afternoon manually cutting the left lens to fit the temporary frame. Deaghane is a polite and very well-spoken young man who does well, even with poor vision, in the 6th grade at St. Andrew Technical school.

He and his mom are so very grateful to you, our donors, for giving him "the gift of sight" and the opportunity to continue to excel in school.

DIOCESE OF VENICE SAFE ENVIRONMENT POLICY

The Diocese of Venice states that, "all employees, covered volunteers and religious brothers and sisters must be electronically fingerprinted. Eligibility for employment/ volunteer work/ministry will be contingent and conditioned upon a satisfactory background investigation. A reasonable effort shall be made to update the criminal history background information every five (5) years". The Diocese classifies a covered volunteer as "any unpaid adult person engaged or involved in a Diocesan activity in which he/she is entrusted with the care and supervision of children or allowed unsupervised access to children or vulnerable adults" (e.g. when screened personnel not present).

St. John the Evangelist also requires the following volunteers to go through the background screening process (through fingerprints):

- Volunteers who handle cash, credit cards, and other financial transactions
- Volunteers who are entrusted with confidential information, such as donor records and parish registration forms
- Volunteers who serve, distribute, and administer the Holy Eucharist
