Missionary Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe Will Be on Display Tuesday at St . John

St. John the Evangelist will be blessed this coming Tuesday, June 11, with visitation by a Missionary Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The image is an exact color and size replica of the original miraculous image of Our Lady which she left on the tilma of St. Juan Diego in Mexico in 1531. Several of these images were blessed at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City and, since then, have been displayed before millions of people in every state in the U.S. and around the world.

Many conversions, healings, reconciliations and graces have been reported, many abortions have been prevented and more than 20 abortion centers have been closed through Our Lady's intercession after visitations of the Image. During one of his many visits to Mexico, Blessed John Paul II called for the Missionary Images to visit every diocese in America, which he called the Continent of Hope.

He prayed: "May the Continent of Hope also be the Continent of Life! This is our cry: life with dignity for all! The time has come to banish once and for all from the Continent every attack against life. Holy Virgin of Guadalupe, Queen of Peace, save the nations and peoples of this Continent!" I hope to coordinate with the Naples Pro-Life Council, as we will be noting the sad anniversary of the return of surgical abortions to Naples on or near that day as well. Look for more information here as details develop.



Please continue to pray for your spiritually adopted children. If you haven't adopted a child yet, you can still do so by picking up a card with the smiling baby's face at all the entrances to the church. The prayers are included on the card and take only a minute or two each day. That's not much to save a life. In my own prayer life, God has been teaching me to pray with faith! Expect nothing less than the miracles which God can provide. Thankfully, we don't have to rely on our own efforts, which can't do much of anything, but we can expect EVERYTHING from God. *"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."* (Philippians 4:13)

Finally, pray for the four men scheduled to die by the hands of the state within the next 30 days. It's hard to justify murder by murdering the criminals. Pray also for our Governor to have a change of heart.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

While I write my column, we are in the midst of a very unseasonably tropical weather pattern. Whether or not a named storm (Andrea) actually develops, we will have received several inches of rain before all is said and done. Considering

that this is the tail end of dry season, we are getting a great head start moving into rainy season. Gauging by the number of bodies in the pews at the 9:00 a.m. Mass this past Sunday, I would say that the majority of our seasonal residents have now departed.

Due to the fact that our playground adjacent to the Claussen Center has been unsupervised since the closing of our Early Learning and Childcare Center, we were advised to dismantle the equipment for liability reasons. We apologize for the inconvenience but must follow the guidelines set forth by the Diocese of Venice with regards to risk management.

We are in the final stages of the bidding process for our new surveillance system to be installed within the next few weeks. We are installing a very advanced system with high resolution cameras so that we will be protected for many years to come. Thank you to those who generously donated funds in order to purchase this system. The donations received thus far are nearly enough to cover the cost of the system and complete installation.

After a slight delay, we have chosen the carpet border which will be installed to allow for the new hearing loop system. We hope to have the loop system installed within the next few weeks. After we are up and running, I will publish detailed instructions for those wishing to utilize this amazing technology.

Since we closed the brokerage account held individually by St. John the Evangelist several years ago, stock contributions have been few and far between. Remember that by donating "appreciated stock," you will be able to avoid the capital gains tax and recognize the gift as a charitable donation at fair market value. This is what I would call a true win-win situation. You get to avoid a big tax hit, "write off" the gift and help your parish while St. John the Evangelist receives funds desperately needed to survive into the future. Considering that the DOW and S & P 500 averages are currently at record highs, now may be the time to consider making a move. The appreciated price is based on the true cost basis or what you initially paid for the stock. If you have held the stock for many years, this could be a substantial difference. The capital gains tax rate (long term – held over one year) will remain at 15% for many of us, however, it has increased to 20% for those in the 39.6%

tax bracket through 2013. For those of you who contribute quarterly, semi-annually or annually, this is an ideal opportunity for you to support St. John the Evangelist. You may allocate your gift to the CFA or regular offertory. Stock gifts may now be made through the Diocese of Venice for the benefit of St. John the Evangelist Church by contacting the development office at 941.484.9543.

After my recent comments regarding the Memorial Garden at St. John the Evangelist, I have had several questions arise that I will do my best to address. First and foremost, The Catholic Church states that cremation is perfectly appropriate with the stipulation that the ashes or cremains are placed in an urn and buried in consecrated ground, which is the case in our Memorial Garden. The Catholic Church does not allow ashes to be stored on a shelf or scattered in the ocean, etc. You must be a parishioner of St. John the Evangelist or a family member of a parishioner in order to purchase space in our garden. If you are Catholic and your spouse is not, you may both be interred in our memorial garden. Finally, you must be willing to be cremated as we may only bury cremated remains in our Memorial Garden. Hopefully, this clears up some of the questions those of you on the fence have been contemplating. If you would like to purchase space in our Memorial Garden, please contact me at 566.1678.

