Life Matters



As promised, the final numbers from 40 Days for Life are in! In an email from Shawn Carney, national coordinator of 40 Days for Life, comes the following message: "554 babies spared from abortion through God's mercy these past 40 days! Those are 554 stories of children – made in God's image and likeness – who were so close to becoming another statistic. But because of your prayers and your courage to be there for their moms, they have life."

Thank you to all of our local participants.

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday! Pope John Paul II once referred to this feast as God's Easter gift to the world. Indeed, this is the most hopeful feast, placed so perfectly right after Easter because all of us are such sinners! We were reminded of our sinfulness last week on Good Friday. But Jesus is risen — and so will we be. But then, Jesus didn't share all my sins. Today we are reminded of His infinite mercy and His desire to forgive all of our sins, no matter how big or how heinous. So what, you ask, does that have to do with life? Everything, of course. We are reminded that each and every life is sacred, because Jesus died for that life and is willing to forgive any and all sins we commit along the way. Each one of us is precious to Him. When we prayed the Divine Mercy Novena last week, we prayed for EVERYONE; sinners, priests and religious, the devout, the nonbelievers, the ex-believers, the meek and humble and little children, the glorifiers, the souls in purgatory and the lukewarm souls — all are recommended to the unfathomable mercy of God's love.

This prayer is also important at the end of life. From St. Faustina's Diary, Our Lord tells St. Faustina to "Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you... Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death...When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the Just Judge but as the Merciful Savior."

Today's article is dedicated to the memory of Bob Judy, aka the Divine Mercy Elf, who was instrumental in helping spread this devotion through our parish.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:15 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.



St. Joseph Mass and Feast

About 200 guests were in attendance at this year's St. Joseph Day Mass and Feast March 22 at St. John the Evangelist, sponsored by Council #11281 Knights of Columbus. As the patron of workers and the protector of the family, St. Joseph is honored with a feast each March 19. St. Joseph is one of the most beloved saints among Italian-Americans.

According to legend, there was a famine in Sicily many centuries ago. The villagers prayed to St. Joseph, fosterfather of the Infant Savior, and asked his intercession before the throne of God. Their prayers were answered. With the ending of the dreadful famine, a special feast of thanksgiving was held in commemoration of this Saint. This celebration became tradition. Wealthy families prepared huge buffets and invited the less fortunate people of the village, especially the homeless and sick.

Our Mass was celebrated by the Pastor of St. Martha's Church in Sarasota, the Very Rev. Fausto Stampiglia, and our Pastor the Very Rev. Fr. John Ludden. Fr. Fausto's homily added a light, but memorable, account of St. Joseph's kindness and love for his wife Mary and son Jesus. Fr. John sang Joseph's song at the Mass, which concluded with the Knights of Columbus members dressed in Carpenters Aprons, carrying the St. Joseph statue from the church to the PLC ballroom. The procession was filled with song as they

marched by the many parishioners and guests in attendance. Upon entering the PLC, Fathers Stampiglia and John, along with Deacons Rob and Frank, blessed the St. Joseph's Altar Table. The table had been beautifully arranged with donated breads, fruits, vegetables, wines and many artifacts reflecting St. Joseph as a carpenter. Donations were made to the Altar Table to help the needy, in keeping with the tradition of the St. Joseph feast.

Grand Knight Paul Barrus and Fr. John presented Fr. Fausto with a gift and a plaque, which gave thanks for his Priestly Ministry and for his continued celebration of the St. Joseph Feast at St. John. In 2010, Fr. Fausto was awarded the Papal Medal of Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice at a Mass honoring Our Lady Queen of Palestine. The Holy Cross Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice is an award of the Roman Catholic Church. It means "for church and Pope" and is also known as the Cross of Honor.

The evening was festive with the great food, prepared to follow the tradition of St. Joseph feasts, and with the dance floor full all night. The fish meal was a grouper served with bread crumbs, representing sawdust for St. Joseph the carpenter.

Wow, what a weekend! This past Easter weekend was filled with everything you may have wanted and more. The weather was absolutely perfect with clear skies and temperatures warming into the low 80s. For those who managed to find a seat inside the church and PLC, the AC units had to work overtime to keep all of the tightly packed parishioners from

overheating. Fr. John tells me that the 8:00 p.mm Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday was absolutely full. On Sunday, the action started promptly at 7:00 a.m. with roughly 1,500 in attendance. The 9:00 and 11:15 a.m. Masses in the church were completely standing room only (inside and out) and one can only "guestimate" the total number in attendance. The 9:15 and 11:15 am overflow Masses in the PLC were also standing room only. It is estimated that in excess of 10,000 attended Mass over the weekend. Traffic was backed up on 111th Avenue North all the way to US 41 and then eastward to the entrance of the Post Office. Although it was overly crowded, we are hopeful that you had a very spiritual experience here at St. John the Evangelist.

