St. Patrick's Day 2012 Sermon by Bill Smart

Good morning everyone and Happy St. Patrick's Day. My name is Bill Smart and I am a member of St. John's St. Vincent De Paul Conference.

It has been the tradition of St. John's that the collection taken up at this Mass is for the benefit of our work. In appreciation we invite you to a continental breakfast and entertainment by our talented musicians in the PLC ballroom after Mass. But the doors don't open until the last hymn is sung and the priest leaves the altar.

Not long ago I heard a sermon by a priest who was a member of the Trinitarian Congregation. He said that his Congregation was founded in the 12th century. The sole purpose at the time was to ransom rescued Christians who were in the hands of unbelievers and left behind after the Crusades. The Trinitarians would go to foreign lands, pay a ransom and bring the people home to their families and loved ones. Father asked that we imagine the joy felt by these people who thought they were abandoned and would never see home again. Now we are in the 21st century and people are still being ransomed. No, it is not as dramatic as ransoming a Crusader in a foreign land. But SVDP members go into homes right here in

as ransoming a Crusader in a foreign land. But SVDP members go into homes right here in Naples - zip codes 108,109,110 and sometimes Immokalee.

Knocking on doors we are greeted with an eviction notice that the family has three days to

pack up and get out — we ransom them from the landlord by helping to pay the rent.

Other doors open and people are sitting in the dark — their electricity cut off for lack of

We walk into other homes where people are sleeping on floors and the refrigerator is empty. We ransom them by sending them to our thrift shops for furniture and our pantry for food. (The furniture in our shops and the food in our pantry have all been donated by you.)

Other homes have grown men sitting around with nothing to do. "Why aren't you working?" "We have a car, but no money for gas." We ransom them by supplying gasoline vouchers.

So that is our story. It is also your story. Without your support — no ransom would be paid. So when the collection is taken up by members of SVDP or you pass the poor boxes in church, say a prayer that your donation will help ransom someone.

Why do we do this? Because Jesus demands it. It is part of our identity as Catholics and people of faith.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Wow, what a weekend! This past Easter weekend was filled with everything you may have wanted and more. The weather was absolutely perfect with clear skies and temperatures warming into the low 80s. I mention this because some of our parishioners actually sat outside in the courtyard due to space

restraints in the church and PLC. For those inside the church, the AC units had to work overtime to keep all of the tightly packed parishioners from overheating. Fr. John tells me that the 8:00 p.m. Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday was absolutely full. On Sunday, the action started promptly at 7:00 a.m. with roughly 1,500 in attendance. The 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Masses in the church were completely standing room only (inside and out) and one can only "guestimate" the total number in attendance. The 9:15 and 11:15 a.m. overflow Masses in the PLC were also standing room only. It is estimated that in excess of 10,000 attended Mass over the weekend. Traffic was backed up on 111th Avenue North all the way to US 41 and then eastward to the entrance of the Post Office. Although it was overly crowded, we are hopeful that you had a very spiritual experience here at St. John the Evangelist.

Have you ever attended the Easter Vigil Mass at St. John the Evangelist? Celebrated on the Saturday evening before Easter, this Mass is the true beginning of the Easter celebration. Although quite lengthy (just over 2 1/2 hours), it is the most beautiful of all Masses celebrated throughout the year. Deep-seated in Catholic tradition, the Easter Vigil Mass begins in total darkness with a large fire burning at the entrance of the church. The church is in total darkness as the celebrant leads a procession to the front of the narthex. As the procession heads into the sanctuary, the flame is passed from the Pascal candle to all those in attendance creating a beautiful site in the sanctuary with the only visible light coming from the nearly 1,200 candles. Present on the altar this year was Fr. John, Fr. Len, Fr. Kelly, Deacon Frank Paniccia, seminarians Peter Vale and Michael Scaramuzzo and our lone altar server, Emily Anton. In addition, Tom Oram provided outstanding music accompanied by our choir and a quintet from the Naples Philharmonic. The Vigil Mass serves as the platform for which to welcome our new RCIA candidates and catechumens into the church. This year we had three individuals receiving the sacrament of Baptism and another six receiving their Confirmation. If you feel capable of sitting through a two plus hour Mass, I strongly encourage you to attend this incredibly beautiful Mass next spring.



