Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

The Diocese of Venice has provided all the parishes with a new software suite to securely access and manage parish information. The software comes from a company called ParishSOFT (http://www.parishsoft.com) and it will greatly increase our capabilities to serve all of you. From online forms for parish registration and other programs, to providing direct visibility to your giving history, this new system will allow us to be more efficient and effective in both administration and in ministry here at St. John. Our transition to the new system is almost complete and we will be providing more details on how you can take advantage of it in the coming weeks.

#ToKnow – The "Rock": Our Faith in Our Hearts

Our Holy Father has asked all of us to look into our own hearts and examine our faith as Jesus did when he called Simon "Peter", or "Kepha", which in Aramaic (the language of Jesus' time and place) means "rock". The strength of our hearts continues the work started by Peter, to build the church on faith and love:

Brothers and sisters, what happened in a unique way in Saint Peter, also takes place in every Christian who develops a sincere faith in Jesus the Christ, the Son of the living God. Today's Gospel challenges each of us: How is your faith? Let each of us answer in our heart. How is your faith? How is it? What does the Lord find in our hearts: a firm heart, like a rock? Or a heart like sand, that is, doubtful, mistrustful, unbelieving? It would do us good to think about this throughout the day. If the Lord finds in our

hearts a faith – I won't say perfect, but sincere, genuine, then He will see in us, too, the living rocks on which He builds His community. For this community, the foundation stone is Christ, the unique cornerstone. For his part, Peter is the rock, as the visible foundation of the unity of the Church; but every baptized person is called to offer to Jesus his or her own faith, poor but sincere, so that He can continue to build His Church, today, in every part of the world.

Even in our days, many people think that Jesus is a great prophet,

Several months ago I wrote about the aging of our facilities and the need to address our buildings pro-actively in order to prevent large unexpected expenditures in the near and not so distant future. The "Honeymoon Period" ended quite some time ago for

the church and is now ending for the Parish Life Center and in a few more years will have expired on the Claussen Center as well. It seems that every other week there is an issue popping up either in the church or PLC that requires immediate attention and immediate dollars. I touched on some of the issues in the PLC such as the fire sprinkler system, flat roof and spalling concrete (and associated rebar damage) around the perimeter of the building itself. In addition, we have had to deal with a surprise Mold issue in the PLC that, although covered by insurance, will require a deductible and numerous non-covered ancillary expenditures. The mold remediation has required us to close the parish office for nearly a month now including the cancelation of several events and the relocation of several others.

We have recently discovered several issues in the church with the AC and duct work that will also require a somewhat large expenditure in order to remedy. As a result, we will most likely have to close the church for at least four consecutive weekdays and relocate daily Mass to the Seminar Room so that crews may come in and make the necessary repairs.

As I stated previously, this is not a "gloom and doom" scenario and is certainly not a plea for additional funding but rather an illustration of transparency so that you, as our parishioners, are kept aware of the associated costs and headaches of operating a campus with three buildings that are beginning to show their age.

As you know, in addition to our general operating account, we also have a savings account held at the Diocese of Venice. This account is intended to be accessed only in the case of an emergency or in times of incredibly poor cash flow to satisfy operating expenses such as payroll, utilities, etc. In my 17 year tenure at Saint John the Evangelist we have never had to access these funds and instead have kept them in safekeeping. This has been accomplished through numerous different methods, my favorite of which is establishing VERY lengthy terms with our creditors. Net 30 or 60 for larger expenditures

is unheard of in my vocabulary. Instead I attempt to establish terms of 180 days or greater so that we are able to satisfy our general operating expenses while taking care of other vendors on our terms and not theirs. With that said, there are many ways for us to remain solvent while we address our immediate needs with regards to unexpected repairs in the church and PLC.

We certainly apologize for any inconvenience experienced as a result of the steps which are being taken to make sure that YOUR facilities are operated in a safe, clean and efficient manner

I think it safe to say that there a more than a few bargain hunters in our parish. After announcing two weeks ago that there will be a rate increase in the purchase price for plots in the Memorial Garden, I have been inundated with calls, emails and appointments to secure final resting places for our parishioners. Although the rate increase will not take effect until the first of the year, many are obviously being proactive and trying to beat others "to the punch" for the best plots remaining in inventory. The current all-inclusive purchase price is \$1,500.00. The new price as of January 1 will be \$1,700.00. If you would like to save a few hundred dollars and have been on the fence, please contact myself or JP to schedule an appointment.

Thank you to all of our parishioners for your incredible generosity during the two weeks of Undy Sunday. There were literally bags of undergarments anywhere and everywhere. Representatives from Catholic Charities were ecstatic at the turnout from Saint John the Evangelist. In addition, monetary contributions increased nearly 100% over last year's campaign. If surrounding religious establishments replicated our efforts, then many of those children in Collier County needing assistance will certainly receive the necessary undergarments to go back to school. Thanks again!



