ent is a period of time when we reflect on the suffering that Jesus endured on the cross. It is a time to remember that Jesus died, that he gave

up his own life for ours. But despite the differences between Lent and other holidays, observance of Lent can be a meaningful experience, even for families with children.

Lent is associated with three disciplines commonly practiced during the season: fasting, praying and alms-

giving. Here are some ideas for how you can use this season to teach your children about Jesus and what he has done and is doing in all of us.

# Fasting (Give Something Up)

The practice most often associated with Lent is fasting.

Fasting during Lent is a way for followers of Jesus to identify with him in his suffering. Although fasting typically involves abstaining from all or some kinds of food, people can also decide to abstain from something else that is meaningful to them. For example, maybe you and your children could fast from watching TV or

playing a favorite video game. Make a commitment to do this as a family so that each family member can encourage each other in what they've given up.

# Praying and Reading the Bible

Another discipline practiced during Lent is an increased emphasis on prayer and reading the Bible. Perhaps you can commit to reading a passage of the Bible together as a family. For instance, praying the Psalm that is

#### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

+ Frank J. Dewane Bishop of the Diocese of Venice in Florida Fr. Patrick Desbois to Speak About Slaughter by Christians "Obeying Orders" March 22

A coalition of Catholic, Jewish and University groups have arranged a lecture by Fr. Patrick Desbois, a French priest who wrote *Holocaust by Bullets*, an investigative account of the discovery of mass graves of about 1.5 million Jews in the Ukraine and Eastern Europe. The unusual aspect of his discoveries was that instead of mass-murder by trickery of "showers" that were actually gas-chambers, the mass murder was accomplished one-by-one, by a bullet to the head.

He will speak of the horribly personal character of the slaughter by Christians "obeying orders." Fr. Debois lives in Paris, France, and this will be his sole Florida appearance, except for a Clergy Seminar the next day. The lecture will be at 7:00 p.m on Thursday, March 22, at St. John the Evangelist Parish Life Center. Call the parish office for reservations.

Collins will give a special workshop on 2 Corinthians on Saturday, March 17 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the Anne Nevins Diocesan Library just outside Port Charlotte and about an hour drive from St. John the Evangelist. This workshop will begin with a short prayer service. A simple lunch (sandwich, chips, fruit, cookie, and drink) will be provided.

Fr. Collins has taught New Testament for 40 years (24 years at the Catholic University of Leuven in Belgium and 13 years at the Catholic University of America). Now "retired" to his native Rhode Island, he functions as a Visiting Scholar in the Department of Religious Studies at Brown University. He is the author of hundreds of articles and several books, including a commentary on 2 Corinthians, which will soon be published in the *Paideia* series by the Baker Academic Press. He is currently an associate editor of *The Catholic Biblical Quarterly* and regularly writes a short commentary on each of the Sunday gospel readings for *Emmanuel*.


\*\*\*Clothing will be loaded onto a container and sent to St. Lucia in June. Items may be dropped off at the Parish Office from now until June 1st.

- You may purchase more than one ticket. If you have the wherewithal to do so, I highly recommend this option as your odds increase exponentially.

Obviously, only two may attend for each ticket so you could draw straws to see who attends. 




# Alteration & Transformation

n the gospel today we recall that Jesus led
Peter, James and John to a place where they
would encounter his transfiguration. This was
a moment in time when heaven was wedded to
earth and humanity was opened to the glory of
God. Could you imagine what went through
these three men's minds? The encounter gave
Peter, James and John a new insight into Jesus
because they glimpsed his divinity. Peter
announces, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here!"
He is overjoyed with this experience of God. As

a Jew, Peter would have held great reverence to the Law and Prophets. On the day of the transfiguration, he witnesses with his very eyes the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. Peter wanted to capture the moment by erecting three tents: one for Jesus, one for Moses, and one for Elijah. It is obvious to us all that Peter did not want this experience to go away! Mark the Evangelist also recounts that the Father's voice can be heard, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." The three disciples had listened to the dictates of the Law and the promptings of the prophets, now they must listen to the wisdom of God's beloved – Jesus of Nazareth.

The Transfiguration is an important event in salvation history. It reminds the Church of the true identity of Jesus, both human and divine. We are called to the Truth of Jesus through listening to his Word and being doers of his Word. We are urged to "Listen to him." In every aspect of life and in all of our relationships whether they are familial, social, or political, we are asked to listen to the wisdom of Jesus and apply it. During this season of Lent, we should commit ourselves to discerning the truths of the gospel and undergo conversion. Each of us is asked to transform our lives by what we know of God's message. Peter, James and John had a life-changing experience on the day of Transfiguration. Jesus' appearance was altered that day as the apostles witnessed his glory. But the faith of these simple men

must have been transformed as well. The words of the gospel are the words of everlasting life. If we listen to these words, take them to heart, and act upon them, we open ourselves to this promise of salvation. Sometimes the gospel requires that we alter the way in which we conduct our lives and choose the road less traveled. Reflecting on the Sunday Readings with Fr. John J. Ludden, Pastor

As we go through life we experience the highs and the lows in our relationship with God. There are times

when we have profound experiences and we are convinced of God's presence. During these times, most of us wish we could dwell in that moment forever. Many of us have times when we doubt our faith and sometimes feel we are totally alone. During these moments of doubt, we need to recall the moments in which we were totally convinced of the presence of God. The gospel reminds us elsewhere that we are not left alone as orphans. Jesus tells us that he will be with us until the end of the age. The experiences of transcendence within our lives make up our own particular histories — they bring us to the sacrament of the present moment.

Life has a habit of teaching us the truths about God. The Church in Her wisdom gives us the liturgical seasons in which we experience life, death and resurrection. All of us have to experience death in order to come to resurrection. The different events of life can bring us to a deeper reality of God's presence. Our lives change when we encounter forgiveness and healing. We all become aware of the other side of life when we encounter the death of a loved one. When parents experience the newness of life, they encounter the God of Creation and the innocence of humanity. When we witness great acts of charity and heroism we are made aware that we belong to a larger family of the world and recognized that we are People of God. These experiences transform us and remind us that God is forever with us working through, in and with us.

#### Prayer

We pray: Lord, it is good that we are here! We thank you for the gift of life! We bless you and praise you for the message of the gospel handed on to us. Let us always remind ourselves in the profound moments of life that you are always journeying with us. When we lose hope, may we have the courage to listen to the voice of your Son, who never abandons us. Amen.

#### Teach Children to Balance Lent

Teaching children to give something up during Lent builds a valuable, lifelong penitential habit. But we can become so focused on this Lenten sacrifice that we neglect the other two pillars of Lent: prayer and almsgiving. All three are necessary to experience the blessings of a fruitful Lent. Try these ideas to teach the other two:

**Prayer:** Demonstrating different methods of prayer during Lent offers children options for putting together their own personal prayer routines. For example, try a gratitude journal. At dinnertime or bedtime, take turns writing a line or two in a notebook that talks about how God blessed each of you that day. Or demonstrate P-R-A-Y time. At least once a day, gather together and Praise God for his goodnesss, Repent of the times you failed to love him or each other, Ask for what you need, Yield to God's will. Of course, commit to attending Mass -- the ultimate prayer -on the weekends as a family. Almsgiving: God wants us to share our gifts, not hoard them. As a family, can you spare a night to work at a shelter or soup kitchen? Look in on a lonely neighbor? Mother Teresa said, "never worry about numbers. Help one person at a time and always start with the person nearest you." Why not start the habit during Lent?
