Our first speaker, Matt Laboda, captured the attention of both the young and not-so-young. Matt has a great sense of humor and also has the ability to go deep into the faith in a way

that is relevant to real life.

All families are welcome to attend our next Families In Christ event on Sunday, November 18. All families are asked to bring canned goods that will be donated to St. Matthew's House. John Paul II taught that the way of the family is the way of the Church. He showed us how Christ came to redeem the human person and fulfill the deepest longings in our heart for love, joy and meaning even in the midst of suffering. The Holy Father's great insight, however, was that each human person enters into the world by way of the family and that the family is our first school of love, which is meant to provide each of us with our first experience of unconditional love. In fact, the communion of persons in the family is meant to be an icon of the divine communion of Persons in the Trinity. At Families In Christ, we try to make sense of all this. We try to answer John Paul II's calls for families to become who we are: communities of life, love and meaning.



Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.



The theme for this year’s rally was, “Have Courage and Keep the Faith.” Our patron was Blessed Miguel Pro, a Jesuit priest martyred in the persecution of the Church in Mexico. Before being killed by firing squad, Bl. Pro proclaimed the now famous battle cry of Spanish speaking Catholics: “Viva Cristo Rey!” (Long live Christ the King).

Our young people were encouraged and exhorted to live their faith in a public way, unafraid and unashamed to proclaim the Gospel

We are all aware of the power of prayer. I happen to have a first hand account as thousands of you prayed for the safe arrival of my triplets in 2011. As a result, my wife and I have three happy and healthy toddlers. I received a letter the other day which I will share with you. It really hits home with the difference that our parishioners make when praying for those on the prayer list.

My son-in-law “David” returned safely home on November 4th aboard the USS Enterprise. Please remove him from the prayer list. I would like to share what my daughter said to me after she received a copy of the bulletin when Dave’s name was first added to the list. She was crying when she called, and she said: “Mom, I was so frightened that Dave would be killed and not come back to me and the boys, but after I saw his name on the prayer list, I felt an inner peace settle over me. I know he will be okay now.” The people of St. John the Evangelist do make a difference. Thank you so much for sharing the burden and making it a little lighter.

We have “toyed” (no pun intended) with the idea of hosting a Christmas toy drive for children in Collier County the past several years but have made no headway. Thankfully, the Ladies of Charity have stepped up and offered to host a bike drive. Their goal is to provide 200+ bicycles for needy children in Immokalee. On November 17 and 18, there will be a Christmas tree in the narthex with ornaments designed to look like bicycles. The ornaments will be age appropriate indicating what type of bicycle is needed. Parishioners may drop off the bicycles at the parish office at any time before December 16. On December 15 & 16, we will have a truck on site with a banner indicating the bike drive in front of the church. You may bring your bike with you to Mass that weekend and drop it off at the truck. The bicycles will be transported to the Guadeloupe Center in Immokalee immediately following Mass on December 16 to be distributed for Christmas. You may also make a check payable to St. John the Evangelist and indicate “Bike Drive” in the memo line. I have checked prices for new bicycles at Wal-Mart and Target and found that you may purchase a bike for at little as \$39.00. This is a wonderful program and will truly benefit children that would never be able to afford a new bicycle. Remember that for the older children in Immokalee, a bicycle is their sole source of transportation. Please see the advertisement in the bulletin next weekend for further details. Thank you so much for your consideration of the children in Immokalee.

After a fast and furious race to the finish, The “Lest we Forget”

Veteran’s Memorial will be dedicated following Mass this Saturday morning, November 10. Although there will be some finishing work remaining, we will have the majority of the infrastructure installed. We are extremely excited to share this memorial with you to recognize the men and women who have served in the armed forces to ensure our safety.

The first order of replacement granite markers for the Memorial Garden arrived this past week. Take a look as you leave Mass and see the dramatic difference. We began with Section 24 (adjacent to the fountain on the West side) and then will move on to the Knights of Columbus section (Northwest corner) and continue until completed. This will be a major undertaking and the Memorial Garden will be closed from time to time while this work is being completed. The end result will be very aesthetically pleasing and worth the slight inconvenience. Thank you in advance for your understanding while we transform the Memorial Garden into a truly beautiful and spiritual space. **IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT** – For those of you waiting in the wings, the price of a space in the Memorial Garden will increase on January 1. The new cost for a space will be \$1,500.00. If you would like to take advantage of the current \$1,200.00 pricing, please contact me (566.1678) at your earliest convenience.



The Widow's Mite

*I*n listening to today's gospel, one can almost visualize the powerful scene Jesus was observing. People came to the treasury to offer their gifts to God. One after another, people entered to offer their gift to God. There is such a joy in giving. We are told that many rich people came to make large contributions for the care of the temple building that housed their worship. A widow enters the equation, putting a mere couple of coins into the collection. Jesus

recognizes this as the greatest gift offered. The widow gives everything she has to make her sacrifice for God and her place of worship. The others give from their surplus, not feeling the great sacrifice of the widow.

This gospel account teaches us about sacrifice. The widow contributed her whole livelihood in sacrifice for what she believed. The two coins were not of much value in the world's terms. However, they signified great value in the world of faith. The widow's mite involves an act of the heart and great act of will. She had a huge place for God in her heart and surrendered her whole livelihood to Him.

There is a powerful message being offered to us today. The witness of the widow's mite invites us to consider our commitment to God and the Church. We are asked to discern how willing we are to sacrifice to advance the work

of the kingdom. As members of the Body of Christ, we are called to participate in the work of the gospel in the ministries of the Church.

Reflection Questions

1. What does it mean to sacrifice?
2. Who has made sacrifices for me?
3. What do I have to offer?
4. Do my words give birth to action?
5. How is the Lord calling me to sacrifice?
6. How will I sacrifice of my time this week for the gospel?
7. Am I prepared to sacrifice some of my treasure?
8. What is the message given to me through the proclamation of this gospel?

Everyone has gifts that may be applied to any given ministry. As a people of God, we are asked to sacrifice time in order to reach out to others in many different ways. As the baptized faithful, everyone is asked to take the time to pray and inform one's self in the faith. If we truly believe with a heart and mind that the God of Jesus Christ is the foundation of our lives, then we will make the time to act on his behalf and discern his will for us.

We are also asked to share our treasure. Parishes all over the world need the support of parishioners to build the kingdom through programs and ministries. What makes a Catholic home special?

In a truly Catholic home, both the home and the family in it show clear evidence of Catholic identity and consciousness of the presence of God. Here is how to enrich the Catholic identity of your home:

Dedication to prayer: Teach children to pray often and perfect the basic elements of prayer using ACTS: Adoration – praise God for who he is, Confession – admit wrongdoing and be sincerely sorry, Thanksgiving – recall all God’s blessings, and Supplication – make requests for ourselves and others.

Devotion to the Sacraments. Sacraments are the fabric of Catholic life. In particular, Catholic families are nurtured by weekly Mass and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. *“Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them...”* (Luke 18:16). Make weekly Mass your family’s top priority.

Commitment to work. Each of us has an obligation to work and serve our families, our communities, and our world. It is important that children be given early opportunities to serve through age-appropriate chores.

Determination of obedience. Jesus was obedient to his parents on earth and to his Father in Heaven. Teaching children to be obedient like Jesus when they are young will encourage them to continue imitating him as they grow.

Sharing of Love. Catholic homes are full of genuine, mutual love that flows from God to each member of the family.
