Fr. Carl Arico is a co-author of the book *Living Our Priesthood Today* (Our Sunday Visitor, 1987) with Fr. Basil Pennington, and the author of *Taste of Silence* (The Continuum International Publishing Group Inc, 1999), a guide to the fundamentals of Centering Prayer.

Everyone understands that we use deep purple for Lent. In our lifetime the church has always used the rich royal color to symbolize penance and fasting in preparation for the passion and resurrection of Christ our King. We also strip all the plants and remove all unnecessary furniture and accoutrements. We do that to give us visual fasting. By removing from our sight the beauty of lush greens, blooming plants and flowers, and absenting beautiful pieces of furniture or art, we not only set an example of simplifying our lives for a space of time, but we deprive ourselves of the joy of looking at them. This visual fasting heightens our awareness that this season has special perimeters and, hopefully, helps us to

evaluate our relationship with community, altar table, and God.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Sweeping HHS Mandate <u>Stands</u>, Violating Conscience Rights and Religious Liberty Congress Must Act to Fix the Problem

On January 20, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) reaffirmed a rule that virtually all private health care plans must cover sterilization, abortifacients, and contraception. The exemption provided for "religious employers" was so narrow that it failed to cover the vast majority of faith-based organizations—including Catholic hospitals, universities, and charities—that help millions every year. Ironically, not even Jesus and his disciples would have qualified for the exemption, because it excludes those who mainly serve people of another faith.

On February 10, the Obama Administration made this rule final "without change"; delayed enforcement for a year against religious nonprofits that were still not exempted (our charities, hospitals, and colleges); and promised to develop more regulations to "accommodate" them by the end of that additional year. But, as explained below, that promised "accommodation" still forces them to pay for "services" that violate their religious convictions.

The original rule that violated our religious liberty so severely has not been changed, but finalized.

After touting meaningful changes in the mandate, HHS instead finalized the original rule that was first issued in August 2011 "without change." So the offensive definition of "religious employer"—which excludes our charities, hospitals, and colleges because they serve people of other faiths—is <u>still</u> in place, and those institutions are <u>still</u> subject to the mandate.

HHS has promised some kind of "accommodation," but only after the election.

HHS said it would take an additional year to develop more regulations to "accommodate" religiously-affiliated charities, schools, and hospitals that still fall outside the "religious employer" exemption. The impact of these additional rules will not be felt until after the election, the only point of public accountability for the Executive Branch. This eliminates an important incentive for HHS to provide the best protection for religious liberty

The promised "accommodation"-even at its best-would still force our institutions to violate their beliefs.

Under the proposed "accommodation," if an employee of these religious institutions wants coverage of contraception or sterilization directly from the insurer, the objecting employer is still <u>forced</u> to pay for it as a part of the employer's insurance plan. Since there is no other source, the funds to pay for that coverage must come from the premiums of the employer and fellow employees, even those who object in conscience.

There is no exemption for objecting insurers, secular employers, for-profit religious employers, or individuals.

The U.S. bishops defend religious liberty <u>for all</u>, and so have repeatedly identified <u>all</u> the stakeholders in the process whose religious freedom is threatened by the mandate—<u>all</u> employers, insurers, and individuals, not just religious employers. Now, all insurers, including self-insurers, must provide the coverage to any employee who wants it. In turn, all individuals who pay premiums have no escape from subsidizing that coverage. And only employers that are both non-profit <u>and</u> religious may qualify for the limited "accommodation."

We urgently need legislation to correct the mandate's threats to religious liberty and conscience rights. The Respect for Rights of Conscience Act has been introduced in Congress (H.R. 1179, S. 1467) to ensure that those who participate in the market for health insurance "retain the right to provide, purchase, or enroll in health coverage that is consistent with their religious beliefs and moral convictions."



Following Directive of Bishop Dewane's HHS Letter

The HHS has issued a rule forcing nearly all private health plans to include coverage for all FDAapproved prescription contraceptive drugs and devices, as well as surgical sterilization. These are listed among "preventive services for women" that all health plans will have to cover without co-pays or other cost-sharing -- regardless of whether the insurer, the employer or other plan sponsor, or even the woman herself objects to such coverage.

The exemption provided for "religious employers" is so narrow that it fails to cover the vast majority of faith-based organizations, including Catholic hospitals, universities and service organizations that help millions every year. Ironically, not even Jesus and his disciples would have qualified.

During the public comment period last fall, the bishops' grassroots campaign alone generated over 57,000 comments to HHS opposing their mandate.

Now that the Administration has refused to recognize the Constitutional conscience rights of organizations and individuals who oppose the mandate, the bishops are now urging Catholics and others of good will to fight this unprecedented attack on conscience rights and religious liberty.