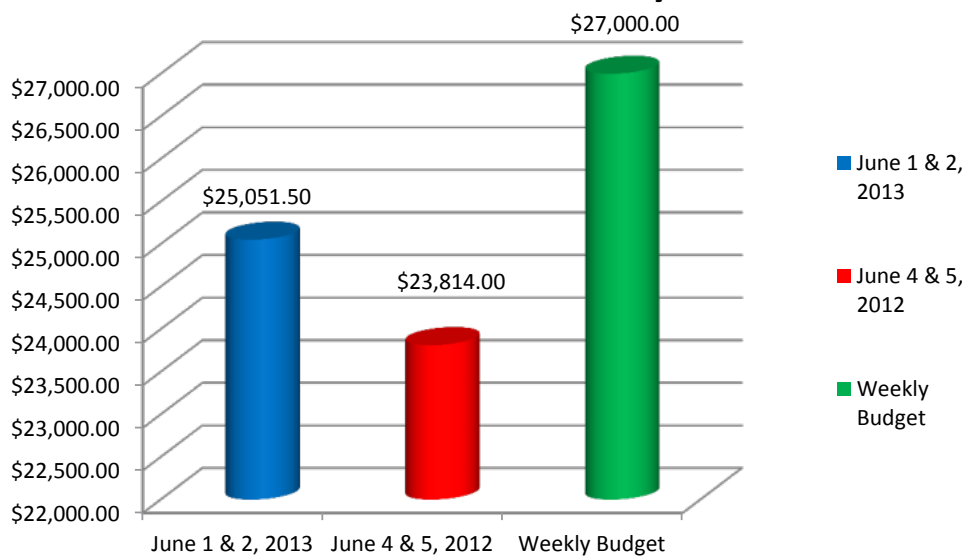

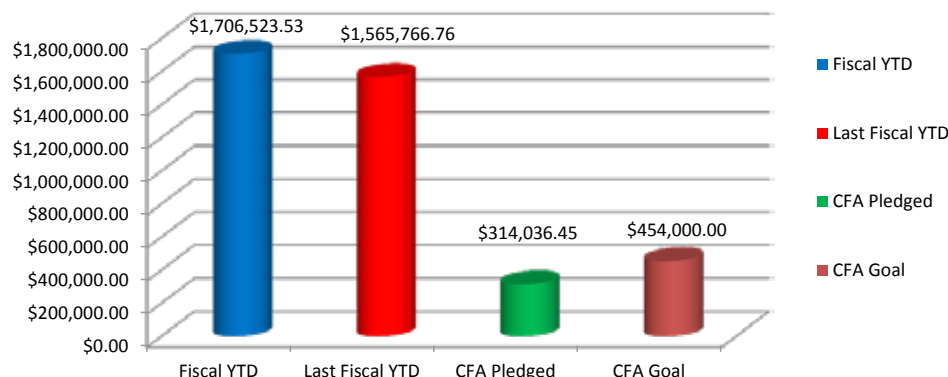

The Word & Life

Our God...The Author of Life



As we enter once again into Ordinary Time of the Liturgical Calendar, we hear how ordinary people have been touched by an encounter of God through human history. The first reading and the gospel reading both speak about the devastating consequences facing a widow when she loses her son. Elijah was blessed by the hospitality of the poor widow of Zarephath. She offered the little she had to the visiting prophet even though she could hardly provide for herself and her son. She cries out in anguish when her son dies thinking that the presence of God has brought upon her suffering and death. The prophet Elijah calls out to the Lord to breathe life into that experience so that the widow and her son may live. God's initiative is to let it be so. In contrast, the widow of Nain was left to fend for herself because her only son falls prey to death. Jesus recognized the pain in this mother's heart and he is moved with pity. His request of her? "Do not weep!" In touching the coffin, in which lay the widow's son, Jesus touches death. He then commands the young man to arise. And so it happens – the young man arises and Jesus defeats death itself. Both experiences are reminders to us that God's initiative is to bring life into this world.

