Jackie took over the management of the gift boutique this past summer at the request of Scott Schlossberg, general manager, and Fr. John.

"It was the challenge to improve and prosper for the good of the parishioners and our St. John community. I thought I could offer my experience from my previous position as owner of a small business. I was looking for an opportunity of doing something rewarding and fulfilling," Jackie said.

The Divine Gift Boutique is a perfect fit for Jackie. In 1980 she and her husband opened a small gift boutique of 900 square feet in Allen Park, Michigan, and after 30 year and moving to four different larger locations they ended up with a 5,500 square foot Hallmark Gold Crown Store.

Letter from Finance Council Regarding Importance of Meeting 2012 CFA Goal

Dear Parishioners.

In August, in Scott's Corner, Scott Schlossberg, our General Manager, provided us with a detailed explanation of the mechanics of the Catholic Faith Appeal. You may not have seen this bulletin. The Saint John the Evangelist Finance Council want you to know that we strongly support the Annual Catholic Faith Appeal. These funds are used to provide services to the less fortunate in our diocese.

At this time, we are soliciting your help, so that we can meet our 2012 assessment/goal of \$443,000.00. Right now, we are short of our goal, we still need \$34,326 by the end of 2012. Why is that important to our parish? If we fall short of our goal, which we did in 2011, we will have to use our general operating funds to pay for the shortfall.

And you should know that our parish budget for fiscal year 2012/2013 was based on the parish meeting our CFA goal. If we fall short, this will be a "budget buster" for the parish and our ministries. Conversely, if we exceed our \$443,000.00 goal by the end of 2012, any excess will be returned to the parish free of diocese assessment. We can then use these excess funds for whatever programs or ministries we choose. For example, we could use these funds to create reserves to replace the aging Parish Life Center air conditioning units and/or purchase materials for Faith Formation, Music Ministry, etc. This would be a huge windfall for our parish. We all benefit from our beautiful campus and our "over the top" ministries here at St. John.

We are confident that with your help, we can achieve our goal. Please consider making a pledge or contribution to the 2012 Catholic Faith Appeal. Remember to make your check payable to the CFA with St John the Evangelist in the memo line.

Spending Time During Week Preparing for Sunday Mass

The "theological key" to understanding Advent is to understand Christmas properly as well. During the Christmas season, we celebrate not only Christ's coming 2,000 years ago, but we celebrate his continued coming through Word and Sacrament and his future coming at the end of the world.

This week let's focus on Christ's continued coming through Word

- and Sacrament. We might ask ourselves a few questions to help us enter more deeply into Advent.
- There is little chance we'll experience the power of the Mass if we don't prepare for it. Do we look forward to hearing God's Word and receiving Holy Communion with *preparation*, *expectation and hope* each Sunday? Or has it become a boring routine and chore? Do we actually spend some time during the week preparing for Mass?
- If the answer is no, Advent is a great season to ask God for the grace to enter more deeply into the Mass. Tell God: "I've tried but I really don't get this Mass thing. I know I shouldn't, but I find Mass very boring. Please give me the grace to enter more deeply into the Mass and to experience the power of hearing your Word and receiving you in Holy Communion."
- Prepare to receive God's Word: it is helpful to read the
 Gospel slowly and prayerfully each morning or evening
 throughout the week. When we pray the Sunday Gospel,
 God will begin to speak to us through his Word and penetrate
 our hearts more deeply. Sunday readings can be found at:

- Prepare to receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament: the same Jesus who was swaddled and laid to rest in a humble manger now comes to us under the humble appearance of bread. Just as those present at Jesus' birth had no way of knowing from his outward appearance that he was God, we have no way of knowing Jesus is truly present under the humble appearance of bread in the Blessed Sacrament. What was needed then and what is needed now is faith. If we want to increase

- our desire to receive Jesus in the Eucharist, if we want to experience his power in the Eucharist, it is helpful to pray throughout the week for this grace. This will also help us look forward to receiving him.
- Expectation and Hope: do we go to Mass expecting that God will do anything in our lives and change us in a real way?
 Are we different and better off for having attended Mass or just the same? It is helpful to look to the Church's teaching about the fruits of Holy Communion:
 - Increases growth in our Christian life: preserves, increases and renews the life of grace received at Baptism.
 - Separates us from sin. Forgives venial sins and preserves us from future mortal sins.
 - o Strengthens our bond of love with Jesus and his Body, the Church.