Soaking in abundant sunshine and low humidity, nearly 500 children and adults showed up to gather as many eggs as possible before heading back to the ballroom in the PLC for pizza and ice cream. So well organized was this event that I received numerous phone calls and emails expressing thanks to the Men's Club. On behalf of everyone here at St. John the Evangelist, many thanks to the Men's Club for hosting another exceptionally well organized event to benefit the children of our parish. And if they weren't tired out from the Easter egg hunt, the Men's Club will also host Parish Appreciation Day this Sunday.

We have finally loaded all of the email addresses into our new database and will begin using this new tool next week. We will use your email addresses to inform our parishioners of upcoming events, pertinent information and to distribute what we hope will be at least a quarterly newsletter. I would kindly ask that if you receive the initial email from St. John the Evangelist and have since decided that you do not wish to be on our distribution list, please DO NOT mark the email as SPAM. Instead, simply send me an email (scotts@saintjohntheevangelist.com) asking to be removed. If you have yet to submit your email address and wish to be included, please send me an email and I will add you to the list. Your email address will be used exclusively for parish correspondence and not shared with anyone else. In addition, your email address will not appear as a CC on any of the parish email blasts.

Did you attend the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday? Many did and we received numerous complaints due to the fact that there was only one cross for adoration. Those in attendance know that this took an extremely long time. The new translation of the Roman Missal **explicitly states** that only **one** cross is to be used for adoration (formerly termed veneration.) Obviously, this directive is a universal directive of the Church and was not something created by the parish or the Diocese. The rubric suggests if many people are in attendance that the celebrant along with his ministers only venerate the cross. Those who were involved in the preparation of the Liturgy of The Lord's Passion thought such an action would take away a treasured practice.





Unlocking the Doors of Fear (John 20:19-31)

t is hard to imagine what must have been going through the disciples' minds after the death of Jesus and the discovery of the empty tomb. All we know is that the disciples had returned to a house after they witnessed the empty tomb and locked the doors. Their fear was legitimate. Any association with Jesus could have brought destruction upon themselves. To fear for one's life is a powerful and crippling emotion. The followers of Christ were trapped and uncertain about what the future held for them. In the midst of this, Jesus becomes present to them and

offers his gift of peace. Jesus words, "Peace be with you," spoke to their fears and offered them hope. At last they knew that Jesus' words had been fulfilled and their leaving everything to follow him was not in vain. As he showed them his hands and his side, they must have been overwhelmingly aware that they were part of a divine drama that was continually unfolding. Jesus carries the authority to forgive sins along with his great imparting of peace. Thomas, the practical man, cannot believe without seeing this reality for himself. He sees a week later and believes as he affirms, "My Lord and my God!"


- 1. What motivated the disciples to lock themselves away after seeing the empty tomb?
- 2. What does Jesus offer his disciples?
- 3. How does Jesus respond to the doubts in the mind of Thomas?
- 4. How does Thomas' example speak to you?
- 5. What are the fears in your life that hold you captive?
- 6. Do you ever doubt God? If so, in what ways?
- 7. Where do you need to experience Christ's peace in your life right now?

When Christ appeared after his resurrection, he appeared as a wounded healer. He unlocks the doors of fear and disbelief in the fragile faith of his disciples. Those men and women were blessed to catch a glimpse of the wounds that carried with them salvation. Those wounds bore witness to the sin of the world – they also revealed God's glory and our hope. After Jesus' death comes resurrection and the ongoing reality of his presence as he imparts authority upon the disciples. We might well say that the early witnesses of the resurrection certainly had it easy. Afterall, they had seen

the realities of the resurrection with their very eyes.

For them, especially Thomas, belief flowed from their eyewitness account. However, the reality was that their lives did not become easy after they had witnessed resurrection. The early Church experienced fear when Jesus ascended to the Father and when the Church became persecuted. To be a follower of Christ meant the disciple had to confront the fear of being rejected. Their proclamation of the risen Christ ultimately led them to imprisonment and death. Such martyrdom became, as the early Church father, Tertullian, wrote, "The seed of the Church"

Jesus affirms the future generation of disciples by saying: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." The very fact that we believe today is a divine blessing. Sometimes it is hard to believe when we experience the pain of separation and loss. It takes a great leap of faith to have belief when we cannot see the reality of resurrection with the naked eye. However, it is within the gift of faith that we find true peace — a peace that the world cannot give. The only way that we can experience peace after we lose someone we love is by having the hope and security that God offers in the gift of resurrection and eternal life. Our faith enables us to face our fears and know that no matter what, God continues to journey with us.
