

Jamaica Outreach Program

The Long Process of Gaining Improved Sight...

From its very beginning the JOP has dedicated many mission trips to the eye clinic on the compound of St. Pius X in Kingston. Those trips are made possible through the service of the lay missionaries who visit there two or three times a year. The journey to improved sight is a long and involved process for those Jamaican patients who are in need of corneal transplant surgeries. This type of surgery is not available in Jamaica and therein lies an untold story about what the JOP does to make a difference in the lives of the people we meet at our clinics. Last summer, while working at the JOP eye clinic in Kingston, Dr. Jeffrey Zimm identified nine patients who would benefit from corneal transplant surgery. Since December, three of those patients have come to Naples and benefited from the transplants performed free of charge by Dr. Zimm. A fourth patient, Alisa age 13, will arrive in Naples this weekend; her surgery is scheduled for May 6. The process for these patients is a long one involving many people who help them along their way to a more perfect sight and a better life.

The following report has been submitted by Dr Zimm's surgery coordinator, Alison Burberry:

When Dr Zimm identifies a patient who would benefit from a corneal transplant, the patient is then put on a priority list based on age and the severity of the problem. The need for a corneal transplant is usually from keratoconus (a corneal dystrophy), or infections causing scarring or trauma. Once the patient has been identified and the JOP has found a donor willing to fund the costs







associated with the transplant, Dr. Zimm writes a letter to support the granting of a non-immigrant visa by the U.S. embassy in Kingston.

The average cost of a transplant is \$4,000 to \$5,000. Corneal tissue is \$3,200 and visa applications, air flights, post-op prescriptions and surgery center fees account for the rest of the cost. In many cases host families are arranged by the JOP for our patients who generally come for a twoweek stay. During that time, a patient is placed with host families for four days each. The hosts provide shelter, sustenance, and transportation for their guests. While in Naples, the patient undergoes a pre-operative exam, the surgery, and several post-operative exams by Dr Zimm.

In our dealings with Jamaicans, we have been impressed with their graciousness, patience, and gratitude. The entire surgical team is also impressed by the dedication of the JOP and its commitment to the eye care mission. We are fortunate to work hand in hand with them.





The Road to Emmaus ~ A Journey Into Belief

n this third Sunday of Easter we hear the story of two of Jesus' disciples walking from Jerusalem to a village called Emmaus. Jesus appears to them and asks them what they are conversing about. The disciples recall how they had placed their hopes in Jesus, only to see him die. They relate that the women of the group reported that they had seen Jesus alive but that they themselves were unable to testify to this fact, having not seen him with their own eyes. The discerning Christian might wonder: Why were these men walking away from Jerusalem if they had been told Jesus was alive? Jesus' response to the two disciples sheds light on the answer to this question. The disciples were walking away because they did not believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. Later, however, their hearts were filled with the words from Jesus' own lips as he revealed the scriptures to them and their eyes were opened in the breaking of the bread.

Each time we gather to celebrate the Eucharist it is like the event in today's gospel. The scriptures are opened for us during the proclamation of the Word and in the breaking of the Bread of Life. The question is: Do we

really believe in what is happening when we celebrate the mass? Our hearts can truly burn within us if we listen to the Word of God with discerning faith and Christ truly becomes present to us in the consecration and in the breaking of the bread. Jesus stunned the disciples two thousand years ago by his presence among them. This same Jesus can profoundly affect us if we open ourselves to him. His words still teach us how to live and the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist continues to be our food for the journey.

The reality of the resurrection can only impact us if we open ourselves to belief. The resurrection brings us transformation and hope. When we look deeply inside ourselves, we can ask God to transform what is dead within us. Resurrection reminds us that our destiny does not lie in death but in eternal life. This knowledge holds us accountable to the message of Jesus. We are challenged to be food for the hungry, friend of the poor, compassion to the sinner, and comfort to the most vulnerable of society. It is through acts such as these

that the risen Christ continues to bless the earth. At the end of the Emmaus story, the disciples returned to Jerusalem because they wanted to give witness to the Risen Jesus to the others who had stayed together. They are greeted with the news that Jesus had revealed himself to Simon, and then they shared their story. Each one of us encounters Jesus in unique ways. We recognize Jesus during the profound moments of our lives. We are challenged by the wisdom of Jesus Christ in the Scriptures and by the nourishment He gives us in the Holy Eucharist. Just like the disciples who returned to Jerusalem, we too are asked to share our experience of the Risen Lord with others

Prayer In the breaking of the bread we know you Lord and we are fed. Instill in our hearts the flame of your love and your truth. Without you, Lord, we are empty vessels – fill us with wisdom and walk with us on the road of life. Amen.



In the house where I grew up, there was a great emphasis on table manners. Sitting up straight, using the correct utensils, and saying "please" and "thank you" were de rigueur. With nine of us around the table, an elbow on the table was not only a breach of etiquette, it also ensured a sleeve full of someone else's dinner.

I was more lax with my own kids. If we were dining out, I wanted them to know what was expected. At the same time, I wanted our mealtimes to be a time for the family simply to be together. My oldest daughter defined the distinction well: "Strangers want to see if you know how to hold your fork. At home, Mom just wants you to enjoy dinner."

A shared meal is one of the most unifying facets of our Catholic faith. The motions of the Mass become second nature when you've done them hundreds of times but the "manners" are not why we gather. We come together to recognize the great family to which we all belong, and to recognize in one another Christ, who makes us into a family.

REFLECTION

Sunday's Gospel tells every Christian's story. Two friends of Jesus meet a stranger. They are sad, afraid, and confused because the one they thought would make Israel great, Jesus, is dead. Their lives have fallen apart; their dreams are shattered.

The stranger listens and then explains how Israel's prophets said the Messiah would have to suffer. The two feel their hearts burn with new hope; they ask the stranger to stay for dinner. When he blesses bread and gives it to them, they recognize Jesus.

In the life of each Christian, things fall apart and dreams die. This is often when Jesus' journey through death to new life begins to make sense. The Easter Jesus continues to walk with us always as the friend whose love we remember when we hear his story and break bread as he asked.

equip and empower high school youth to witness the Catholic faith to their peers and prepare them for ongoing service in evangelization.




The cost, per student,