Advent challenge:

- 1. Spend 10 minutes each day prayerfully reading Sunday's Gospel;
- 2. Visit the Adoration Chapel once this week.

LET US PRAY...



For those of you who sit in the back wings of church, I am confident that you had no problems reading your missal this past weekend. After numerous delays, we were able to get most of the ancillary fixtures installed prior to weekend Masses. From the comments I have heard thus far, everyone is pleased with the very tasteful sconces and chandeliers. The

volume of new light recognized thus far is amazing versus what existed before. Unfortunately, we were unable to obtain an adequate lift to access the ceiling in order to install the stage lighting, which is the true beauty of this new lighting system. As of this past Wednesday, we still had no lift but are expecting to have one in time to get the remainder of the project completed by this weekend. I certainly am not holding my breath as I could easily be asphyxiated in doing so. The lift that is required to access the ceiling is very specialized and there are only 11 in the state. Because of the tight quarters in entering through the front doors and navigating between the pews, we are limited to this particular lift to reach the ceiling. This is a height of 55 feet at its highest point. Until this week, all of these lifts have been on long term rental or lease. We have experimented with several other options with no luck. Short of apologizing once again, I can only say that we are doing everything in our power to get the job done.

The Ladies of Charity "Bike Drive" is in full swing. As of this past Wednesday, we had a jam packed truck of new and gently used bicycles. So many that we had to make a trip to Immokalee to drop off the first shipment. In addition to the bicycles, you have also donated over \$5,000.00 in monetary contributions to purchase bicycles for our neighbors in Immokalee. We have one full week to go as of this weekend to meet our goal of 200 bikes. After seeing some of the bicycles donated thus far, I would like to make the following suggestion. The recipients of these bicycles will be thrilled with their new mode of transportation. We would also like to have them keep their new bicycle. Many of the bicycles donated are worth well over \$200 (several are upwards of \$500) and will

make a nice target for theft once they are on the road. If you are unable to purchase a bike, maybe you could purchase a lock and chain to secure these valuables. I would hate to see someone abscond with a brand new bike intended for someone who really was deserving. This is a reality and the streets of Immokalee are tough. If you share my concerns, please consider donating a lock and chain. Thank you to all who have contributed thus far to this amazing Bike Drive.

The Ladies of Charity are also conducting a food drive concurrent with the Bike Drive. There are two trees in the narthex, one of which has ornaments for bikes and the other for food. Both the food and bicycles will be donated to the Guadelupe Center in Immokalee.

I received a call from Fr. Dennis Farrall, Pastor of Resurrection Roman Catholic Church in Gerrittsen Beach, NY. Resurrection parish was the recipient of our Hurricane Sandy collection. Fr. Farrell exclaimed that he was completely blown away (he said it knocked his socks off) upon receiving our check for relief from Hurricane Sandy. He went on to tell me that over 450 homes in their community were severely damaged or destroyed by the hurricane. Prior to receiving our check, he had been distributing funds to parishioners in need with a \$350.00 cap. Those funds were nearly exhausted as of the time of our call. Fr. Farrall will be writing a letter of sincere thanks which we will publish in our bulletin when it arrives. Thanks to our parishioners for making a difference in the lives of those in New York and beyond.

We are in the home stretch of the 2012 Catholic Faith Appeal. In this bulletin (page 3), you will see a letter from the Finance Council regarding the importance of the CFA in addition to a piece issued by the Diocese concerning year end giving (page 20). We are dangerously close to reaching our goal after falling disappointingly short last year. If you are able to assist us in our efforts, it would be greatly appreciated. As of this past





Why do Catholics say novenas?

A novena is a cycle of prayers offered for a particular purpose spanning nine days, usually one day a week for nine weeks. It consists of prescribed prayers and devotions and usually includes reception of the Sacrament of Penance and Holy Communion. It can be made in common in church or in private. 


