Parish Pilgrimage to Italy a Musical, Cultural and Spiritual Success!

St. John parishioners, led by our Adult Choir and featuring Fr. John and Deacon Frank, recently completed a marvelous tour of Assisi, Florence and Rome. Part pilgrimage, part performance tour and part good-old-fanny-pack tourism, the ten-day trip had a little bit of everything.

Nearly 60 people, including 35 performers, made the trip—even 3-month-old Zuzu, who was simply the perfect travelling companion! The weather was excellent for winter in Italy, with a lot of sun and highs in the mid-50s. And because we were "offseason" travelers (there, not here, of course!) we never had to wait in line.

Performance highlights included singing Mass in the lower basilica of St. Francis in Assisi, as well as a vigil Mass at the Florentine Basilica of Santa Maria Novella and then the noon Sunday Mass at St. Peter's Basilica. After you've done that... what is there left to do, really, as a Catholic musician? Well, put on a spectacular concert at the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli e Martiri for several hundred people! We were welcomed with polite applause, but sent off with several standing ovations after a brilliant evening.

During his free time the following day, Fr. John made a pilgrimage to his favorite Roman church, the Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls. A German tourist came up to him and said, "Excuse me, but aren't you the pastor whose choir gave the concert last night?" Now Father is a memorable guy, but especially so in this case because he had sung his *Irish Blessing* with the choir near the conclusion of the program.

"Yes, I am!" he replied.

In excellent English, she responded, "I hope you know how

blessed you are to have a choir like that!"

"Yes, I do!" he replied, smiling broadly.

On the days when we were not singing at public Masses, Fr. John celebrated private Masses for the group. These were very intimate and moving experiences, from the Basilica of St. Clare in Assisi to the chapel beneath St. Peter's. Our hotel was just two blocks from Vatican City and so we were able to spend a great deal of time exploring; a spiritual high point was a private evening tour of the Vatican Museum, culminating in a quiet hour spent in the Sistine Chapel — just weeks before it hosted its latest conclave.

This brings us to the most memorable part — we all, from the oldest to Zuzu, will be able to say we attended Pope Benedict XVI's final public audience before he announced his retirement! He did look very frail (especially when compared to having seen him just five years before), but he still gave his remarks in six languages plus greetings in two more. He is a brilliant and holy man, and we were so fortunate to have seen him one last time.

Corporate Travel Service, who made our arrangements, was flawless. Luca, our escort, was exceptional, and our guide in Rome, Dr. Liz Lev (daughter of Mary Ann Glendon!) brought everything vividly to life. Everything was so remarkable that we've decided we must do this again — in fact, we're going to have one about every year and a half! Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.



Youth Grow in God With Bible on the Beach

Last week we kicked off our Bible on the Beach series for both our Middle School and High School youth groups. Bible on the Beach provides young people the opportunity to experience the joy of encountering God through the beauty of creation, fun with friends and the prayerful reading of Sacred Scripture.

All students in middle school and high school are welcome to join us! This is a great way to make new friends, have fun, and grow in your relationship with God. Stay tuned for future dates!

Bible on the Beach includes the following:

- Fun on the Beach: ultimate Frisbee and football, soccer, swimming, etc.
- Meeting new friends
- Lectio Divina: an ancient Christian method of prayerfully reading Scripture, allowing it to penetrate our hearts, and learning how God's word relates to our everyday lives.

Our first Middle School gathering for Bible on the Beach (BoB) was met with beautiful beach weather. Not so much, however, for our High School gathering which was met with some rain showers and an overcast sky. (The sun did peek through just in time for sunset!). The fact that we experienced some rain showers was, however, fortuitous. It served as a visual aid to understand how God wants us to encounter his word.

Frequently in Sacred Scripture, God's word is presented

as rain that pours down on the dry earth to bring forth new life. We all remember those tiny rubber animals that would

expand into big, slimy animals after soaking them in water for long enough. Well, God wants to soak our hearts in the water of his word so that our hearts expand and grow in our capacity to love God and neighbor.

All of this helped us to relate last Sunday's Gospel to our lives. Before ascending into heaven, Jesus gave us a new command: "Love one another as I have loved you." As Fr. Kelly pointed out in his homily: if we want to know

what it means to love as Jesus loved, we must look to the Cross. To love as Jesus loves is humanly impossible. We can love as Jesus loves only through receiving God's grace.

The process of prayerfully reading Scripture (*Lectio Divina*) allows God to penetrate and expand our hearts so they become large enough to receive God's Love. And it is only when we have God's love in our hearts that we can share it with others, that we can fulfill the command to love others as Jesus has loved us. This is what St. Paul meant when he wrote: "It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me; and the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Gal 2:20).

We are now in the final phase of "season" here in Southwest Florida. April 30th marked what I commonly refer to as the second exodus. The final exodus will take place on May 31st. Many of our seasonal residents and visitors have three month contracts on their rentals and stay only the months of January, February and March. Others extend their stay to the

end of April, while some stay all the way through the end of May and beyond. To those who have returned to their summer homes or who will be leaving at the end of the month, we wish you safe travels and hope to see you again in the fall.