When we hear these Scriptures proclaimed we have to listen to what is being relayed to us. These are not just simple stories which are told as if one were following a fairy tale. No, on the contrary, these are concrete experiences of God that took place in human history. God's dwelling is indeed with the human race. Whenever, we encounter the Lord in our own individual histories, we are immersed into salvation history. These two experiences of the sons of two widows remind us that God has power over death. God does not want to see the widows suffer and so he raises to life those who will bring protection to their mother and who will provide. God is the author of life. He intends for us to receive the fullness of life. God does not want us to be prisoners of death, but companions of life. People who have lost children may well say, "Why didn't God save my child from death?" This is an honest question that has confounded the greatest minds in history. The question why the young die young will never be answered in this life. Today's first reading and gospel reading are not about these difficult questions. They remind us that God has power over death and that He wants to protect us. For people of faith death is an encounter in which we are changed and enter into a realm with the author of life. When we pass from death into new life, God breathes into us life eternal.

Reflection Questions

1. Why do you think it was important for Jesus to raise the widow's son?
2. What did this miracle reveal?
3. How have you been impacted by death?
4. Where have you found God's consolation in your experiences of death?
5. In what ways have you witnessed spiritual death in your own life?
6. How does the "culture of death" challenge you as a Christian?
7. How does Jesus have power over your life?
8. What attitudes do you need to die to in order to live the life God intended you to live?
9. What is promised to you at the end of your life?
10. How does this promise affect your choices today?

In our second reading from St. Paul to the Galatians, we are reminded that the gospel is not of human origin, but it is revealed to us through Jesus Christ. In the life of every Christian is a reminder that we are born spiritual, to be spiritual and to journey toward the life in the Spirit. When we take both the first reading and the gospel in a spiritual context we are reminded just as God breathes life into the widow's son, he also wants to breathe life into us here and now. All of us die to sin. We experience spiritual death every time we sin and fail to do what God is calling us to do. Spiritual death is the fruit of walls erected in our relationships when we fail to love and fail to forgive. We witness spiritual death when individuals listen to voices contrary to the voice of God. We allow spiritual death and its decay to take hold of society when we stand idly by and watch unjust laws and systems take away the dignity of life. Whenever we remain unchanged when we listen to the plight of the immigrant, the working poor, and those who are unjustly treated, we become spiritually dead. However, if we have the courage to lead the authentic Christian life and listen to the wisdom of Christ, it is then that the author of life breathes anew into our lives once again. Let us pray that we will have the grace and courage to live this life abundantly.

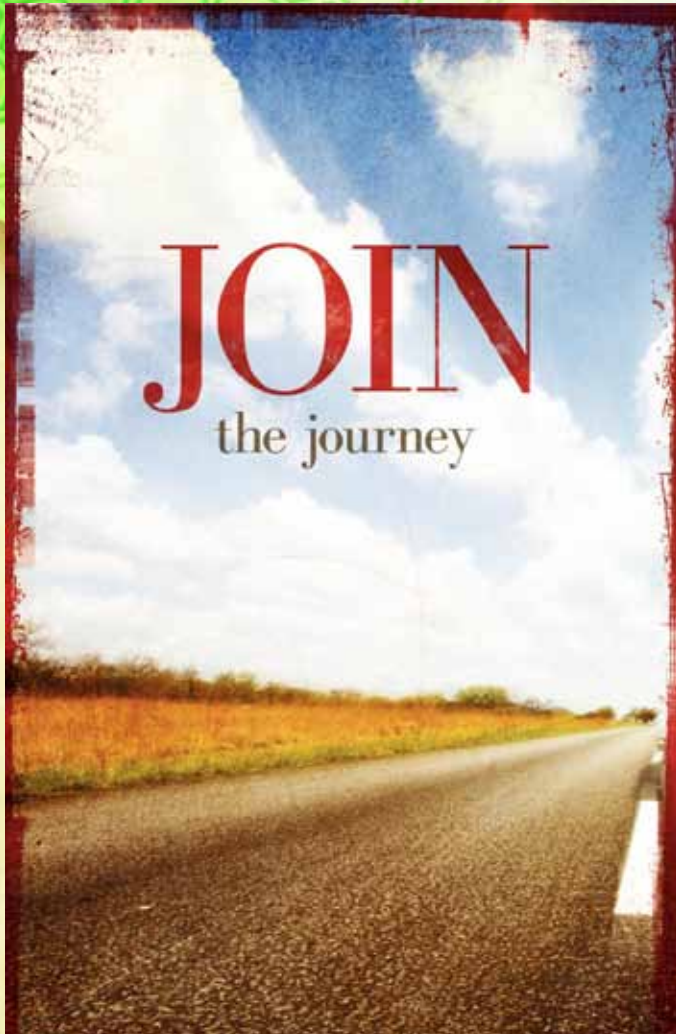