The Men's Club hosted their 7th annual Easter egg hunt on Holy Saturday. Soaking in abundant sunshine and low humidity, over 400 children and adults showed up to gather as many eggs as possible before heading back to the ballroom in the PLC for pizza and ice cream. So well organized was this event that I received numerous phone calls and emails expressing thanks to the Men's Club. On behalf of everyone here at St. John the Evangelist, many thanks to the Men's Club

for hosting another exceptionally well organized event to benefit the children of our parish. These men and their wives certainly deserve a nice break after hosting countless events this season! (See photos on page one of this bulletin.)

As promised, the late season cool weather allowed the Tabebuia Tree to retain its bloom which was at peak for Easter Masses. Please see the picture on the right of one of our trees located in the Paniccia Prayer Garden. It is truly spectacular!

If you were at St. John the Evangelist during Holy Week, you most likely witnessed some major developments taking place on campus. Most of you noticed that there was a very large crane parked outside the Parish Life Center. We replaced three of the fourteen AC units on the roof of the PLC. This is part of a program that will continue until all of the fourteen old units are replaced. The PLC is now 16 years old and the AC units have recognized their useful life. We replaced one last year and two are used only periodically and in good condition,

leaving eight more to be replaced. While the replacement of these units is important news, our new control system is the really exciting news. We have contracted with Johnson Controls to install a "Metasys" control system which will ultimately oversee the controls of all mechanicals on the campus in the near future. Metasys is now installed and we are able to control the new PLC AC units from any computer. On Easter Monday, we performed a "direct underground bore" from the PLC to the church and installed fiber optic cable which will connect the two buildings. Believe it or not, until now, there was no connectivity and no internet access in the church. No longer will the church be isolated. This is a major development as we can now proceed with many items on our long range wish list. The "relatively" new AC units in the church will now be retrofit with controls allowing us to also operate these units on the Metasys system. The new lighting system will also be tied into the system as well as the sound system, security and fire systems. We will be able to control the parking lot lights with a module that recognizes the time of year, turning the lights on and off as dictated by the amount of ambient light present. In addition, this new high speed connectivity will allow us to provide live streaming of Masses in the near future. We are very excited about the new opportunities that await us as we move forward. These technological advances will not only make it easier to control and monitor our campus; they will also save us substantial dollars in the future.

Have you purchased your ticket for the Reverse Raffle to (hopefully) be held on Friday, April 19th? I would bet that the answer from the majority would be a resounding "NO."



An Eternal Peace

he disciples must have experienced uncertainty after the resurrection. An empty tomb, visions of angels and several appearances make up the great collage of this life-changing event at the hand of the Author of Life! Today, we come across a group of people who have gathered together in the security of their own company because they were now living in fear. Jesus appears in the midst of their fears and offers them the great gift of peace – "Peace be with you." Jesus offers us this same gift today as we live in the uncertainties of war and terrorism. The peace that Jesus gives is quite different from that which the world gives. World peace is fragile and can be undermined by governments, dictatorships, and even by the hand of one person who seeks to destroy the sanctity of life. The peace that Jesus gives is constant, hope-filled and eternal. Jesus' peace cannot be taken from us because it ends in eternal life.


The gospel proclaimed today tells the story about the original disciples who were transformed when they experienced the risen Lord. Thomas was not there at first and remains

skeptical until he sees the wounds in Jesus' hands and feet. Once he sees, he believes and gifts the Church with that great affirmation of faith in Jesus, "My Lord and my God." Through the gift of the Spirit breathed upon them by Jesus, the first disciples begin again with a sense of renewed energy and strength – to have the courage to forgive sins and continue the great work

of salvation begun in Jesus himself. In the Acts of the Apostles, Luke tells us that the ministry of Jesus continues through the life of Peter

and the other Apostles.

This renewal of the early Christian community is good news for us today. We, like the first disciples, have been given the promise of the Paraclete – the Holy Spirit which inspires us to follow the example of Jesus by bringing healing and peace to the world. The ministry of Jesus and the early Church is now handed onto us so that others can be brought to God through our efforts as a baptized people. The divine mercy of Jesus was handed onto the early disciples and is now entrusted to the Church today. We are called to participate in the same mercy and love that Jesus bestowed upon the broken all those years ago.

As a parent, I've seen chocolate-chip covered faces swear they don't know what happened to the cookies and crayon-covered walls apparently decorated by a thief in the night. While we chide Thomas for his lack of belief, it is a good time to examine our own.