Changing the Heart ~ A Noble Endeavor

he Season of Lent is here and we are called to conversion. The discipline of Lent — fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, enable us to enter the depths of our souls and to discern God's will in our lives. Conversion is not simply the changing of the mind, but also the changing of the heart. The mind can simply digress from one thing to another. It is here that opinions are formed and sin reigns supreme. Each Lent

we are called to "Metanoia" which means "a change of heart". A true change of heart brings transformation to the life of the one who commits himself to be converted to Christ in this most holy season.

In today's gospel, we hear of the temptation of Jesus. Jesus listened to the Spirit of God within himself, and the Spirit led him into the desert where he underwent self-denial. The forty days Jesus spent in the desert enabled Him to look deep within himself. It was in this reality that Satan brought temptation. Jesus, however, resisted this temptation, uniting his heart to the Father in heaven. In this short passage from Mark we also hear that Jesus was "...among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him." He had to deal with both the good and the bad. Out of this test, Jesus is seen to call us to repent and believe in the gospel. He calls for a change of heart and surrender to the good news.

Each year we are given an opportunity to turn our lives back to God. We are bombarded with so much today. Temptations pervade our time and our space. Goodness is all around us, but so also is sin. Materialism, indifference, discrimination, the world of sensuality and the undermining of the dignity of life, deter us from living the fullness of life. During Lent, Christ and the universal Church invite us to reflect on our lives and to make a return to God. This is a time to refuse to be mastered by sin and yield to the love of God. The language of the heart allows us to let go of what is nonessential and hold onto what is essential. If we turn our hearts toward God, we can remove the negative influences that bring the stain of sin to each one of us.

Let us reflect on our lives. If there is a person or persons with whom we are in conflict, we are asked to turn away from the temptation of resentment and to grapple with the mystery of God's mercy and forgiveness. If there is a situation that we are involved in that is seemingly unjust, immoral, or unethical, then we are challenged to transform these broken realities. We live in a world of fragile peace — fragility exists because of sin. However, the answer to prayer for a lasting peace can be found. This hope exists in the dignity and soul of every individual. Peace can be made a reality when we allow the Prince of Peace to speak through us. This is the hope to which we are called!

We pray: Turn our minds to you, O Lord. Transform our hearts so that we can return to you in love. Help us to remove the things that hinder your new life and growth. Temptation is all around us — do not let us choose sin over you. You are our only hope and salvation. Let our prayer, fasting and almsgiving lead us to you. Amen.

Wisdom of the Fathers

The Lenten season offers us once again an opportunity to reflect upon the very heart of Christian life: charity. This is a favorable time to renew our journey of faith, both as individuals and as a community, with the help of the word of God and the sacraments. This journey is one marked by prayer and sharing, silence and fasting, in anticipation of the joy of Easter...

...A society like ours can become blind to physical sufferings and to the spiritual and moral demands of life. This must not be the case in the Christian community! The Apostle

Paul encourages us to seek "the ways which lead to peace and the ways in which we can support one another" (*Rom* 14:19) for our neighbor's good, "so that we support one another" (15:2), seeking not personal gain but rather "the advantage of everybody else, so that they may be saved" (*I Cor* 10:33). This mutual correction and encouragement in a spirit of humility and charity must be part of the life of the



Christian community...

...These words of the *Letter to the Hebrews* (10:24) urge us to reflect on the universal call to holiness, the continuing journey of the spiritual life as we aspire to the greater spiritual gifts and to an ever more sublime and fruitful charity (cf. *1 Cor* 12:31-13:13). Being concerned for one another should spur us to an increasingly effective love which, "like the light of dawn, its brightness growing to the fullness of day" (*Prov* 4:18), makes us live each day as an anticipation of the eternal day

awaiting us in God. The time granted us in this life is precious for discerning and performing good works in the love of God. In this way the Church herself continuously grows towards the full maturity of Christ (cf. *Eph* 4:13). Our exhortation to encourage one another to attain the fullness of love and good works is situated in this dynamic prospect of growth. — *Pope Benedict XVI (Lent 2012)*

from Scripture

Mark 1:12-15, The Path to Easter

This Gospel describes Jesus' actions after his baptism by John. He prepared for his public ministry by going into the desert for forty days. There he was tempted by Satan, was among wild beasts, and was ministered to by angels.

The lessons of this Gospel can help us prepare not only for Easter, but for the rest of our lives. Temptations surround us. Satan is constantly trying to tear us away from God. The wild beasts represent every kind of danger and evil. But the angels provide God's protection for us. We can rely on them to help us if we ask for God's help.

We can use Lent to fulfill Jesus' proclamation, "Repent, and believe in the gospel." The best way to resist evil is to stay in a state of grace. Go to Confession frequently, receive the Eucharist every week – daily, if possible, and pray as often during the day as you can. When you spend as much of your day with God as possible, Satan and his temptations won't be able to get through your defenses.


