


## October 5 Is Respect Life Sunday 🧶



#### Diocese Will Tape Two Masses for the Homebound at St. John on September 29

The first liturgy that will be taped is for World Mission Sunday, The celebrant will be Fr. John. The taped liturgy will air on Sunday, October 19.

The second liturgy that will be taped is for the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The celebrant for that liturgy will be Fr. Len. The taped liturgy will air Sunday, November 16.

All parishioners are invited to participate in the tapings as a congregation. Arrive around 9:45 a.m. Refreshments will be served after the second taping. The tapings will take about 90 minutes including a short break between the two Masses.

The Sunday Mass on Television is an outreach of the Diocese



#### Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

## #ToKnow – The Christian Life: Simple and Radical

Pope Francis reminds us this week that our role as Christian Catholics does not need to be filled with procedures and rules, but is a simple way of life. It is a "radical" idea, and somewhat "counter-cultural", but it is very true:

Jesus continued to talk to people and loved the people and He loved the crowd, to the point that He says, 'these who follow me, that immense crowd, are my mother and my brothers — that's who they are'. He explains: 'those who listen to the Word of God, put it into practice'. These are the two conditions in order to follow Jesus: to listen to the word of God, and to put it into practice. This is the Christian life — nothing more. Simple, simple. Maybe we've made it a little difficult, with many explanations that no one understands, but the Christian life is thus: listening to the Word of God and practicing it.

Every time we do this – each time we open the Gospel and read a passage and ask ourselves: 'Is God speaking to me with this? Is He saying something to me?' – and if He is saying something, what is it that He is saying? This is [what it means] to listen to the Word of God: to listen with your ears and hear with your heart. Open your heart to the Word of God. The enemies of Jesus heard the word of Jesus, but were there in order to try to find a mistake, to make Him slip, so that He would lose His authority. They never asked themselves, though: 'What is God saying to me in this Word?' God not only speaks to all: yes, he does speak to all of us – but He also speaks to to every one of us – to each of us. We proudly introduce parishioner Steven Fachada, who teaches Latin, Greek, and Art History at the Community School of Naples. Participants will first learn the basic structure of the grammar and then turn to an examination of a range of Latin texts such as passages from the Gospels, the parts of the



Mass, and other familiar prayers. No previous knowledge of Latin is expected or required.

After assisting with the **Ninth annual Glackin Classic** in the fall of 1997 and seeing the great demand for participation, especially from those who had not returned to Naples by October, I began a new golf tournament in 1998 to

One of my favorite events which I have hosted since 1998 is the **annual Super Bowl party**. This event began as the idea of a former parishioner and has been a

staple ever since. This past year we crammed well over 350 guests in ballroom to enjoy the game. The Super Bowl proceeds now are used to subsidize our Youth Ministry program and the kids participate during the event. I will certainly miss soliciting squares outside of all the Sunday Masses on the day of the big game. I would

be remiss if I did not recognize two individuals who have been by my side since the first game in 1998. Bob Garbinsky and Bob Valentine were always willing to lend a hand and help with coordination and especially with the sale of squares for the boards. As a matter of fact, these two Bobs also assisted me with the operation of those 20 golf tournaments mentioned previously. JP has assured me that the Super Bowl Party will continue in coming years.

And then there is the **Reverse Raffle**. This CFA Fundraiser always seemed to be my nemesis in regards to selling all of the 300 tickets necessary for the event to take place. Every year after all was said and done, we hosted an awesome event and made winners out of many of our parishioners. During my tenure, we hosted over 10 Reverse Raffles which generated over

\$150,000.00. JP has also expressed an interest in continuing the Reverse Raffle. I will only ask that you purchase your tickets early so that he will not have to deal with added stress in coordinating the event while worrying about whether or not it will actually take place.

Finally, the culmination of our efforts finally resulted in the creation **Family Fun and Ministry Day**. Only two years old, this is a true parish event in every sense of the word where over 1,100 attended just this past year. Free of charge and open to everyone from infants to the elderly, Family Fun and Ministry Day is a way for all of our Ministries to showcase their amazing works while the parish says thank you to all of our parishioners for their gifts of time, talent and treasure.

I truly enjoyed hosting special events during my time at Saint John the Evangelist. I always felt that these events were not only a lot of fun but also instrumental in creating a feeling of family within

> our parish. I believe that the continuation of such events is instrumental to the future of Saint John the Evangelist.

One thing that I bet many of you will not miss is my constant plea for funds to satisfy our **Catholic Faith Appeal** obligation. I expended a lot of energy conveying the very important message of the CFA to you in an effort to exceed our goal. For many years, I would speak during Masses on CFA kickoff weekend explaining the importance of the appeal.

After many years of doing so, it seems that everyone now understands the mechanics and importance of meeting and exceeding our goal. Hopefully we will exceed our lofty goal this year and on into the future. I will make this my final plea for the CFA, but please remember that the Catholic Faith Appeal

is the single most important component of our annual operating budget although the funds are technically not recognized on our P & L. We are still over \$100,000.00 shy of our goal with only three short months left in the appeal. Will you consider making a gift to the CFA so that we may reach/exceed our goal for 2014? I want to leave JP in good shape financially upon my departure and by meeting our CFA goal, this would go a long was in ensuring that he is comfortable while taking over the reins.





