We are looking for parishioners who would consider helping our AV ministry to stream Sunday and weekday Masses, as well as funerals and weddings.

As we were repairing and renovating our church after Hurricane Irma, we came up with an idea to install cameras and one day start streaming Mass to our homebound parishioners. Little did we know that a day was coming when all the churches had to close the doors due to a pandemic. You may recall that the day we were not able to celebrate Mass together, our church was ready and able to stream it. We are all so grateful to be back together as a family celebrating the Eucharist in person. However, we realize that some of our parishioners continue to stay home due to health reasons. I receive letters and emails every week to thank us for the streaming of the Masses. Here is an example of one of those notes I received recently.

Father Tom:

My wife and I have been members of St. John's for the past ten years. We are snowbirds and have been sharing our time between Florida and Rhode Island.

Until this last year when various medical issues and Covid kept us from enjoying our time in Florida.

We have enjoyed the streaming Masses immensely for the past year, and we hope that you plan on continuing the service for the parishioners who cannot make it to the church due to medical reasons. While watching the nine o'clock Mass today, I noticed that over 100 people were logged in. We are continuing to support St. John's through the summer even though we are not physically in residence.

We used to attend masses here in Rhode Island, but as soon as the church was opened for limited seating, they immediately stopped streaming their Masses. We were not physically able to attend in person, so we must rely on your Masses even though we are fifteen hundred miles away. Our hearts are with you.

Please prayerfully consider joining this important ministry of our Church.

Gospel Reflections with Father Tom


A line in the passage from Second Corinthians expresses today's Scriptures in a nutshell: "We walk by faith and not by sight." Our readings are all about faith – that reality described in the letter to the Hebrews as "the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen." It is believing in spite of not seeing. Faith is trust in the goodness of God and the ultimate triumph of peace, justice, and love. It endures even when events of the day seem to favor the forces of evil, hatred, and violence.

We read Ezekiel's text, written in a time of great political turmoil for the Hebrew nation. It is a time of war and violence, of fear and dread. Into this dismal scene, the prophet interjects a message of hope. The role of a prophet is to speak for God, and Ezekiel does just that. In an elaborate metaphor, he describes the nations and their leaders as trees.


A "tender shoot," the future king of the house of David triumphs and becomes a majestic cedar. The tables are turned; the high tree is brought low; the lowly tree is lifted up. It becomes large enough for birds to build their nests in it. Clearly the story is meant to be the exact opposite of what seems irrevocably predicted. This is clear evidence that God is "in charge." This is a call to "walk by faith" in spite of current events that make faith look hopeless.

Like the passage from Ezekiel, today's reading from the Gospel of Mark also employs metaphors from nature. Jesus speaks of the experience of a farmer who scatters the seed and reaps the harvest. What goes on between the two events is not the work of the farmer. It is how the kingdom of God works, a mystery to humans, but testimony to God's loving providence. Even more striking is the metaphor of the mustard seed. This tiny bit of matter has the potential to become a stalwart plant big enough to give shade to resting birds. (What a nice touch to have birds connecting to Ezekiel's story!) Without experience of God's ways in nature, no one would ever predict that this miniscule bit of seed would have the potential to become a sturdy growth. This parable of Jesus has a clear message: God is "in charge." Human logic is not the final criterion of reality. Final outcomes, in God's good time, can be surprising, certainly counterintuitive to human understanding. Reflecting on the parable reinforces the necessity of faith. Faith is trust in God's loving care for all creation. It is resting in the sure knowledge that God's ways will endure and ultimately triumph as human history unfolds. Thus, the believer can sing, "We walk by faith, and not by sight."

The teaching that the church gives us today in these Scriptures is always needed. It is so easy for us to give up hope when we experience the hard things of daily life. How can we keep faith alive when our days are full of sadness and loss, tragedies and disasters? We need to realize that faith is a gift. We need to treasure it, strengthen it, and celebrate it. The gift of faith can be lost if it is not cherished. It has to be practiced! The best way to keep faith strong is to worship with other people. Often the most inspiring sermons in church are the people around us. We see the young and the old, the infirm and the prosperous, the learned and the simple – people from all walks of life. Their presence speaks of their faith. Undoubtedly they have their struggles, too, but they are here. Their faith can strengthen ours if we pay attention. We hear the Word of God together and are nourished by the community celebration of Eucharist. We need each other on this journey of faith. As the song says, "We walk by faith." It is not "I walk by faith."




Catholic Faith Appeal



Gospel Mk 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds: "This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said, "To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

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
