# Life Matters



Thanks to Fr. John and all who came out to pray this past Monday. St. John was well represented to the world as people who believe in the sacredness and dignity of all human life.

But do we only pray for the innocent and vulnerable? Not at all. Which of us is blameless over our lifetime? This week we also prayed for Paul Howell who was scheduled to be executed in Stark, FL on Tuesday, February 26. Howell was convicted of killing a Florida State Trooper. No amount of prayer can replace the trooper who was killed. But as Christians we are moved to pray for the trooper, his family and the one who took his life.

The bigger question at hand is whether the state should be involved in the sanctioned killing of another human



being. As stated in a letter from the Florida Catholic bishops, execution does not benefit the common good; the prisoner is already locked away from the public. Does it provide "closure" to the victim's family? Is it possible the arrest, conviction and incarceration of the man who committed this awful deed are closure enough? The desire for his death is nothing more than vengeance, which belongs only to God.

When we put prisoners to death, we are judging whether a particular person is worthy to share the planet with the rest of us. How is that different from taking a life in the womb, because the mother doesn't think the child should live? How is that different from taking the life of person in a "persistent vegetative state" because her continuing care is costly or interferes with a spouse having his own life? How is that different from the government's proposed "death panels" which could decide who can benefit from medical treatment and who should be left to die? I watched the powerful movie "Schindler's List" recently. How is putting a prisoner to death different from the Nazis deciding who is worthy to share the planet with the rest of us and who should die?

Whether Mr. Howell was executed last Tuesday or not, we need to pray for his soul and pray for his victims.

Please join Fr. John on Tuesday, March 12 in prayer for an end to abortion outside Planned Parenthood in Naples. This is the last designated St. John prayer opportunity during the 40 Days for Life campaign. However, parishioners may pray outside Planned Parenthood for the end of abortion at any time.



Happy 25th Anniversary! Did you know that the first Mass celebrated at St. John the Evangelist took place on Saturday, February 27, 1988, at 4:30 p.m. in the cafeteria next door at Naples Park Elementary? the cafeteria. We have come a long way in 25 short years and St. John the Evangelist has developed into an amazing parish with even more amazing parishioners.

is reminded the ground on which he stands is holy ground. He is called to reverence the Lord by leading the Israelites out of their slavery. From this moment on, God is to be remembered for his faithfulness to all the generations by inspiring Moses to take on this heroic and faith-filled deed.

We find ourselves today, a few thousand years later, remembering the faithfulness of God who continues to reveal His saving power in our lives. God constantly comes to us through the events and people that make up our own individual story. The ground on which we stand is very much the holy ground of God's constancy. It is through each individual's history that God can be glorified or rejected. God's spirit breathes where it wills, inspiring people from all walks of life to turn to Him. God is totally present to us even though we may do things that are contrary to His will. God loves the sinner as much as the Saints that have experienced this life too. To know this in our hearts is truly a blessing and a moment of grace. Today's gospel is very much a gospel of second

chances. The parable that Jesus uses tells us that God's work of redemption is never finished. The gardener tells the owner of the orchard to give him another year to cultivate the barren tree so that it may bear fruit in the future. And so it is with us. Jesus constantly brings us to the fertile ground of his love and forgiveness in order that we bear the fruits of his kingdom. We are constantly being brought to the threshold of redemption and transformation when we open our lives to the Lord's forgiveness.

The fig tree struggles to bear fruit It depends on the handiwork Of the one who cares to love And the one who dares to hope





When terrible things happen, we always ask why. If a neighbor suffers a housebreak, we'd like to think it was because of something they did wrong — left a side door unlocked, maybe, or let the mail stack up while they vacationed. As long as misfortune is the result of some specific cause, we think we can avoid it. But sooner or later, we're all faced with some random tragedy — someone's child falls gravely ill, a freak accident claims a friend, a school shooting leaves us speechless and stunned.

Jesus warns us off from trying to find facile rationalizations for such events. We aren't being punished for our sins when disaster strikes, and we aren't being rewarded for our faithfulness when we escape the sadness that engulfs others. Sometimes, there simply is no human explanation.

Our faith urges us not to condemn ourselves or others beset by tragedy; neither should we congratulate ourselves when things are going well. Whatever our circumstances, we are called to muddle through as best we can, producing the "good fruit" of faith and faithful action.

Jesus sets out on his way to Jerusalem after the transfiguration. For 10 chapters, from 9.51 to 19.28, Luke's Gospel follows Jesus on this journey, his exodus or going forth. His disciples follow him then; we follow Jesus now, this Lent.

Jesus teaches many parables to his disciples on their journey together. This Sunday Jesus tells about a fig tree. In Jesus' country a fig tree is as common as an apple tree to us. Many people grew fig trees and looked forward to eating the figs. How many here like Fig Newton cookies? The cookies are made with figs.

The fig tree in Jesus' parable isn't producing figs. What to do? Cut it down, or give the tree another chance, more manure, more care? Jesus wants us to see God is like the gardener who wants to care for the tree and give us another chance. This Gospel calls us to turn toward God and be fruitful by showing love for one another.
