In response to question regarding the Mission Project in St. Lucia

A parishioner enclosed a couple of letters to the editor (from the *Naples Daily News*) in an envelope in regard to the Mission Clothe Me project for the children of St. Lucia and asked me to respond to the criticism that charity needs to begin at home. As Catholics, we believe that we belong to a universal Church in which we recognize that all the citizens of the world are our brothers and sisters. Whenever we discover hunger or poverty outside the boarders of our given locales, we are called to share our blessings with God's poor. In Matthew's Last Judgment (Mt. 25:31-46), Jesus makes it abundantly clear that when we help the weak and needy, we also attend to his needs. "Whatsoever you did for the least of my brothers, you did it to me!"

Apart from this basic Christian principle, I would like to add the charitable efforts of St. John the Evangelist reach out to the poor locally and globally. It is not a question of either/or, but both/and. The parish fully supports and funds the St. Vincent de Paul Society which responds to local needs. It also financially supports Catholic Charities in their endeavors. Our Ladies of Charity is a parish ministry which helps with feeding and literacy programs in Immokalee, along with many other parish volunteers who give of their time there. The parish also sponsors and outreach to St. Matthew's House and Habitat for Humanity. Accordingly, St. John's supports many other communities within the diocese through the Catholic Faith Appeal, subsidies to Catholic Schools and other charitable concerns. The Knights of Columbus and the Men's Club also give so generously to local and national concerns. To suggest that St. John the Evangelist does not engage in charity at home is obviously erroneous.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

Teens Respond to Christ's Perennial Call: "Come Follow Me!"

Bill Maguire, Director of Youth Ministry, accompanied Fr. John, the 14 youth — two from St. John, and other diocesan personell on the Mission Trip to St. Lucia June 22 - July 4. Below he offers his reflections on the experience.

raveling from Naples to St. Lucia for this year's 12-day mission immersion trip meant leaving a culture of affluence to enter a culture of poverty. For the 14 teen missionaries, however, the trip provided many rich experiences serving Christ and spreading the Good News!

Our commitment to the Gospel of Life was deepened by working with the poor, abandoned, mentally and physically handicapped, and the elderly.

From the world's point of view, these people's worth and value are often called into question, because they have nothing to offer. Yet, from Christ's perspective, it is precisely their poverty — their inability to give some-thing — that enables the poor to offer the greatest gift: the gift of self, the gift of some-one, not some-thing. This is the gift Christ gave on the Cross, his total gift of self to bring about our redemption.

The teens responded generously to Christ's perennial call: "Come follow me!" Sometimes Christ called them to follow him into incredibly joyful places: new friendships, the smiles of children, a word of encouragement and the beach. Other times, Jesus called the teens to follow him into uncomfortable places: places where people were depressed, handicapped, poor, missing limbs and living in the slums.

Working with the poor and the many religious sisters we encountered, reminded us that while love is meek, it is not weak. In our world, love ultimately takes on one form: cruciform. Love is tough, love is a challenge — but, above all, love is a worthy adventure. This adventure to love and serve reminded us of John Paul II's words:

"Do not be afraid of the radicalness of his demands. If Jesus asks much from you, it is because he knows you can give much."

We can be truly proud of our young people! They answered the call and spread the light of Christ's joy into some pretty dark places.

Let's keep these teens in our prayers so that their renewed spirit of generosity and commitment to the Gospel will continue as strong here at home as in St. Lucia.

As St. Catherine of Sienna said to young people:

"If you will be who you are meant to be, you will set the whole world on fire!"

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops offers several facts regarding the Health and Human Services (HHS) regulations on mandatory coverage of contraceptives, sterilization and abortion-inducing drugs.

The rule that created the uproar has not changed at all, but was finalized as is. After its initial proposal of August 2011 was widely criticized across the political spectrum

as an attack on religious freedom, the Administration announced its final rule of February 15, 2012 as a compromise. But in fact that rule finalizes the original proposal "without change." So religious organizations dedicated to serving people of other faiths are still not exempt as "religious employers."

