

Getting All of the Kids Involved...





SCOTT'S CORNER



Thank you for your undivided attention this past weekend while I spoke about the Catholic Faith Appeal. Between Fr. John, Matt Loboda and myself there was plenty of information to digest prior to Mass. We are off to a strong start with regards to the 2011 appeal. Prior to any pledges or contributions from this past weekend, we are already at 18% of goal with \$82,705.00 pledged. Thank you again

for your generosity and I look forward to a very successful campaign in 2011.

With the crowds of season also come the poor parking habits of many. I would kindly ask that you not park in the emergency lanes around the church as this creates a very dangerous situation. This past weekend there were vehicles parked in places that were incomprehensible. One vehicle was literally parked right in the middle of a traffic lane. It was as though the driver simply turned off the engine, stepped out of their vehicle and walked in to Mass. When emergency vehicles need to access our parking lot to attend to a sick parishioner, these illegally parked vehicles cause a major problem. In addition, this causes a major problem with regards to traffic flow. We have more than enough parking between the elementary school, Naples Memorial Garden and our campus to accommodate all of the vehicles at any particular Mass. We would ask that you utilize one of our many legal parking spots even if it requires walking an extra hundred yards or so to Mass.

Representatives from the Buildings and Grounds Committee are in the process of reworking the traffic flow in our parking lot. We plan on resealing the parking lot at the end of season and re-striping the lot with a more efficient traffic pattern than what currently exists. We ask for your continued patience until this much needed enhancement is completed.

We will be taping Masses on Wednesday, March 2nd at 1:00 p.m. in the church. We ask those of you that would like to participate to arrive at 12:30 p.m. The Masses will then be broadcast during the year on WFTX-TV FOX 4 -Sundays at 10:00 a.m. You may go to the DOV website at **www.dioceseofvenice.org** and then choose **Communications Department** and then **Mass to the homebound** to find the upcoming schedule of Masses. We would like to have a full church for the taping so if you are able, we would love to have you in attendance. There will be two Masses taped on March 2nd. The first Mass will be broadcast on June 5th – The Ascension of Our Lord and the 2nd Mass will be broadcast on July 3rd – 14th Sunday in Ordinary time.

We will have the boxcar from the Holocaust museum onsite during the week of March 7th to promote the Catholic Jewish Dialogue of Collier County. This organization was formed to find a common ground between the two faiths and to build a bridge of understanding. After a four-year international search, the Holocaust Museum of Southwest Florida acquired an authentic World War II — era railway boxcar. This 10-ton boxcar came to the Museum from Europe on May 16, 2007 and has undergone careful restoration. A rare artifact, this boxcar is an invaluable and mobile educational tool to support the Museum's mission of promoting tolerance and understanding by teaching the history and lessons of the Holocaust. The Boxcar Transportation and Education Project, a world's first, ensures that an important piece of history will visit students right on their school campus. The boxcar serves as a traveling exhibit, the centerpiece in learning about the Holocaust.

There are only ten Stations of the Cross remaining. Please see the list below. The Stations highlighted in red are those that are no longer available. We have also sold two benches to be

located in the prayer garden. I have included a picture of one of the granite benches. I have never seen a granite bench with a back however this is what we are offering. I think you will agree that this is a very attractive bench. Although the granite we are using will be a little darker, you certainly get the idea. The




inscription of your loved one will be etched in the back of the bench as depicted.

- I. Jesus is condemned to death
- II. Jesus is given his cross
- III. Jesus falls the first time
- IV. Jesus meets His Mother
- V. Simon of Cyrene carries the cross
- VI. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus
- VII. Jesus falls the second time
- VIII. Jesus meets the daughters of Jerusalem
- IX. Jesus falls the third time
- X. Jesus is stripped of His garments
- XI. Crucifixion: Jesus is nailed to the cross
- XII. Jesus dies on the cross
- XIII. Jesus' body is removed from the cross (Deposition or Lamentation)
- XIV. Jesus is laid in the tomb and covered in incense.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 9

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 9, 2011, and ends with the celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, April 21, 2011. The Lenten Season is a time for prayer, fasting and almsgiving as we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery of our Faith.

REGULATIONS ON FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday, March 9, 2011, and Good Friday, April 21, 2011 are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence from meat.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 years and 59 years (inclusive). On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal.

Eating between meals in not permitted, but liquids are allowed. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection (USCCB).

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday are all days of abstinence.

Note: If a person is unable to observe the above regulations due to ill health or other serious reasons, they are urged to practice other forms of self denial that are suitable to their condition.

Fasting, almsgiving and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

It is an everyday reality that we may encounter a victim of human trafficking, especially here in Florida, and if we know what to look for, we may be able to save a life. That is the message that the Florida Bishops convey in their powerful DVD presentation, "Invisible Chains," that will be shown after Masses February 26-27 during the Diocese's Human Trafficking Awareness Sunday.

The short film (about seven minutes) provides warning signs to look for in order to identify a potential victim. Those signs include physical abuse, restricted communication, lack of identification documents, being transported to and from work or living and working in the same place, large numbers of people living in one residence, outside locks on doors and windows and signs of being deprived of food, water, sleep and medical care.

