Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Life Matters



I can't believe we are looking at the last week of July!. The back- to- school specials are already being advertised and of course the kids are pushing for all the things they haven't done yet. Not that I'm counting or anything, but school starts four long weeks from tomorrow. There's lots of summer left to enjoy. Like the daily rain storms and the oppressive humidity. What's not to enjoy?

The people of Texas are celebrating, in spite of the temperatures. They successfully passed a post 20 week ban on abortions in the Lone Star State. If you saw the news, the crowds were often unruly and disruptive, but the legislature persevered and got these groundbreaking laws on the books. In addition to the ban on abortions on babies who are capable of feeling pain, Texas also set guidelines that all drugs be administered directly by a doctor, according to FDA guidelines, and that all abortion clinics will have to comply with the same safety standards as any freestanding ambulatory surgical center. In other words, they have to ensure that hallways are wide enough to allow gurneys in and out in the event of an emergency. In addition, all abortionists must have hospital admitting privileges within 30 miles of their clinic. All of these common sense safety issues were at the core of the dissension.

Meanwhile in the Senate, our own Marco Rubio continues to try to push for a pain capable abortion ban at 20 weeks. There is a much smaller chance of passage in the Senate, but it should be an interesting debate to watch. How does one defend the "choice" to inflict pain on an innocent baby?

There is better news from my home state of Ohio. The pro life governor there, John Kasich, has led his legislature through the passage of several pro-life bills, including a required ultrasound that must be shown to the mother, as well as an array of common sense safety measures similar to Texas. The governor is, of course, taking some heat, but not from the good people from Ohio. GO BUCKEYES! According to one internet source, a well known MSNBC talking head claimed the Ohio law required an invasive ultrasound procedure. That is totally false. According to the fact checker at the Cleveland Plain Dealer, this on-air personality was given a "pants on fire" rating for her outright falsehood.

Let's keep praying that the tide is turning for abortion advocates. I think the reality of the Gosnell trial, the evidence of another "infanticide" practitioner in Texas, malpractice in Maryland and fraud finally brought to light despite document shredding in Kansas, are all coming together

like a perfect storm of bad news for abortion on demand. God have mercy on our country and soften the hearts of those who support this killing.

JULY 28, 2013 ~ SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



On the opposite page, please find a consolidated financial statement for the fiscal year (July 1, 2012 – June 30, 2013) with a comparison to the prior fiscal year (July 1, 2011 – July 1, 2012.) I will now address some of the line items that reflect large variances in relation to the prior fiscal year. I have highlighted the lines in question for easy identification.

The first line item (Offertory Collection) obviously jumps right off the page. Due to your extreme generosity, we recognized an increase of 10.38 percent versus the prior fiscal year. This is one of the largest increases I can remember in my sixteen year tenure at St. John the Evangelist.

Under Non-Assessable Receipts (Gifts and Donations – Restricted,) you will notice a substantial increase over the prior year. This income is primarily comprised of gifts towards the purchase of our new lighting system, surveillance system, “Lest we Forget” Veteran’s Memorial and the new front doors for the church. These funds are restricted to be used specifically as the donor has instructed.

Although personnel Expense shows an increase of 2.19%, the majority of this variance is due to a very comprehensive severance package. Basically, personnel expense remained flat in 2012/2013.

Following personnel, our next major expense is reflected in Church, PLC and Rectory renovations. These renovations include the new lighting system in the church, Lest we Forget Veteran’s Memorial, PLC bathrooms, dance floor refinishing, extensive repairs to our ballroom partition, three new AC Units and the accompanying Metasys control system.

We were notified by the Diocese of Venice in May that in order to recognize a 3% discount on our property and liability insurance premium, we would have to pay in full by the end of June. Historically we have had until September of the next fiscal year or three additional months to pay in full and recognize the discount. Therefore, we technically were

forced to recognize two years’ worth of property and liability premiums in one fiscal year. This explains the very large variance on that line item.

Under General and Administrative expense, the first line item (Capital Expense – Buildings) is inclusive of the new Hearing Loop System in the Church as well as the renovations to the new Condo purchased for Fr. Jim. The second line item (Capital Expense – Furniture) is inclusive of furniture which was purchased to furnish the new condo.