The proposed "accommodation" is not a current rule, but a promise that comes due beyond the point of public accountability. On February 15, besides finalizing its mandate without change, HHS also announced it will develop more regulations to apply that mandate differently to "non-exempt, non-profit religious organizations"—the charities, schools, and hospitals that were left out of the "religious employer" exemption. The regulations for this "accommodation" will be developed during a one-year delay in enforcement, their impact not felt until after the November election.

The Collier County Elections Board will be sending a Voter Outreach Team to St. John the Evangelist on July 28 and 29 to facilitate voter registration. The team will be onsite in the narthex on Saturday from 2:15 p.m. – 6:30 p.m. and on Sunday from

7:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. They will bring a laptop with the current registered voter database so that parishioners can verify their status. If you are not registered, a team member will assist you in completing your application. Unfortunately, the registration cutoff for the August primary is July 16. Therefore, if you wish to vote in this election and are not registered, you must visit the Supervisor of Elections website, (www.collliervotes.com) complete the application and return it to the main office by this coming Monday. The deadline to register to vote in the general election in November is not until October 9. If you are not registered to vote or are unsure, this will be a great opportunity to make sure that you are ready to cast your ballot in November.

I received a phone call this week from a manager (and parishioner) of the Wal-Mart at the corner of US-41 and 111th Avenue North. This is the third consecutive year that she has called me to inquire about the dates for Undy Sunday. Undy Sunday will take place this year on **August 5 and August 12**. The reason for her call was to identify the dates for this year's drive so that her store could make sure to order extra inventory for the event. I am sure that many of you did not realize that we collected that much in the way of socks and underwear for the drive. So I did a little research and was astounded at what I found.

Did you know that this year, nearly 50 Collier County Churches and Synagogues will participate in Undy Sunday hosted by Catholic Charities of Collier County? This is the 16th annual event. Since the initial Undy Sunday in 1997, the number of participating churches has more than doubled. About 700,000 undergarments have been given to disadvantaged children in Collier County during the past 15 years.

It is hard to imagine these children doing without such basic necessities as clean underwear and socks; however, the fact is that this situation is all too prevalent throughout Collier County. The good news is that this is a program in which everyone can participate. I intend to have my 9 year old daughter (although maybe slightly unwillingly) use her

allowance to purchase a package of underwear for the drive. She will learn a very valuable lesson about how blessed she is and how important it is to take care of those in need. I will also petition everyone I know to follow suit and do the same. You can purchase a little girls combo pack (9 pairs of underwear and 6 pairs of socks) for as little as \$10.50 at Wal-Mart. So when I say that everyone can participate, this is certainly the case. If you are unable to make it to the store to shop, Catholic Charities will accept monetary contributions as well.


Please look for the Undy Sunday boxes in the narthex of the church on August 5 and August 12. We ask that you bring new socks and new underwear for boys and girls sizes six through 12. Monetary donations are also needed to purchase backpacks and school supplies.

We are no longer accepting donations for Jamaica. This includes used clothing, appliances, toiletries, etc. The agreement that previously existed with Food for the Poor with regards to free shipping of containers to Jamaica is no longer valid. If you have any of the aforementioned items that you wish to donate, please contact the St. Vincent de Paul Society at 775.1667. They can arrange pickup of large items or you may drop off donations directly to their thrift store on Davis Blvd. Please do not bring donations to the parish office. We apologize for the inconvenience and will continue to search for new shipping options.

We have finally agreed on a granite color and fill for the new headstones in the Memorial Garden. Star Granite is sending me a complete sample this coming week. Upon acceptance of the sample, we will begin replacing the headstones in place with the new engraved version. The new headstones will NOT have a bronze plaque. Instead, the granite will be directly engraved with the name, date of birth and date of death. We are extremely optimistic that this will solve our problems with discoloration and oxidation of the bronze plaques currently in use. This will be a very time consuming process and we ask that you be patient while we make these much needed enhancements to the final resting place of your loved ones.






