





Focusing on Friendship and Pope Francis

Last Sunday, April 14, over 200 people attended the last Families in Christ session of the year.

During the first talk, Bill Maguire, Director of Youth Ministry, identified a main theme of last Sunday's Gospel: friendship with Jesus. The lesson focused on the second half of the Gospel, where Jesus encounters his best friend Peter and asks him three times if Peter loves him. Each time Peter answers, "Yes, Lord, I love you," to which Jesus responds: "feed my lambs," "tend my sheep," "feed my sheep." The children identified several characteristics of a true friend: loyalty, love, forgiveness, being a good example, offering good advice, and even playing video games. The children discussed, however, that sometimes friends let us down and how this deeply hurts our feelings — and how sometimes, sadly, we are the ones who betray our friends. We talked about how we are relieved when our friends forgive us, but also, how we look for opportunities to make up for the wrongs we have done and how we want to repair our friendships.

This is exactly what Jesus does for Peter! Peter betrayed his friend Jesus by denying him three times. Jesus, by asking Peter if he


MONTH 1 - "My heart is beating!"

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.



loves him three times, gives Peter the opportunity to make up for his sins. We also discovered that to be a good friend we must love and respect what our friends care about most. In the Gospel, we find that Jesus loves his bride, the Church, and that to love Jesus, it is necessary to love his Church. As Catholics, being a good friend to Jesus means having a devotion and love for the pope, for Peter and his successors. One important way to express our love for the pope is to pray for him every day. During the breakout session, after the first talk, the children were given a picture of the pope and Popsicle sticks to make a picture frame. In addition, the children pasted the Morning Offering of the Apostleship of Prayer on the back of the picture, which includes prayers for the monthly intentions of the Holy Father.

The second talk was given by Matt Loboda. Matt spoke about the election of our new pope and why he chose the name Francis. He gave a brief, but dynamic, presentation of St. Francis' life and the main message he preached: God is Love and God created each and every one of us to love and be loved. Matt showed the children that our new pope chose the name Francis, because he wants the Church to live this message of love and to spread this message by loving our neighbor more and more each day. He concluded his talk with a special invitation and challenge to the parents: invite families in our parish over for dinner to experience Christian fellowship. Matt explained how practicing hospitality and opening one's home expands our hearts, strengthens friendships and gives us an authentic experience of Christian fellowship and community. All of which, build us up in Christian charity and the practice of our faith.

It is hard to believe that this year has flown by so quickly. A huge thank you goes out to all the adult volunteers who were a part of the planning team, who worked so hard to make Families in Christ a dynamic event in the spirit of the New Evangelization. And a special thank you to Matt Loboda, who has played such an integral role in the success of this family outreach over the past several years. As you may know, Matt and his family will be moving to Tampa in June to be closer to their extended family. Our parish community wishes Matt and his family all God's blessings as they embark on this new and exciting venture!

Pocket Change Weekend: Why We Have It

This weekend volunteers will be at the doors of our church collecting Pocket Change that will be spent on housing for a deserving family in Jamaica. Our motto is "making a difference" and the pictures of the Wilson family that accompany this article show how your donations are put to work in a meaningful way.

The "Pocket Change for Housing" program was started a few years ago here at St. John the Evangelist. Simply put, we appeal to you twice a year to help fund the construction of homes for the poorest of the poor in Jamaica. Many families there live in shacks and shanties, and frankly our efforts barely make a dent in the need for decent housing. However, since we started asking for pocket change we have been able to build over 100 houses that have changed the lives of more than 100 families. For the first time in their lives these families have a solid roof over their heads and a locked door to protect them through the night. For once

in their lives a significant change assures them that *people they will never meet* care about them enough to make a dramatic difference in their daily lives. Quite honestly, it is a joy to play a part in something like that, whether you are a JOP volunteer or a JOP donor.

If you have been saving change to give this weekend, there are volunteers at each of the church doors to collect your pocket change before and after Mass. If you have forgotten about the campaign, it's not too late to participate. Just toss the loose change jingling in your pockets into our buckets. Every coin counts. And by the way, we do accept checks and bills of all denominations in the pocket change buckets. Thank you in the name of the poor and dispossessed in Jamaica, and, remember, whatever we do in Jamaica is done in His name and yours.

development and look forward to the convenience we will recognize as a result.





The Call of the Shepherd

oday is traditionally known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." We are asked to consider the importance of vocations as we reflect on the scriptures proclaimed to us. The first line of the gospel points out that the shepherd calls and the sheep hear his voice and follow that call. During the Season of Easter, we hear many accounts from Acts of the Apostles and the gospels about how the early Church was born. We are informed of how this was a time of uncertainty and fear. The Risen Jesus appears in the midst of these fears and gives his apostles and disciples a renewed sense of purpose. The presence of the Risen Lord gives the disciples something to live for once more. The crucifixion kills the dreams of the apostles – the resurrection gives birth to new dreams. We hear in our first reading how the first disciples met great opposition against the message they preached and faced persecution themselves. Nonetheless, they responded to Jesus call by living the dream that God once again instilled within them.

We are asked to respond to the very same call. The concept of vocation is very important to us as Catholics. A vocation is a way of life that we are all called to – it is gifted to us by God. The vocation of marriage shares in the creative plan that God has for the world. It calls be to mutual and lasting love and from it flows the gift of children (God's blessing to the world). The family as an institution is very

much under attack by the free thinkers of the world who sometimes hold that anything goes. Today, we offer prayers and blessings for all those who have embraced such a vocation and have followed this call by committing to family life. This is a concrete way of heeding the voice of the Shepherd in today's domestic Church.

During this week we are specifically invited to focus on the vocation to the priesthood and the religious life. As we see a decline in the number of candidates for the priesthood and religious life, we have to seriously ask ourselves if we are truly doing enough to promote the future growth of ministry in the Church. The priesthood plays a vital role during the celebration of the mass – if we have no priest, we have no Eucharist. We as a parish and as individuals are all asked to promote the dignity of the priesthood among the young people who will forever be the present and future life of the Church. The shepherd never leaves his flock abandoned. We must do all that we can to encourage our young people to respond to such a noble vocation. We have to encourage our youth to listen to the voice of the Shepherd. As members of the baptized faithful, each one of us have to show the significance of dedicating one's life to the economy of salvation, not just the economic world. The same must be said of the vocation to the religious life. Throughout history, countless men and women yow to live in community and cast away all the distractions of life in order to serve God and His people. Many religious have given their life to teaching, promoting ministry, and healing the sick. We are also encouraged this week to reveal the dignity of the lay apostolate and encourage people to dedicate their lives to the lay ministry of the Church. All of these different vocations are expressions of following the call of the Good Shepherd.

We have a lot of cultural expressions for the malleability of sheep. People who don't think for themselves are "sheep." Those who fail to question the actions of their leaders "follow like sheep."

In several of his parables, Jesus suggests that we are the sheep to his Good Shepherd. In today's Gospel, he tells us that his sheep know his voice and follow him. Our own lives too often bear evidence that this is not the case.

Few of us have the brilliance or the daring to truly break away from the flock. If we're destined to behave like sheep, which shepherd are we following? Do we even raise our heads far enough to answer that question or do we just imitate the behavior of those around us, imagining that someone, somewhere, must know what they're doing?

Easter reminds us that we follow Jesus, and it reminds us why. Unlike our friends and neighbors, relatives and coworkers, civic and cultural leaders, Jesus really does know the way. Our job is to learn to recognize his voice, and to follow it when we do—even if it takes away from the flock.


