Annual Undy Sunday August 11 and August 18

It is back to school time for Lee County public schools Thursday, August 8, while Collier County students will return to school Monday, August 19. With this in mind, Catholic Charities of Collier County is once again sponsoring Undy Sunday the weekends of August 11 and August 18.

Organizers of the 17th Annual Undy Sunday event are preparing for more students than ever to be assisted with items to be ready for another school year. Needy children at 34 public elementary schools will benefit from the fundraiser.

Donors are asked to bring new socks and new underwear for boys and girls sizes six through 12. Monetary donations also are needed to purchase backpacks and school supplies. A total of 45 churches and synagogues will take part in the event.

Since the initial Undy Sunday in 1997, the number of participating churches has more than doubled. Approximately

750,000 undergarments have been given to disadvantaged children in Collier County during the past 16 years.

Youth Haven and the Shelter for Abused Women and Children also will receive the underwear and socks and school supplies to distribute to children during the school year.

As Scott Schlossberg, general manager, said in his *Scott's Corner* July 21, "It is hard to imagine these children doing without such basic necessities as clean underwear and socks; however, the fact is that this situation is all too prevalent throughout Collier County. The good news is that this is a program in which everyone can participate."

For example, a little girls combo pack (9 pairs of underwear and 6 pairs of socks) costs as little as \$10.50 at Wal-Mart (at the corner of US-41 and 111th Avenue North).

Sacrament of Baptism

Ernie Woon Sam Laid to Rest

Ernest “Ernie” Jerome Woon Sam, of Bonita Springs and parishioner of St. John for about 17 years, died unexpectedly Friday, July 26 while on vacation in Orlando, FL. He was 75. A Mass of Christian Burial was celebrated on Thursday, August 1, here at St. John.

Ernie was born July 20, 1938, in Trinidad, W.I., but moved to Toronto, Canada in 1969. There he graduated as a Certified Management Accountant (CMA). After a 25-year career with National Cash Register, Ernie owned and operated H&B Disher Courier Service in Toronto, which is still controlled by his two sons.

He relocated to Bonita Springs with his wife, Lorna, in 1992. Ernie and Lorna opened a Greeting Card Outlet in Bonita Springs in 1994, which also eventually served as a satellite post office. They sold the business in 2005.

During retirement, Ernie worked part-time at Bonita Golf and Country Club, as he was an avid golfer. He also worked at the Home Expo Design Center and was currently a poker dealer at the Naples Fort Myers Greyhound Track. Here at St. John the Evangelist, Ernie was very active in the Knights of Columbus Council 11281 and a faithful controller of the Arthur J. Corr Assembly 3308. He was also head of the Eucharistic Ministry, a member of the Men’s Club and the

Stewardship Council.

Following a long-time ambition, Ernie recently published a children’s book, *Adventures of Pudgie & Cuddie*. It is the story of two adolescent porcupines who decide to explore the world around their home when they should be sleeping during the day.

Surviving family members include his wife Lorna of 54 years, four children: Colin V. (Kelly) Woon Sam of Toronto, Cheryl C. (Wayne) Woon Sam-Alphonso of Toronto, Karen L. (Hugh Cotterell) Woon Sam of the Cayman Islands, Roger A. (Denise) Woon Sam of Toronto; as well as four siblings, 13

grandchildren, three great grandchildren, numerous nieces, nephews, brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law.

