Ladies of Charity Engage in Activities to Help the Less Fortunate


The Ladies of Charity was the first one of the great foundations established by St. Vincent de Paul, located in the diocese of Lyons, France. It was canoncically approved on December 8, 1617, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

Around 1629, many associations were formed in and around Paris and all received the encouragement of the Holy See.

St. Vincent sent St. Louise de Marillac to visit these associations. Under great difficulty she taught by example how the ladies should conduct themselves in their visits to the poor. On March 11, 1934, Pope Pius XI in canonizing St. Louise de Marillac, proposed her as a model for all the Ladies of Charity.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seaton founded the Sisters of Charity in the United States. She opened a school in Baltimore, marking the beginning of the Catholic School system in the United States. Elizabeth was canonized a saint September 14, 1975.

Throughout his life St. Vincent watched over the Ladies of Charity with care. The mustard seed planted by St. Vincent three centuries ago has become a great tree that extends it branches far and wide and sheds its benefits over many

countries of the world. To follow the directives of St. Vincent the ladies should engage in activities that help the ill, the poor and the disadvantaged, giving spiritual and corporal help where needed.

The Ladies of Charity recall Jesus' words, "I was sick and you visited me, hungry and you gave me food, thirsty and you gave me to drink, I was naked and you clothed me, poor and you comforted me."

As as response to this invitation, the ladies are ever ready to help where ever needed in our community. We meet the second Friday of every month, volunteer in the Immokalee schools, soup kitchen and clothing bank, serve dinner at

St. Mathews House, visit local nursing homes and assist at their monthly Masses, bring dinners to the homebound, make friendly visits and run simple errands, tutor in a local Catholic School and attend to the needs of young women at Provident House.

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.



Life Matters



I have had reason to ponder the absolute sacredness of all life in recent days. It is easy to say that ALL life is sacred, and we all profess that (I hope). But some things happen that make us want to quantify the sacredness of a particular life. On his scheduled day of execution, July 10, Marshall Gore was

granted a second stay of execution. The judicial system will now decide whether or not he is competent enough to be put to death. I will save the merits of that idea for a future article.

In a discussion with a friend, she indicated that with all her involvement with saving the innocent babies, she didn't really have the energy or resources left to save the inmates. On the face of things, that appears to be an honest and legitimate response. However, when we look more deeply

at this subject, we realize that this kind of thinking puts a judgment on which lives are sacred enough to save, while some are not.

This truly becomes an ethical slippery slope of which we should all be leery. Even Jesus promised the criminal hanging next to him on the cross "Today you will be with me in paradise". Simply stated, EVERYONE's life is sacred; whether you are an innocent unborn child, a Down's syndrome baby, a 45 year old in chronic pain with a terminal disease, or a grandma with dementia. We must resist the messages of the culture we live in that says that some lives would be better off dead, or to have never been born at all. I promise that some of the tough questions of the death penalty situation, especially in light of Florida's new "streamlined" death row laws, will be more thoroughly dealt with in a future issue of this or another article. It's an important subject. I am not sure that my views alone will be able to do it justice.



More personally, a friend I grew up with in the neighborhood recently lost two brothers in less than 12 hours, both in their early 60s and both to natural causes. His mother, now in her 80s, has a rock solid faith I have always admired. Pray that her faith carries her and her much smaller family through this tragedy. Those two lives will leave their own holes wherever they have lived and worked and loved.

My own faith, plus a wonderful faith family are the only things that have

carried me through the two years today since my own sweet Bobby left for heaven. Say a prayer for him today. Thank you and God bless you.

You may remember me mentioning that our online vendor (Pledge Connect) for credit cards/ACH drafts is merging with another company (Liturgical Publications) to enhance their capabilities and create a true synergy. The new module is

called WeShare and it is truly amazing. I spent two hours in a webinar this past week exposing myself to what I believe is going to change the way we do many of the labor intensive tasks here at St. John the Evangelist. One of the most exciting developments will be the ability to register for and pay for events directly through our website by linking to WeShare. These are not only parish events but events for the Men's Club, Jamaica Outreach and the Knights of Columbus as well. Need to register for the Columbus Day Dinner Dance? Simply go to our website and click on the link. After registering and paying for the event, you will have the option of printing your ticket or even scanning a QR code and bringing your ticket with you on your smartphone to the event. You will also be able to see who else has registered for the event. Want to make sure your friends are attending? Simply look at the list of those who have already registered and know that you will be in good company. Parishioners will also be able to register for Faith Formation, Vacation Bible School or anything else that you can imagine by using WeShare. We hope to have this new module up and running by the first week of August. At that time, I will send out an email blast with information on how to use We Share.

The new front doors for the church are nearly completed and will be installed next week. I am very excited for our parishioners to see the finished product.