If you have requested tuition assistance for St. Ann, St. Elizabeth Seton or St. John Neumann and claim St. John the Evangelist as your parish of residence, please pay close attention to the following information. All families are required to first complete the FACTS financial survey online. In order to receive financial assistance from the parish of residence, families must be registered in that parish, attend

Mass on a regular basis, financially support the parish using church envelopes, and participate in the life of the parish. In some cases, the subsidy requested is substantial. The finance council will review the aforementioned criteria to ensure that the family requesting assistance is in compliance.

Have you visited the Paniccia Prayer Garden recently? Simply walking by the main entrance is intoxicating with the aroma of Confederate Jasmine and Gardenia bushes in full bloom. The lattice installed in the openings of the former gazebo has really filled in with jasmine, giving a very aesthetically pleasing appearance. Upon entering the garden, you will see the statue of St. Joseph sitting atop a waterfall feature shrouded by gardenias. Color abounds in the garden with Crotons, Bougainvillea, Pink Tabebuia and many other varieties of flowering annuals. If you have a chance in the next few weeks, take advantage of the abundance of flowers in bloom

and stop by to have a moment of prayer in a truly peaceful and spiritual environment.

I received an email last week regarding the special collection process. There was some confusion on the part of this parishioner as to why there was not a second collection taken for Home Missions. This is not the first inquiry I have had regarding the collection process, so I will take a moment to clear the air. We have six "second collections" annually, unless there is special occurrence such as Hurricane Sandy this past year. The six second collections are for Jamaica Outreach (4), World Mission Sunday and Seminarians. For a second collection, the basket is immediately passed again following the regular collection. All of the other envelopes you receive in your bi-monthly packets are deemed "special collections." They are generally accompanied by a letter in the bulletin from the Bishop explaining the collection and why you are being asked to contribute. For the special collections, you may simply place that envelope in the collection basket during the regular offertory. There are 14 special collections annually ranging from the Church in Latin America to the retirement fund for the Religious.

You may have noticed that the grass in section 13 of the Memorial Garden (K of C Section) has turned a very ugly shade of brown. We have instructed our landscaper to kill the current grass in preparation for the installation of new

granite markers. We have gone back and forth on how to proceed with the installation of the new markers which is why it has taken so long. We are going to have a paver company professionally install the new markers. The markers will be "mud set" which means that they will not shift with the movement of the earth. Assuming this new plan is successful; we will continue to replace all of the old markers with new markers which will also be mud set. Thank you for your patience while we transform the Memorial Garden into a beautiful final resting place.

Have you taken notice of the beautiful statue of the Pieta that sits in the Southwest corner of the Memorial Garden? This statue was originally installed as a tribute to family members of parishioners who perished on September 11, 2001. The names are engraved in the granite below the statue, however, over time the text has faded making it difficult to read. We have touched

up the engraving with a black lithograph ink and the names and inscriptions are now legible.

Finally, while on the subject of the Memorial Garden – Have







ur minds are cast back once again to Jesus' discussion with his disciples before his impending death. Could you imagine their reaction when Jesus passes on the responsibility of his mission to them? The apostles and disciples had left everything to follow Jesus. Jesus gifted them with the kingdom of God – he revealed through himself the saving power of God. Being with him must have felt like a dream at times. What a fortunate blessing to walk with the Lord! As we listen to the words of Jesus today, we can almost feel the tension that must have existed in these simple people who had decided to follow the Christ. But the one from Nazareth understood the yearnings of the human heart. He understood their pain and responds to that lovingly. "Do not let your hearts be troubled." uncertainty. The message of Jesus is the same for us – during our times of tension and trouble he is reminding us not to be afraid. Some of our community is troubled with problems in the family, at work, and with their daily need. Others live with the pain of losing husband, wife, or child. The wisdom of Jesus promises us the same Spirit to bring healing and help to all situations. Sometimes we may well feel lonely, but Jesus promises us that we are never alone. At times people feel isolated by the things they have experienced. However, if we allow God to do His work, He breaks through our isolation and offers us hope. The wisdom of Jesus dictates how we can rise above our problems and see the light at the end of the tunnel.

We may well ask ourselves – does that mean I have to go my problems alone, relying on the Spirit of God that I cannot see with my eyes? The answer is yes and no. Yes, in the way that we need to open ourselves to the reality of the God in our lives. No, in the way that we must always recognize the Spirit of God active through the ministry and presence of others. As a community of faith we are called to support one another through every season of life. The Church truly comes alive knowing that together we can reach eternal happiness by loving, forgiving and supporting one another.

My younger daughter's basketball banquet immediately followed the last day of softball tryouts. She and two of her teammates held sealed letters, the contents of which would reveal who had made the team and who would be cut. The girls had been given strict instructions not to open the letters until 6:15 that evening. I and the other parents rolled our eyes at what seemed to be the coaches' cowardly rule, but as the minutes ticked by, the girls held to their agreement. "If we can't respect the coaches' wishes this much," my daughter argued, "we don't deserve to be on the team anyway."

In today's Gospel, Jesus says, "Those who love me will keep my word." Believing in Jesus is easy; keeping his word usually is not. His rule of love seems like a nice ideal, but one that can seem impractical. We think forgiving is a good idea—but can we really be expected to forgive that? We agree to love our neighbors, but surely Jesus didn't mean that one? The scriptures make clear that we only need to take Jesus' words as seriously as we take our love for him.