If you paid close attention to the consolidated financial statement in the bulletin last week, you would have noticed that gross revenue for our "Divine Gift Boutique" increased 113% over the same period last year. As you know, Jackie Gibson (Divine Gift Boutique Manager) was brought on board last summer to fill a vacant management position. Jackie brought with her over 30 years of experience in merchandising as she owned two Hallmark Stores in Michigan before retiring to Florida. After taking over, Jackie revamped the layout in the boutique and immediately engaged in a several new product lines. What she has done with such a small space is beyond amazing. As

a result of her success, we are expanding the Divine Gift Boutique. The Altar Server's Room which is adjacent to the gift boutique will soon become part of the gift boutique. We are currently in the process of modifying the sacristy (see pictures) to allow space for the altar servers. Once this modification is completed, the wall separating the gift boutique from the old Altar Servers room will be demolished, giving

Jackie an additional 150 square feet to sell her wares and giving prospective customers a little extra room to move around. Fr. John recently joked with Jackie suggesting that she will sell anything. In response, Jackie told Fr. John that if he wasn't careful, she would sell the vestments right off of his back. And for the right price, I bet that she would! I am eagerly awaiting this transformation and excited to see if Jackie can replicate her past success with the new expanded space. Considering that she recognized an increase of over 100% this year, we won't hold her to the fire to duplicate those results.

Did you take a look at the CFA summary on the opposite page? We are officially less than \$100,000.00 away (\$96,281.00 to be exact) from reaching our goal with approximately five months remaining in the appeal. In addition, we are \$73,419.00 ahead of where we stood at this same point in time last year. This is great news considering that we exceeded our goal last year by \$60,000.00. And

yes, that entire \$60,000.00 was returned to the parish free of assessment. Thank you so much for your continued support of the Catholic Faith Appeal.

Have you visited our memorial garden recently? Surrounded by a beautiful and very thick Ficus hedge on the Southwest side of the church, many would not even know this garden exists and believe it or not, some of our long time parishioners have



Conversely, when you pass away, you will leave your family one less thing to worry about.



Knowing Your True Treasure

*W*e have heard it said that a shroud has no pockets! It is so true. As we observe our world we catch glimpses of its craziness. Economic power receives a great deal of emphasis. People spend a lot of time worrying about money and storing up their treasures. Workaholics often struggle to accumulate wealth forsaking family and friends and sometimes working themselves to death. Never having enough, some people strive for even more, "If I just work a couple years beyond retirement, I will be much more comfortable." We also find families squabbling over an inheritance they feel is owed them.

Reflection Questions

1. What are the necessary and important things to you?
2. What is your most valued possession?
3. What achievements would you say you have accomplished?
4. What do you think God values most about you?
5. Imagine that you were told that this would be the last day of your life. What things do you think that you would change?
6. Are you willing to rid yourself of those things that hinder you from reaching your greatest potential in God's eyes? Why or why not?
7. If someone was to offer a eulogy at your funeral, what do you think they would have to say?

This preoccupation with money is nothing new. In today's gospel a brother is bickering with his sibling because of inheritance money! Jesus warns the brothers to be on their guard against greed. This encounter with Jesus shows us the importance of not being preoccupied with wealth and greed in our lives.

The parable of the rich man storing up treasure in larger barns is a prime example of how people become obsessed by possessions. Caught up in the moment of his good harvest, he decides that he will tear down his barns to make room for larger ones to vainly delight in his accumulated wealth. His future plans are for self-sustenance, not for God. God then tells the man his life could be taken from him that very night and shows him how foolish he is, having made no provision for God.

We all need to examine what is of value to us. A good lesson in life for me was in Naples, Florida where I presided over two graveside services. The one at beginning of the week was for a man who had been very successful in life. He was the CEO of a major company. At his funeral, numerous people got up to eulogize and praise his great economic achievements, but no one said anything about his character or personal faith. On Friday of that same week, I celebrated a funeral for a woman who had worked in the

service industry. There were only a couple of people at that funeral. I asked her daughter, "What was the most important thing your mother taught you?" Her response was profound, "My mother taught me how to love without condition and to accept everyone for who they are. She taught about the beauty of God." One cannot help but wonder who God thought brought the most riches to the world.

We cannot take our earthly treasures with us. Materialism becomes our master if we make it the priority of our lives. The gift of a successful relationship and a life well lived and respected, is what we take with us. The people we have touched in our lives will remember what touched them. The great qualities of love, compassion, concern, joy and hope are not taken away from us in death, but gifted back to our Father in eternity.


