Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

If you wish to reserve a candle, please call Rita Spagnola at 514.1302.



Spotlight on Stewardship:

Jamaica Outreach Program

Newly Retired? JOP Needs You, Your Talent, Your Time

The Jamaica Outreach Program (JOP) was organized in 1997 by a few parishioners from St. John The Evangelist with a vision of helping the poor, the needy and the homeless in and around St. Pius X parish in Kingston, Jamaica.

At first, our efforts were dedicated to collecting and sending food and clothing to our sister parish, however, very soon we expanded our efforts to the day-to-day operation of St. Pius X, which was in desperate need of financial support for its operating expenses.

From those humble beginnings, JOP has increased the services it provides to St. Pius with the following:

- 1. a medical clinic opened five days per week,
- 2. a food bank where staples are distributed on a regular basis,
- 3. educational aid to the 1400 students at the DuPont School on the grounds of St. Pius,
- 4. a food and goods collection, packing and shipping network,
- 5. continuing education in the areas of cosmetology, computer ed., sewing and food prep,
- 6. an eye clinic providing free eye exams and eyeglasses to over 700 needy patients each year,
- 7. a fully established dental clinic which is about to open,
- 8. a home construction program providing a safe place to live for nearly 500 families,
- 9. many more services too numerous to mention.

These efforts have been made possible through the

dedicated work and cooperation of a board of directors consisting of 11 members, an advisory board consisting of 9 members and innumerable volunteers who help the wheel spin with precision.

As the JOP program grows, we find ourselves in urgent need of more workers at all levels. We need people who are willing to share their talents and efforts for the common cause of bringing a better way of life to those sometimes called "the least of our brethren." The JOP and the people of St. John know full well that the needs of the poor are anything but "least." It is what keeps us devoted, dedicated and determined to follow Christ's message told so beautifully in His Sermon on the Mount.

Volunteers are welcomed in all of the areas listed above, at the board of directors' advisory level (prospective future directors), committee co-chairs and folks who just want to volunteer for a specific program. Also needed are new people willing to chair (or co-chair) our two major events: the Christmas Tea and Pirates of the Caribbean Festival. These particular fundraisers are functions that need new ideas and enthusiastic people to carry them out. Can you help?







n last Sunday's readings, we learn of God's call to Samuel and to the early disciples as recorded by John the Evangelist. Today, we hear Jonah's call to the Ninevites to repent of their evil ways and to redirect their lives toward God. In contrast, we also enter into the world of Mark's

Reflection Questions

Jonah, demonstrate the *urgency* in attending to God's call. The city of Nineveh had fallen to sin. God used the prophetic utterances of Jonah to turn the people back to God. Years later, we find Jesus proclaiming the time of fulfillment and hear his call for repentance. Repentance is a turning away from sin that requires "metanoia", *a change of heart*. God calls us to conversion. It is a call that involves a radical change — turning away from sin and engaging the language of God's heart. We must ask ourselves: What does it mean to belong to God? What is involved in joining his company and being one of His disciples?

The disciples of the gospel did not merely pay lip service in answering the call of Jesus. Instead, we find these ordinary men leaving everything they know to answer the call. In order to follow Jesus, Simon, Andrew, James and John were required to put down their nets and follow the Master. This radical response involved abandoning all that was familiar to them and leaving behind material comforts to

embark on a journey into the unknown and accept the challenge to live the Way.

The call of Jesus and Jonah to repentance is still applicable for our world today. When we look around, we find sin is still very much present. The world gives witness to sin, so does the Church, and so do we! We are reminded today that Jesus' Way constantly calls us

to repent and believe in the gospel. We must be converted *every day*. We must change our hearts of stone and replace them with the heart of Christ. As ordinary people, we are entrusted with an extraordinary task — to live as He lived, love as He loved, forgive as He forgave, and to teach the world by our example. We are called to move beyond lip service and live the gospel. In the words of St. Francis of Assisi, "Preach the gospel; when necessary use words."

The task of embracing the message of Jesus is far-reaching. Most often it involves going against the tide of popular opinion. Following Jesus requires sacrificing our time and our treasures to promote the message of truth in the midst of deception and half-truths. In order to be called a disciple, we must demonstrate our beliefs through our character, words and actions. Being a true disciple means that we, just like the first disciples, have the courage to leave what is familiar and comfortable to us. True discipleship requires a radical change of heart in which we redirect our lives, orienting ourselves toward God and what he expects of us. Following Christ requires that we choose the "road less traveled" in which we chose to tread the trodden path which Christ journeyed on. It is a road that leads to the destiny of compassion, mercy, hope, and a love that knows no conditions. It is a path that brings us closer together to a worthy end.

Prayer

We pray: Eternal Father, possess us and fill us with the fire of your love. Ignite us with the flame of faith and the burning desire for truth. Let us take the weakness of our sin and transform it through our repentance and belief in the gospel. Help us to become people of the Way, instead of reluctant followers. When we say "Amen" to your Word, let it not simply involve our lips, but engage our souls. May we learn to be converted everyday and be consumed by your love. Amen

Is it okay to miss Mass on Sunday if I am busy?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) says, "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation the faithful are bound to participate in Mass" (CCC, 2180). "Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin" (CCC, 2181). This excludes those who cannot attend for unavoidable reasons such as illnesses or infirmity, for example.

Life can get so busy that when Sunday comes around each week, it becomes just another day to run errands or catch up on chores. Yet, God intended the Sabbath (Sunday for Catholics) to be a holy day of rest for us when we reconnect with him. That's one of the reasons he gave us the Third Commandment.

Attending Mass each week is not just something we have to do, it is something we get to do. At Mass, each faithful Catholic is fed with abundant graces. We know that our Lord is truly present in the Eucharist, and we receive his body and blood in this Sacrament. The Mass is a precious gift to us.






