Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.



Remembering with Love and Devotion Those Gone Before Us Marked with the Sign of Faith

uring the month of November it is customary to remember those who have gone before us, those who are now caught up in the eternal love of God. We traditionally refer to this as the month of the Holy Souls. Many of us have experienced the loss of a loved one. When we experience death we are often left with a sense of shock, bewilderment, pain, and sorrow. It almost seems when we lose someone that we love that we lose something of ourselves. The experience of death alters our lives completely, so much so, that our lives are never the same again. Therefore, it is natural that we grieve. In grieving we continue to love the gift of our loved one who has been called back to God.

It is not by accident that the first day of this month begins with the feast of All Saints. The commemoration of all the faithful departed follows this important feast — reminding us all that this life is temporary and the next

life is eternal. When we talk of the Saints we generally think of the great figures of our Christian history that are known for their holiness and notoriety. These men and women continually call us to a life of holiness. But also noteworthy are the people who have made a difference in our lives by passing on the faith and inspiring us. Each one of us has known and loved people who have been called home to the Father's house. They may not make the list of the Saints in the Vatican archives of history, but their footsteps of love, holiness, and compassion can still be seen in the grains of sand that make up our lives. These holy souls in many respects revealed God's plan for us and continue to remind us that our lives on earth are temporary, calling us to set our sights on the world to come. Today we celebrate these lives, recalling that they now stand within the holy grounds of eternity, living in newness of life.

Each one of us has received the great gift of life. The wonder

of creation and the sacredness of every human being bless us and offer glimpses into the mind of God. The gift of salvation history reminds us that we are part of a greater story that continues as we meander down the road of time. In the gospel today, Jesus tells us that he is the ultimate gift of God sent to do the will of the Father in heaven. Through our belief in him we are given the promise of eternal life and look forward to being raised on the last day.

So let us remember with gratitude all of those who have touched us — knowing that they are in the hands of the Eternal Shepherd. We pray for those who failed to acknowledge God's presence in this world, that through our prayers and the mercy of God, they be admitted to the joys of heaven. We also pray for all the people who have lost their spouses; our deceased parents who taught us how to walk and to live in faith; those parents who see their children die before their time; and those who serve to protect us who have lost their lives in the service of freedom. We Share Hope

Yesterday was All Saints' Day, when we celebrate the saints. Today is All Souls' Day, the day we hope and pray that everyone who has gone before us is or will be with God.

Catholics do a thing that others, including other Christians, find very strange: We talk to "the faithful departed." There is a logic behind our practice.

When humans are particularly nervous, we ask for help. Sometimes we go directly to the person who can help us, and sometimes we ask others to intercede for us. Most people who believe in God pray, so we might ask, "Mom, I have a test tomorrow, will you pray for me?" (You can bet she is also praying as you drive out of town for spring break.)

Do we know how prayer works? No. Do we know it matters? Yes. Instead of asking our friends to pray for us, could we go directly to God? Of course. No doubt we do that anyway.

So why do we look to other people? Because we are all in this together. We care about each other. Of course, Christ has the central place in our prayer life. He is our intercessor. He is also the one who taught us to pray with and for each other.

When we pray, we have a lot of company. Other types of Christians pray for each other. Folks from a lot of ancient faiths prayed for each other. So what makes Catholics different? **We talk to people who are dead.**

And here is why. We don't think they're dead. They were joined with Christ and with us when they were here. Are they any less concerned for us now? Of course not. So we ask them, saints and non-saints alike, to intercede on our behalf with God. Christ triumphed over death—his and ours. He is our hope. In the body of Christ, we share hope.

Help Children Love Confession

Ask children to accompany you to Confession, and you may not hear much enthusiasm. Yet the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a gift from Jesus to help us experience his grace and make things right with God. Try these tips to brighten the family trip to Confession:

Set the tone: Remind everyone that Jesus created this Sacrament (Matthew 16:19) because he loves us and knew we needed extra help to stay holy.

Work out the jitters. Rehearse with your child so that the real thing will feel familiar. Taking notes with her into the confessional is fine if she's afraid of forgetting something.

Set the expectation: Going to Confession regularly will strengthen the entire family. Pick a set day and time so that no one is surprised when it comes around. Mark it on the calendar and schedule around it. Then be the first person into the Confessional.

Celebrate: Afterwards go out for an ice cream treat or have a special family meal to celebrate coming back into friendship with God.