Marriage Preparation Program Addition


he Sacred Scriptures of today's mass are threaded together by the theme of God's election. Amos speaks of God's choosing him to prophesy to the people of Israel. St. Paul presents his theological treatise on our spiritual adoption as God's children. Jesus summons the twelve and instructs them on how they are to conduct themselves on their journey into God. Jesus imparts authority upon his apostles to preach repentance, drive out demons, to anoint and cure the sick. Their ministry takes them on a journey into the heart and mind of God. The first reading and gospel also remind us that there is a cost to discipleship. The message of the one who is set apart to proclaim the kingdom will not always be accepted. The prophets were killed for their message, so too were the disciples. They gave their very lives for the importance of the message of salvation. Jesus tells the twelve to take nothing for the journey and invites them to lead a life of simplicity.

Many have been and continue to be invited on this journey into God. Throughout human history countless men and women have answered God's call to follow in the footsteps of Christ and his apostles. Priests, religious, and lay people have generously given their lives in promoting the gospel in the developed and the developing world. Many have been imprisoned, tortured and even killed to bring the gospel alive in the midst of poverty and oppression. These people took nothing with them for the journey – just the grace of answering God's call to give selflessly and offer hope.

The Church is still in need of her prophets, healers, teaches, sanctifiers and preachers. All of us need to promote the vocation to the priesthood and religious life. We must teach our youth that there

is not only value to the material world but value to the spiritual world as well. The People of God must encourage its young to discern God's will and answer His call to shape the Church of tomorrow. There are great challenges associated with discipleship. We have to acknowledge that there are great blessings as well. When individuals answer the call to proclaim the good news to the poor, liberty to captives, freedom to the oppressed and sight to the blind, their lives become expressions of God's unending grace.

It is important to realize that all of us are also chosen as God's elect through the grace of our baptism. Each member of the Church is called to follow Christ in activities of everyday life. We are summoned to discern God's will and respond to his call to love all people unconditionally. We are invited to build the bridge to unending peace and to eliminate poverty through our legislation and sharing our wealth. As Christians, we are called to take nothing for the journey into faith – we are simply asked to rely on the wisdom of God and the gifts that He has given us.

We pray: Heavenly Father, we know that you have invited us to participate in your divine mission here on earth. Fear can often hinder us in responding to your call. Give us the courage to cast away our fears and fill us with the fire of your love. As we journey into faith, may all of us be aware of your constant presence. Let Your wisdom be the guide to everything we do and say. Amen.


...The Church is an evangelizer, but she begins by being evangelized herself. She is the community of believers, the







School's Out, But September Is Just Around the Corner!

In past years, we have asked for your help in donating to our school lunch and school uniform programs for the needy children of St. Pius X Primary School, located in inner city Kingston. You have always answered our requests and our prayers in providing a nutritional meal, often the only meal of the day, for these helpless children. Fortunately, the government of Jamaica has recognized the plight of these children and has initiated a food subsidy program for them. This program does not, however, include the Nursery Schools we sponsor, and so, we are still trying to address the needs of these 3, 4 and 5 year

olds who have different dietary needs than their older schoolmates. Therefore, we are asking for a contribution of \$150.00 to sponsor one Nursery school child with lunch for the 2012-2013 school year. This amounts to less than one dollar a day for the entire school year.

We also need to supplement our scholarship fund for students who need books and tuition for high school (grade 7 and higher), Teacher Training Colleges, or four vear baccalaureate degree colleges. As a result of academic successes in the elementary schools we support, more and more of our students are continuing their studies by applying to tuition based high schools and four year colleges. The Jamaican government provides only limited support after grade 6. We need your help in encouraging these students to follow their dreams and

aspirations for a better life, and break the cycle of poverty that has plagued these people for generations. Your contribution of \$200.00 will go a long way in paying for books and tuition at these institutions of higher learning.

If you prefer, your donation in any amount can be made to our General Education Fund, which gives us the flexibility to use your gift where it is most needed.