Tuition subsidies increased nearly \$40,000.00 over the prior fiscal year. This increase was due, in part, to parishioners adhering to the strict guidelines required internally to qualify for subsidy. Although this was a substantial increase, it also recognizes that more of our families are taking a vested interest in their parish by attending regularly and having their children participate in the life of the parish.

Finally, Memorial Garden expense also increased substantially (\$40,237.00) over the prior year. Much of this expense is due to the purchase of new markers, however, a substantial portion was recognized in the movement/replacement of the fire hydrant, landscaping and irrigation repairs.

Ultimately, we finished the fiscal year “in the red”, however, this is strongly due to very extraordinary circumstances over which we had very little control. As you can see, although we “lost” \$36,821, we accomplished more than I possibly could have imaged in the past fiscal year. We can only hope to be as productive this current fiscal year. Once again, this is all made possible through your extreme generosity and we thank you

humbly for your continued support.

We have begun the process of killing the grass in additional sections of our Memorial Garden. Please remember that we are replacing ALL of the old markers (headstones) with new engraved granite markers. This process will continue



The Word & Life

The Essence of Prayer

We have often heard it said: “The family that prays together stays together”. Many, including myself, would agree with this wisdom. Prayer is a very important part of family life. It is also an integral part of our relationship with God. Through prayer we offer praise, thanksgiving, and petition. It is a two-way dialogue — we speak to God and God speaks to us. Honest prayer offers God the language of the heart and a listening ear to discern his will for us. Real prayer strengthens our endeavor to put the Lord first in our lives through word and action.

Reflection Questions

1. How is your prayer life?
2. At what times of the day are you most aware of God’s presence?
3. What does it mean to keep the Lord’s name holy?
4. What do you think is meant by the words, “Thy kingdom come?”
5. What is God’s will for you?
6. How do you allow God to nourish you?
7. Do you invite God to forgive those who have hurt you?
8. Are you willing to participate in God’s endeavor of forgiveness?
9. How do you listen for the answer to your prayers?
10. When do you believe God has answered your prayers?
11. What is this gospel calling you to?

In today’s gospel, one of the disciples was probably struggling in his prayer life and simply asks Jesus to teach him and his friends how to pray. Jesus’ teaching lives on today as we pray the beautiful words of the Lord’s Prayer. The “Our Father” gets to the heart of the matter where it comes to faith and life. Through this prayer we are asked to bless the name of the Father and keep it holy. Jesus teaches us to seek the kingdom by praying for its reality to affect our lives. How do we do this? We pray for our basic needs and seek to forgive others just in the way that God forgives us. Jesus also advises us to pray that we do not fall to temptation and put our commitment to the test.

The gospel demonstrates the importance of being persistent in prayer. *God hears the heartfelt prayer of those who continue to ask him for what they need, not for what they want.* The first reading today demonstrates how Abraham was persistent in his prayer, asking God to save the city. God saw that Abraham did not ask this for himself, and He grants his request. Today’s liturgy beautifully shows how prayer is intimately connected with

our human experience. We believe that God knows all things. Therefore, we should open our hearts and pour out our troubles, joys, and concerns to our Father who truly understands the yearnings of the human heart and answers those heartfelt pleas. Our prayer is real when we allow ourselves to be totally transparent before God.

Let us remember the importance of prayer today. It is a necessary part of knowing God. We can be the greatest theologian and know numerous things about God. However, if we fail to pray, then we fail to know the *essence* of God. If any of us are out of the habit of prayer, today is simply a reminder to get ourselves back on track. If your family does not have a practice of praying together — let today be a new beginning by bringing prayer back to your lives.



through the end of the year or until all are replaced. The replacement sometimes involves re-sodding the section and mud-setting the granite, based on how many markers are currently in place. We apologize for the inconvenience and lack of aesthetics while these renovations are being completed.


We are finally replacing the carpet in the Parish Life Center Classroom Hallway and adjacent classrooms. This carpet is 16 years old and was of poor quality when installed. Actually, the carpet was so old that the glue had dissolved and when they were removing it, all they had to do was gently pull and it came right up! We are now using carpet tiles which we installed several months ago in one of the classrooms to see how it would wear. The finished product looks great and there is a great cost savings in using the

tiles. We are able to use our in-house maintenance staff to install and the square foot cost also is less for the tiles versus traditional roll carpet. The best news of all comes when there is a major spill of irreparable damage. We simply pull up the damaged tiles and replace with new tiles. Come down and check it out when you get a chance. *(See photo on page 8.)*


