Honoring Our Nation's Deterans

The St. John choir sang our National Anthem and a number of patriotic songs to bring out the pride and honor felt by those in attendance.

AJC Faithful Navigator, Sir Knight Gary Ray, noted in his remarks that "We are in awe at the eternal debt which we owe..... to the untold number of American Veterans... who chose to set aside... their personal ambitions and dreams.... in order to assure the wellbeing of our great nation. We, the living, are indeed the beneficiaries of those who made the tremendous sacrifices for the advancement and surety of our liberty." "To all our veterans.... we have a simple yet heartfelt message -- thank you - Thank you for your unwavering service in peacetime and war, here in this nation... and throughout the world."

Following the Mass, the parishioners joined Fr. Bob, in a prayer of remembrance, at the "Lest we Forget" statue outside the church. FN Gary Ray and wife Carolyn laid a wreath at the foot of the statue. The Marine Corp. League followed the prayer with a twenty-one gun Salvo, as WWII Sgt. Robert McDonald took out his bugle and played an emotional "taps" to close the ceremonies providing a heartwarming conclusion to a great day.

The parishioners were treated to refreshments following the ceremonies in the Parish Life Center, which was sponsored by the AJC Knights of Columbus Assembly. Americans will pause this

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.



Discerning the Gift

he readings today focus themselves on the readiness of humanity to meet God. In today's gospel Jesus offers the parable of the talents. In the gospel next Sunday we will listen to the Last Judgment. The reason for such discernment comes as we end the Church's year and celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King next week. This is also appropriate as we remember during this month of the Holy Souls, those who have gone from this life to meet the Lord.

We must always be ready to meet the Lord when he comes. Our focus today bids us to question how we use the gifts that he has given. St. Augustine once wrote: "A life half-lived is not a life worth living." Such a comment bears witness to what Jesus is talking about today. Each one of us has been given entirely different gifts and we are called to use such gifts. The greatest poverty is when gifts are laid waste and unused. Jesus reminds us in today's gospel that God has given us these "talents" or "gifts" to build on his economy of salvation. Every time we use our God given talents we glorify God.

Reflection Questions

- 1. What are your greatest gifts?
- 2. How do you feel called to use those gifts to others?
- 3. Why do you think you exist?
- 4. What is your purpose in life?
- 5. In what ways can you help transform some of the broken realities around you?
- 6. What is your greatest achievement in life so far?
- 7. What do you want to accomplish before you die?
- 8. Is God part of your life project?

Today, we are asked to discern what gifts God has given to us individually and how are to use them in building up the community of the Church and the world. The gift of medicine promotes health and well being. Music fills our souls with beauty and joy. The gift of education and science gives us opportunities to explore the mystery of God's gift to the world. The world of invention allows the world to explore the possibilities of God waiting to unfold. The gift of family and children enables humanity to join in the co-creation of God. The Church is the gift of the gospel constantly being proclaimed to a world in constant need of redemption and conversion. In the midst of these gifts and the many other gifts that God has to offer the world, we are asked to discern our purpose and to use our gifts by offering them back to God.

The glory of God is truly to be found in the person fully alive. This is the dignity that God has called us to. We become fully alive when we move away from being passive spectators in this great drama of life and move toward being active and contributing participants, building up the Body of Christ. And so today, let us explore ways in which our commitment to the gospel and the Church will bring to life the gifts that each one of us has received.



Using God's Gifts by Janel Esker

It takes courage to entrust something precious to someone else. New parents stall when leaving their newborn in a babysitter's care for the first time. A mother repeatedly reminds her daughter on prom night that her grandmother's pearl necklace needs great care. I've hesitated when handing my car keys to my husband, even though he's the safest driver I know. When we entrust another with a precious gift, there's an unwritten covenant that the recipient will use the gift wisely and responsibly.

Such was the covenant between the master and his servants in today's Gospel. Jesus tells us the master entrusted his precious possessions to the servants. This wasn't a random scattering of excess monies. The master gave particular thought to what each servant should receive based on his abilities. The master was thrilled at the first two servants' use of his gift and gravely disappointed in the third's refusal to use the gift responsibly.

We know the master represents God, the servants us, and the talents God's many gifts to us. But have we pondered our unwritten covenant with God—God's courageous choice to entrust to us what is precious to him and an expectation that we'll use these gifts to the best of our ability?

God's gifts aren't randomly scattered, but instead confidently entrusted to us for use in serving others. Perhaps we ought to look at our good health, ample food and clothing, creative talents, and compassion as keys to God's Corvette of the finest pearl necklace in the divine jewelry collection. They're to be used—and used well—in the service of the Lord. †


