



Parish Mission & Life

#ToKnow, #ToLove, #ToServe – Respecting Life: Inclusion of All Our Parish Family

In continuing our Respect Life Month here in October, there is one component to cherishing all life that may not get as much attention as it should: the integration of the disabled and special needs in our lives and our church. Pope Francis spoke about the need to be inclusive and engaging for those around us who may see the world a little differently, or have challenges to overcome:

Yet what an illusion it is when people today shut their eyes in the face of sickness and disability! They fail to understand the real meaning of life, which also has to do with accepting suffering and limitations. The world does not become better because only apparently "perfect" people live there — I say "perfect" rather than "false" — but when human solidarity, mutual acceptance and respect increase. How true are the words of the Apostle: "God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong" (1 Cor 1:27)!

This Sunday's Gospel (Lk 7:36-8:3) presents us with a specific situation of weakness. The woman caught in sin is judged and rejected, yet Jesus accepts and defends her: "She has shown great love" (7:47). This is the conclusion of Jesus, who is attentive to her suffering and her plea. This tenderness is a sign of the love that God shows to those who suffer and are cast aside. Suffering need not only be physical; one of today's most frequent pathologies is also spiritual. It is a suffering of the heart; it causes sadness for lack of love. It is the pathology of sadness. When we experience disappointment or betrayal in important relationships, we come to realize how vulnerable and defenseless we are. The temptation to become self-absorbed grows stronger, and we risk losing life's greatest opportunity: to love in spite of everything!

The happiness that everyone desires, for that matter, can be expressed in any number of ways and attained only if we are capable of loving. This is the way. It is always a matter of love; there is no other path. The true challenge is that of who loves the most. How many disabled and suffering persons open their hearts to life again as soon as they realize they are loved! How much love can well up in a heart simply with a smile! The therapy of smiling. Then our frailness itself can become a source of consolation and support in our solitude. Jesus, in his passion, loved us to the end (cf. Jn 13:1); on the cross he revealed the love that bestows itself without limits. — Pope Francis, 6/12/16 (http://w2.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/homilies/2016/documents/papa-francesco_20160612_omelia-giubileo-ammalati-disabili.html)

With each new generation, we lament the fact that they don't seem to know basic facts and information, such as the current vice president or who won the Civil War. Anything beyond last week is ancient history to them, but there are many events in our collective past that are necessary and proper to remember.

That is why we (the Catholic Jewish Dialogue of Collier County) hold a Kristallnacht Commemoration each year on the Sunday closest to the historical date of 11/9/38. On that horrible night, the Nazi government prodded gangs of thugs to attack Jewish neighborhoods, businesses and synagogues across all of Germany. To put it in context, think of the riots in Ferguson, Baltimore and Milwaukee multiplied by a few hundred, all going on at the same time. Coincidentally, like the U.S. riots in response to a police shooting, the Kristallnacht riots were allegedly sparked by the murder of a German diplomat in Paris by a distraught Jewish man. When it was over the government blamed the Jews themselves and fined them for the damages.

We encourage all of you to bring your children and grandchildren because in a few years it will be up to them to carry the torch of "Never Forget."

The program this year will feature music and a multi-media presentation of firsthand accounts of the Night of Broken Glass, "Shattered and Broken".


Mass Times Revert to Winter Schedule Beginning Sunday, November 6; Weekday Evening Mass Will Be Moved to Wednesday



A Story of Gratitude

ne of the first things we teach our children is manners and how to say thank you when something is done for them. Gratitude always shows a deep appreciation and respect for the person who acts on our behalf. In today's gospel we encounter ten lepers pleading with Jesus that they be healed. Leprosy had such a devastating effect on people in Jesus' day. This flesh-eating disease brought decay to the extremities of the human body and cast its victims into exile. The leper was taken from his family and forced to live his life in isolation. It is no wonder that these ten lepers pleaded with Jesus to have pity on them. Jesus' compassion and ministry brought them the healing they yearned for. However, only one returns to Jesus to show his appreciation and to give thanks. It seems hard to imagine

Reflection Questions


- What is most significant about the story of the ten lepers for you?
- How significant is the issue of faith in this story?
- Consider a modern-day parable to the condition of leprosy. How are you being asked to participate in the healing ministry of Jesus?
- What have you to give thanks to God for?

- Have there been times in your life when you feel that your faith has saved you?
- How does your faith shape your life?
- How is your life an expression of thankfulness to God?

Jesus' life project was to bring to the world the dignity and healing of God. He did not simply cleanse the skin of those ten lepers; he also gave them a new beginning, solidifying a place for them in the world — a place of belonging. When we reflect on other moments in Jesus' ministry, we see how Jesus brings the poor and dejected to a place where they know that they truly belong as a member of God's people. No one is outside the realm of God's love. Moreover, Jesus chastises the religious teachers who, due to their piety and interpretation of the law, cannot see the importance of unburdening people from sin and suffering.

that none but the foreigner returned to give thanks to God.

The good news for us today tells us that we all have a place in God's kingdom. There is not a single person

living in this world that is not loved by our heavenly Father. Unfortunately, people sometimes separate themselves from the love of God and the divine laws that God sends us to keep us close to him. However, there is always an opportunity to turn back to God and live the example of His Son. The ministry of Jesus is ultimately a ministry of healing. The Church is the vehicle in which we find salvation. The Church is continuously called to be healing for all those who find themselves suffering or in despair. People sometimes feel that they do not belong to our Church and they fear rejection. They are often burdened with either their past or their present reality. Today's gospel shows us that it is God's initiative to take away the burden and bring people to a sense of purpose and belonging. All that God wants from us is our gratitude for the great things that He has accomplished for us throughout salvation history.

The Mission, examines the events surrounding the Treaty of Madrid in 1750, when Spain ceded part of South America to Portugal. The lush Oscarwinning cinematography was shot entirely on locations in Columbia and Argentina by Chris Menges.

In the mid-18th century, the Jesuit priests, in what is today northeastern Argentina and western Paraguay, found themselves caught in a not unusual struggle between the Pope in Rome and two of Europe's most aggressive temporal powers.

But this 18th Century story is also an allegory for the mid-20th Century struggles when many priests in Latin America also found themselves at odds with Rome.

The 1980s was also the time that Father Jorge Mario


The 1980s was also the time that Father Jorge Mario Bergoglio, S.J. (Pope Francis) was rector of the Philosophical and Theological Faculty of San Miguel in Argentina where he served until 1986. He was removed as rector by the Jesuit superior-general because of his policy of educating the young

Jesuits in direct pastoral work.

It may be interesting to consider how this time instructed the social focus of our current pope.



Bishop Barron recounts this story about St. Catherine:

"Catherine was born in Siena on March 25, 1347.... By all accounts, she was a beautiful, lively, and fun-loving child. When she was a girl of six or seven, Catherine had an experience that changed her forever and provided the interpretive key for much of what she would say and do in the course of her life.

While...standing in the middle of a busy thoroughfare, Catherine suddenly saw in the sky a vision of Christ surrounded by other saints and apostles. What was most remarkable was that Jesus was robed in the vestments of the Pope. She was utterly captivated by the vision, feeling herself drawn into a higher and more beautiful world. That she would serve Christ precisely in and through serving Christ's vicar was clearly signaled by this early experience."
