
A Prayer for World Peace

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom

By remaining faithful in Christ, we find our purpose and ability to bear fruit, thereby glorifying God and receiving his blessings.

Hard as a rock, Cold as ice, Sharp as a knife. Some analogies are so clear that they need no explanation. They are down-to-earth examples that are easily understood by anyone.

Jesus used analogies when he taught: yeast in dough, a mustard seed grown into a great bush, a shepherd finding a lost sheep, etc. Jesus wanted those listening to be able to understand his teachings, so he used analogies.

In today's Gospel, he speaks of the life-giving connection between the vine and the branches. Anyone who has seen a vine, tree or bush can clearly understand what Jesus is saying. And yet, Jesus' rich analogy of the vine and the branches is an opportunity for us today to dig deeper into this parable and unfold the deeper meaning and implications for our spiritual life.

I am the vine. My Father is the vine grower. This sets up an understanding of the relationships between the Father, the Son and us. Everything belongs to God. The Son is selected to grow and produce for the Father.

I am the vine. You are the branches. If we want to belong to God, we have to be attached to Christ. Attachment means that we allow the life of Christ to flow into us through prayer and frequent reception of the sacraments


Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit. The purpose of our connection to Christ is clear: we must bear fruit. This means good works, holy acts, kind deeds, etc.

A branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine The only way that we can fulfill our purpose is to stay connected to Christ.

The Father takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit. A branch that does not bear fruit is worthless. The Father will purge every branch that is useless.

You are already pruned because of the word I spoke to you. The purpose, power and importance of the words of Jesus guide us so that we can bear fruit.

If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. Our attachment to Christ is a source of great blessing. The Father will hear us just as he hears his Son, Jesus.



By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciple. We are given a clear understanding of how we honor and glorify God. We attach our lives to his Son and open our hearts to him; we cooperate with God's grace and live according to his teaching.

As we prepare to receive the Eucharist, we can hear the words of Jesus to remain in him. By partaking in the sacrament, we receive his body and blood, and by so doing we remain in him and he remains in us in a very real, intimate and personal manner. Let us reflect on this parable as we prepare our hearts and minds to receive him in the Eucharist. Let us then take it beyond this sacred space today. Take the parable into your home and your heart to continue to ponder its richness.

When Saul arrived in Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he was a disciple. Then Barnabas took charge of him and brought him to the apostles, and he reported to them how he had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken out boldly in the name of Jesus. He moved about freely with them in Jerusalem, and spoke out boldly in the name of the Lord. He also spoke and debated with the Hellenists, but they tried to kill him. And when the brothers learned of this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him on his way to Tarsus.
