SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

We received a bit of a reprieve this past week with much cooler than normal weather as we head into the doldrums of summer. A late season cool front passed through Southwest Florida on Monday resulting in high temperatures in the upper 70s and low 80s with overnight

lows in the lower 60s. Take advantage of this spectacular weather as we all know what is waiting for us the next five months.

As I walk prospective clients through the Memorial Garden, the strangely placed fire hydrant in section 22 is always the subject of numerous jokes. The fact that dogs might visit this location and relieve themselves is the butt of many of these jokes. I am very pleased to announce that in the next few weeks this hydrant will be moved to the exterior of the

Memorial Garden. I met with the Chief of the North Naples Fire Department last month to discuss moving the hydrant. His initial response was "why did they put it here in the first place? It would make a lot more sense to place it outside of the garden." After receiving his approval, we contracted with a civil engineer who amended our Site Development Plan which was surprisingly passed through Collier County in only three weeks. We have now contracted with an underground utility company to move the hydrant. Thankfully, this underground work will not disturb any cremains which are currently interred in the Memorial Garden. If you are interested in purchasing a plot in this section, it is now available and is in a highly desirable location.



Ascending Hope

few years ago the conference of Catholic Bishops decided to transfer the feast of the Ascension to the following Sunday so that all Catholics would appreciate the importance of this event. The Ascension is very important in the history of salvation because hidden within its reality is the very gift of our

destiny and salvation. Once Jesus had accomplished his ministry and won victory over death, then he returns to heaven to take his place with the Father. Such a sight must have been so life-changing. Although the first disciples saw Jesus vanish from their sight, they also saw the glory and divinity that

truly belonged to him. Jesus was not simply a holy man with a divine message. Jesus was also divine with a human message that continues to transform the world.

Before Jesus ascends to heaven the disciples asked, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom of Israel?" Jesus tells the group of believers that it is not for them to know the time or season but to discern how restoration will take place through the gift of the Holy Spirit. To put it in a very human way, the disciples are asked with God's help of the Spirit to figure it out for themselves.

Years later, even though we have not experienced Jesus in his public ministry, we have a mystical experience of Jesus Christ. The Church constantly challenges us to recognize Jesus in the guise of the poor, the broken and the



disadvantaged. Every time we gather for the Holy Eucharist we are reminded that Jesus is present in the people gathered in prayer, in the Sacred Word and in the real presence of the breaking of the bread. The priest is called to act in persona Christi – his transparency should ultimately allow Christ to speak and act through him. At the end of the mass were are called to take Christ to the world and to proclaim the same Jesus who vanished from the disciples' sight on the day of the ascension. We are invited to figure out what it means to experience the kingdom already, but not yet. The fullness of

God will be revealed to us at the end of time. However, we have to discern the will of God in our everyday activities. We only have to look at the way we relate to ourselves, others, and God to see how we integrate such wisdom. God continually calls people of every time, language, and way of life to share in the reality of his love.

It may well seem that we are the unfortunate ones who believe without seeing the events that gave us our salvation in Christ. However, we are reminded that we are blessed for having not seen but yet believing in his message. To trust and believe in God requires a huge leap of faith – it sometimes means that we step out into the unknown in order for Christ to make himself known to us. If we trust the Word to be the Truth, then we rise with Christ in the resurrection, our hope ascends as He ascended, and our joy will be complete!

When my father died, I worked through the grief that always accompanies the death of a loved one. But for months I couldn't shake a sense of lostness. Who would I call when I couldn't patch the rickety old fuse box? Who would tell me not to drive that old heap till I got the brakes looked at? Who would listen to my hare-brained efforts to stretch a budget and say, "How about I lend you a few bucks to tide you over?"

We get so used to relying on certain people for direction that we think we'll drift aimlessly without them. But my father wasn't just telling me what to do all those years, he was helping me learn to think, showing me how to act. It wasn't until he was gone that I realized he'd taught me everything I needed to know.

Jesus' disciples must have come to that same realization after watching their mentor—their Lord—disappear from view. "You are witnesses," Jesus reminds them. We have all seen what we needed to see, heard what we needed to hear, to spread the Good News in our own way. As long as we remember what we've been taught, we'll never be lost.