I received a phone call this week from a manager (and parishioner) of the Wal-Mart at the corner of US-41 and 111th Avenue North. This is the fourth consecutive year that she has called me to inquire about the dates for Undy Sunday. Undy Sunday will take place this year on August 11 and August 18. The reason for her call was to identify the dates for this year's drive so that her store could make sure to order extra inventory for the event. I am sure that many of you did not realize that we collected that much in the way of socks and underwear for the drive. So I did a little research and was astounded at what I found.

Did you know that this year, nearly 55 Collier County Churches and Synagogues will participate in Undy Sunday hosted by Catholic Charities of Collier County? This is the 17th annual event hosted entirely by volunteers. Since the initial Undy Sunday in 1997, the number of participating churches has more than doubled. The undergarments are distributed to 40 local agencies including Youth Haven. About 750,000 undergarments have been given to disadvantaged children in Collier County during the past 16 years.

It is hard to imagine these children doing without such basic necessities as clean underwear and socks; however, the fact is that this situation is all too prevalent throughout Collier County. The good news is that this is a program in which everyone can participate. I intend to have my 10 year old daughter participate once again using her allowance to purchase a package of underwear for the drive. She will learn a very valuable lesson about how blessed she is and how important it is to take care of those in need. I will also petition everyone I know to follow suit and do the same. You can purchase a little girl's combo pack (9 pairs of underwear and 6 pairs of socks) for as little as \$10.50 at Wal-Mart. So when I say that everyone can participate, this is certainly the case. If you are unable to make it to the store to shop, Catholic Charities will accept monetary contributions as well.

Please look for the Undy Sunday boxes in the narthex of the church on August 11 and August 18. We ask that you bring new socks and new underwear for boys and girls sizes six through 12. Monetary donations are also needed to purchase backpacks and school supplies.

Have you ever wondered how the collection is counted and prepared for deposit? It is done by the generosity of an incredible group of volunteers that weekly give of their time and talent. Due to the secure nature of their job, I am unable to identify any of them by name, however, let it be known that their work is greatly appreciated as they are an invaluable asset to our parish operation. During the peak of season this hard working group spends upwards of six hours sorting, counting, bundling and recording the collection so that it may be safely deposited in the bank. Thank you to all of our "counters" for selflessly giving of your time so that we may efficiently operate.





Mary's Guest Is Also Our Guest

he story of Martha and Mary is a well known dinner story of the gospels. Martha is so caught up in the details of hospitality that she forgets why she is having a dinner at all — that is to honor Jesus by offering a meal and hospitality. Mary's response to Jesus, on the other hand, is a different story. She chooses to leave Martha to attend to the details of food preparation in the kitchen while she sits and listens to what Jesus has to say. Mary's sitting at the feet of the master is indicative of the posture used by a disciple who sits at the master's feet to learn from him.

Reflection Questions

- 1. Why does Martha get annoyed during this encounter?
- 2. What motivated Mary to sit at the feet of the master?
- 3. What is the main teaching of Jesus in the gospel today?
- 4. What do you think it means to be a disciple of Jesus?
- 5. List the main teachings of Christ that are evident in your life.
- 6. Do you respond to the Lord as a faithful student?
- 7. Name the times that you have been attentive to Christ's presence in your life?
- 8. Have there been times when you have not attended to the presence of Christ in your life? Why did you not respond?

Martha's motivation is rooted in goodness. Martha was so busy with the details of hospitality because Jesus was her special guest. Jesus' comment to Martha is intriguing, "Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." Jesus was simply saying that Mary chose to listen to his appealing discourse. After all, how many had the opportunity to sit at a meal and listen to God? Jesus was trying to draw Martha into his company so that she could be blessed by his presence as well.

Like Martha and Mary, all of us are blessed to have Jesus as the honored guest. Every time we celebrate the Mass we believe that the Lord sits with us for a sacred meal to nourish us and strengthen us. The appealing discourse from the master's mouth comes to us through the proclamation of the Word and the gift of the gospels. Jesus honored Martha and Mary 2000 years ago with his presence. Today, Jesus continues to honor us with his presence when we gather in his name and in the breaking of the bread. Like Mary, he asks us to be attentive as his Word is proclaimed to us. The Christ of faith expects us to be changed by our encounter with him. In order for this transformation to take place, we must first acknowledge his presence and then discern his will.

As Christians, our living space should also reflect the centrality of Jesus Christ. When we look around our homes we should find images of Christ giving witness to our belief in his presence. Many of us grew up with the image of the Sacred Heart or the crucifix in the living room or dining room. These portraits served to remind us of the love that Christ continues to have for us. Just as we proudly exhibit photographs of our loved ones and favorite art, we should be ready to give evidence of what lies deep in our souls. More importantly, each one of us must bear the image of Christ through our love and example. As Mary was attentive to the presence of Christ in her life, we too must be attentive to the Christ who can be found in members of our families, society, and through the needs of the world.

Prayer

Lord, teach us to be attentive to your will in our lives. Help us to listen to your word and take it to heart. As Mary took the time to be with you, may we also take the time to be with you by attending to the needs of those around us. May we be inspired to lead a deeper life in prayer so that we may always hear your voice in our lives. Amen.






