Anointing of the Sick/Funeral Arrangements. Call the parish office. If the office is closed the answering machine will provide an emergency phone number for you to reach a priest.


Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

Imagine yourself in the prophet Elijah's time. There was a great famine and people were suffering. God tells Elijah to go to Zarephath and Elijah obeys. He was escaping from a powerful and rich king of Israel who was persecuting him, and now here he is in a pagan country by God's direct order. The first person he encounters is a poor pagan widow who has only enough food left to feed her son and herself one meal. Elijah tells her that the God of Israel will not let her flour and oil run out. Believing him, then, she feeds Elijah with what little food she has. We see two instances of remarkable obedience in this reading: Elijah obeys God and runs for his life, and the poor pagan widow generously accepts the challenge of using up her scant provisions. Can you imagine the faith that took?

In Mark's gospel passage, we see the contrast of the rich and powerful with the poor but generous just as we saw in our passage from 1 Kings. As Jesus teaches the crowds, He warns them to beware of the scribes, the teachers of the law, who are haughty and arrogant, who prey on the poor and then pretend to be pious with long prayers. They have perverted true religious practice. Their piety is false, and they act in a way to be seen and praised by others. Then, as Jesus sits opposite the temple treasury, he watches these rich donate large sums of money. When a poor widow comes and puts in two small coins, Jesus takes this opportunity to teach his disciples a lesson. He says, "This poor widow put in more than all the other contributors... They have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

In the first reading, we saw a poor widow who trusted Elijah's God and risked her own and her son's last meal before the strong possibility of starving to death. God rewarded her faith, as well as Elijah's. Here we see a similar situation. While those who have much are seen to give for the wrong reason, the poor widow is giving all she has – in a sense she is giving her whole life into God's hands just as that first widow did. For this widow the temple is a holy place, a place of prayer. She goes to the holy place with true piety and gives herself into God's hands.

What does that mean for us? What can we learn from our two poor widows? We learn the importance of trusting in God. The second widow illustrates how the disciples of Jesus should live. The Pharisees wanted to be noticed when they gave money. Their concern was for appearances. On the other side, however, the poor widow humbly gave all she had with faith that the temple needed it more than she. This widow put her life into God's hands, just as Elijah's widow had. She is for us a figure of a true Christian disciple—a person who believes in God's love and providence and so is able to humbly share what she has.



Which brings us to the all-important question: How may we be such Christian disciples? Can I do it? Do I have to give up my car, my home, my children's toys, and their future college or technical education? Does it mean I should tell my family that we will be living on the street just as soon as I can give away everything we have? No, of course not. There are so many ways that we can be generous even without money. We have our time, our encouragement, our friendship. Don't tell your family you will all live on the street. Ask them how you can be generous Christian disciples together right where you are. For it is in humility and generosity of spirit that we may be disciples of Christ.



Dr. David Keys Presents: The Tilma of Juan Diego