The Challenge of the Cross

s we listen to the gospel today, we continue to the episode that took place in Caesarea Philippi. One can almost feel the beating of the heart in Peter's chest; after all Christ has just given him heavenly authority. The mood quickly changes, however, as Jesus begins to spell out to his disciples what he will have to endure for the message that he was handing on to his friends. Jesus was no stranger to the deception that was taking place among the leaders. He foresaw what was going to happen, knowing that he would shed his blood for his message. Peter's heart skips a beat as he listens and his humanity spurs him onto rebuking Jesus, telling him that no such thing shall ever happen. Little did this new leader know that one day it would also happen to him — he too would be crucified for the sake of the gospel.

Jesus in turn rebukes Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" How must have Peter felt at that moment? One minute he is acclaimed as leader, the next Satan! Jesus invites Peter, along with his disciples, to move beyond the limitations of their human understanding. He reminds Peter and he reminds us that we cannot put obstacles ahead of God's will. He invites Peter and the disciples to take up



the cross. The cross was the sign of humiliation for the Jews. Jesus is challenging his followers to forego humiliation and rejection for the sake of his teachings and his name. Jesus was offering his followers a radical challenge. Jesus tells them that he will take up that cross and invites them to do the same for the sake of the kingdom, finding their reward in heaven.

The challenge of the gospel calls us to move beyond worldly desires and it involves sacrifice. For Jesus and the early Church, this sacrifice involved their very lives. For us, however, this sacrifice involves something different. As St. Paul says in today's second reading to the Romans: "Do not conform yourselves to this age, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect." The sacrifice involved in following Christ today is that of foregoing popularity for the sake of the kingdom. We will not be popular when we stand up against the realities of abortion, euthanasia,

or experimentation with embryos, which are the beginnings of life. We will not be popular if we tell the economists of our world that bigger is not always better if it involves the oppression of the poor and the elimination of family owned businesses. We will feel the weight of such a cross if we stand up to individual injustice and confront individuals with their sin. The weight of the cross is the weight of truth. If we remain steadfast to the truth, then it will truly set us free. In the shadow of the cross, this is our fundamental option — to direct our lives and choices to the ultimate goal of goodness and peace for all.



Prayer

For all those who bear the name of Christian, encourage us to accept and bear the cross of discipleship. Help us to embrace the truth that you have given. Whenever we are challenged by the sin of this age, give us the words and the strength to make your will known. In our witness to your truth, may we encourage others to embrace the life of the kingdom. Amen.

Voices of Faith

To deny oneself is to be aware only of Christ and no more of self, to see only Him who goes before and no more the road which is too hard for us. ... All that self-denial can say is: "He leads the way, keep close to Him."

"...and take up his cross." ...Only when we have become completely oblivious of self are we ready to bear the cross for His sake. If in the end we know only Him, if we have ceased to notice the pain of our own cross, we are indeed looking only unto Him. If Jesus had not so graciously prepared us for this word, we should have found it unbearable.[97]

To endure the cross is not a tragedy; it is the suffering which is the fruit of an exclusive allegiance to Jesus Christ. When it comes, it is not an accident, but a necessity. ... the suffering which is an essential part of the specifically Christian life....

The cross is laid on every Christian. The first Christ-suffering which every man must experience is the call to abandon the attachments of this world. ... we surrender ourselves to Christ in union with His death — we give over our lives to death. ... When Christ calls a man, He bids him come and die. ...death in Jesus Christ, the death of the old man [or nature] at his call. Jesus' summons to the rich young man was calling him to die, because only the man who is dead to his own will can follow Christ. In fact, every command of Jesus is a call to die, with all our affections and lusts. But we do not want to die...

The call to discipleship... means both death and life... [It] sets the Christian in the middle of the daily arena against sin and the devil. Every day he encounters new temptations, and every day he must suffer anew for Jesus Christ's sake. The wounds and scars he receives in the fray are living tokens of this participation in the cross of his Lord. ...

Christ transfigures for His own [the early Christian martyrs] the hour of their moral agony by granting them the unspeakable assurance of His presence. To bear the cross proves to be the only way of triumphing over suffering. ..."





An Ecclesiastical Latin Course Will Be Offered This Fall

In principio erat Verbum. A course in ecclesiastical Latin will be offered this year

by Steven Fachada who teaches Latin, Greek and Art History at the Community School of Naples. Participants will first learn the basic structure of the grammar and then turn to an examination of a range of Latin texts such as passages from the Gospels, the parts of the Mass, and other familiar prayers. No previous knowledge of Latin is expected or required.