## The Reluctant Giver

here is power in Jesus' Word today as he confronts the chief priests and the elders with their hypocrisy. He uses the parable method to present the case and then poses a question to the religious establishment. They seal their own fate in the way in which they answer the question. In Jesus' example, the first son does the father's will regardless of his reluctance to do what was asked of him. The second son, however, tells his father what he wants to hear and then does nothing about it. Jesus is pointing out to the chief priests and elders that they are like the second son. The Father in heaven wills that they bring others closer to him. The leaders accept the invitation, but then hide behind the letter of the law, failing to bring people into the presence of God. They give lip service to God's saving power but do not expend the effort to make it a reality in the world. Further, even though tax collectors and prostitutes were looked down on by the ruling classes, Jesus points out that these sinners were more ready to receive John's message than they were. God's grace was at work in their

lives, turning them away from their sin and they allowed themselves to be transformed by the wisdom they received.

Cynics often criticize people who attend church on a regular basis for giving lip service to the message of the gospel. Some use this as an opportunity to suggest that is why they do not attend church. It is hard to be a Christian today because it demands more than lip service — it means that we must put into practice what we preach. A great deal of effort is involved in living the Christian life. The work of Jesus is never over. Even though we may be reluctant in our approach to the Father's will in our lives, once we struggle with the demands of our faith, God sees the blessing of our endeavors. *God loves the one who tries.* Jesus warned the chief priests and elders not to be self-righteous and superficial. Instead, he encourages these men to reach out to sinners and recognize the sacred ground of their road to transformation. *Jesus invites us to also journey down this road of transformation.* 

In order to discern the Father's will, we need to discern the needs of those around us. God is constantly asking us to reach out to the vulnerable and the poor. These people are present in our communities. Our response to their need ultimately reflects our understanding of the demands of faith and our commitment to God. When we truly live a Christian life we feel the pinch of sacrificing our time and we turn our energies to those who do not yet know the Living God. Jesus reminds us to hold onto the vocabulary of outreach and acceptance. This is what it means to know the Father's will — to follow the example of Christ and his commandment to love. The parable encourages us to move beyond spoken promises to incarnate the Word in our lives. By truly embracing the wisdom Jesus imparts in this parable, our lives become an expression of God's Word among us.



#### Prayer

Strengthen us, O Lord, help us to know your will. As the days pass, may we not neglect opportunities of fulfilling your will. Empower us to be doers of your Word. May our lives become a reflection of your presence to those we meet. Amen.

#### Wisdom of the Fathers

"In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples (cf. Mt 28:19). All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization, and it would be insufficient to envisage a plan of evangelization to be carried out by professionals while the rest of the faithful would simply be passive recipients. The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized. Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love. Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are "disciples" and "missionaries", but rather that we are always "missionary disciples". If we are not convinced, let us look at those first disciples, who, immediately after encountering the gaze of Jesus, went forth to proclaim him joyfully: "We have found the Messiah!" (Jn 1:41)...

... Of course, all of us are called to mature in our work as evangelizers. We want to have better training, a deepening love and a clearer witness to the Gospel. In this sense, we ought to let others be constantly evangelizing us. But this does not mean that we should postpone the evangelizing mission; rather, each of us should find ways to communicate Jesus wherever we are. All of us are called to offer others an explicit witness to the saving love of the Lord, who despite our imperfections offers us his closeness, his word and his strength, and gives meaning to our lives. In your heart you

know that it is not the same to live without him; what you have come to realize, what has helped you to live and given you hope, is what you also need to communicate to others. Our falling short of perfection should be no excuse; on the contrary, mission is a constant stimulus not to remain mired in mediocrity but to continue growing. The witness of faith that each Christian is called to offer leads us to say with Saint Paul: "Not that I have already obtained this, or am already perfect; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own" (Phil 3:12-13)."

#### **Follow Through**

By Janel Esker

Anyone who has played a sport involving a ball knows the importance of follow-through. Coaches repeat this lesson to their players: Stopping your leg when it touches the soccer ball won't result in a long kick. Swinging a bat partway around won't carry the ball far. To score the goal or hit the home run, you have to follow through with your leg or bat.

Today's Gospel is all about follow-through. A father asks his sons to work in the vineyard. One son says, "Heck, no!" but then does the work. The other son says, "Sure, dad!" but doesn't get off the couch. One son follows through; the other doesn't.

Sometimes we say an enthusiastic "yes" to God on Sundays, but that "yes" lacks follow-through after we leave church. Do we share the sign of peace with fellow parishioners but nearly run them over in the parking lot after Mass? Do we come to the Eucharistic table where people of all races and genders are welcome, but then on Wednesday exclude one of them?

Our follow-through is always incomplete, but that's why Christ—our model as well as our Savior—died for us. That's why we should keep trying to follow through. As St. Paul reminds us, Jesus is God's yes to us—he emptied himself and became human, showing us how to live with faithfulness to God, even to death.

In other words, he followed through.