The film also stresses that victims have many faces and can be encountered in places we frequent such as the nail and hair salons, restaurants, hotels, or even church. The film calls for Catholics to report any situation of trafficking, even if you're not sure, by calling the National Human Trafficking Hotline at 1.888.3737.888.

Take the young, pretty, Spanish-speaking girl at the opening of the film. She could be the girl in the pew next to you or your daughter or son's friend, but she quickly reveals that she is a victim of human trafficking. Or take the restaurant dishwasher who is forced to work 18 to 22 hours a day with no pay. These are just two of thousands of victims trafficked into the U.S. yearly and kept enslaved by different forms of abuse.

The reality that we can make a difference if we just look beneath the surface is why Bishop Frank Dewane says with confidence in the film, "the Catholic Church, each Parish, each outreach program, and each one of you can put an end to human trafficking."

Please plan on spending a few minutes after Mass today (Seminar Room Clausen Center) to view this powerful presentation.


Building a Vision for Saint John the Evangelist Youth Ministry

Father Dan Bids Farewell

"Be not afraid" is one of my favorite passages from Scripture. Did you know that it appears more than any other passage in the Bible: *366 times!* My entire prayer life found itself centered around



this verse when I first learned that I would be assigned to St. John's, and now that I am leaving, I grasp it once again. It served me well upon my arrival here. Remember, for us Catholics, there are neither coincidences nor accidents. Everything is in the Divine Providence of our



Loving Father. "Wherever two or three are gathered in My Name..." He tries to tell us something about ourselves and our actions.

I want to say "thank you" to all those young families who commu-

nicated a truly fervent desire to learn our Faith as it has been handed down to us through 2,000 years of history, in order to prepare and protect themselves as they grow. I came from the parish that had the single oldest demo-

graphic in the Diocese. Very few children. The young families of St. John have rejuvenated me in my priesthood, and I will be forever grateful.

When our children are given a strong foundation in the truths of our Faith they grow to be exceptional human beings. They are invariably thrust out into their Faith to naturally take leadership roles in our communities.

"Through your Sacrament of Marriage may the world come to see Jesus' love for us." The love between many husbands and wives, and the works they do to-



gether in order that the works they do to gether in order that the world can see the Love of Jesus in them, is truly a wonder to behold. I look at these couples and I am truly amazed at the strength and peacefulness of their Faith. It puts mine to shame. *Remember God does not* promise us happiness in this life — all we have to do is look at what happened to Jesus, the perfect fully human man, to know that — but God does promise peace in this life to those of faith. God promises an eternal life of

happiness if we so choose and it is given by His grace.

One final teaching from the "Professor" here: Be wary of those groups who say that the Teachings & Traditions on Faith & Morals are outdated and need to



be revised. The Teachings on Faith & Morals are *objective*. They have been since the 1st Century. The Teachings do not change with the culture, nor with the individual —objective truth is neither relative nor subjective the Church has been fighting that heresy in one form or



another since the 1st century. "Run, Forrest, run!" if you ever find yourself engaged with them.

Also be wary of the groups that say "<u>We</u> are the Body of Christ and this is <u>our</u> meal." They have

confused the Church's fundamental concept of the difference between the Mystical Body of Christ and the Substantial Body of Christ. I can't see, for example, stuffing Fr. John into a Monstrance and placing him up on the altar so we can adore him. Again,

"Run, Forrest, run!"

I want to leave you with the silent prayers in the Eucharist that I say out loud so everyone can hear. These words are the basis of our faith: *"Through the mystery of this water and wine may we come*



to share in the Divinity of Christ, Who humbled Himself to share in our humanity."

The lamb of Abraham and Moses has now been replaced with the Lamb of God. "This is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. Happy are we who are called to His Supper." His humanity combines with our humanity. His Divine Will combines with our human will, and thus we say: "Lord, I am not worthy to receive You, but only say the Word and I shall be healed." His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity come into our damaged temple of the Spirit and heal us so our Heavenly Father can see in us what He sees in His Beloved Son.

This particular thought came to me tonight as I was writing this:

SEDER MEAL



much food to buy. Wear your favorite "mid-east" clothing.






FINALLY:

I would like to sincerely thank Fr. John. Over a decade ago we were assigned together as new priests under the wise and watchful eye of Msgr. Gerry Finnegan. It was an interesting time. (No, we were not the ones who caused Msgr. Gerry's heart attack!)

My last assignment before arriving at St. John's was in a parish where I was all by myself because the Administrator was out on medical leave. It was very difficult because I didn't know from week to week if the Administrator would be returning. This dragged on for 7 months. We did only one less Mass per weekend there than we do here at St John's, and I was alone. Fr. John was very helpful and supportive, lending his Associates to cover the emergency duty so I could sometimes get away for a day, and helping me deal with the spiritual frustrations. Here at St John's he has let me explore my priesthood rather than micromanage me. He supported me when my philosophy of "Radical Honesty" would at times cause him headaches. He understood I needed to work out my salvation in the way to which I thought I was called. He has some of the best long-term visioning skills in the Diocese, and I expect him to keep helping me as my new community begins to build their Church. (You hear that — right, Father?)
