

SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH

Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

Everyone was excited to get into the park and enjoy the day. That included Fr. John, who as it turns out, is a bit of a daredevil! Many of the kids ran after the priests to get in line at rides like Cheetah Hunt and SheiKra to experience some big thrills.


“I had a fantastic time getting to know all the young people,” said Fr. Jim. “It took 40 years off my life — in the right direction!”

We continue to make advances technologically! As most of you are aware, we performed a direct bore from the PLC to the church over the summer and have connected the two buildings with fiber optic cable. The PLC and CFC were previously connected with fiber several years ago. We are now making another step in connectivity by

connecting the entire campus to a live fiber feed. Believe it or not, there is an existing fiber “run” down 111th Avenue North which we will be able to connect. By connecting the entire campus to fiber, our options moving forward are greatly enhanced. We look forward to our parishioners experiencing the fruits of our labor in the near future.

Do you remember my comments about the adjacent tennis courts being reconditioned several weeks ago? I mentioned how great they look with the caveat that Collier County should have addressed the drainage before engaging in a contract to resurface the existing courts. See the results of a three inch rain on already saturated ground.



The following information could be valuable to our parishioners, especially since many of you have actually recognized substantial gains in the market recently.

If you are planning to make a relatively substantial donation this year to a non-profit organization such as St. John the Evangelist or the Diocese of Venice, look through your portfolio before you write a check.

Since you will be making a donation to a qualified charitable organization and donations may be deducted on your federal income tax return as an itemized deduction, you should consider donating appreciated stock from your investment portfolio instead of cash. This works best for folks whose marginal tax bracket is 15 percent or higher and who claim itemized deductions.

Given the run-up in the stock market over the past 12 months and beyond, many investors who bought individual stocks are very likely to own shares that have substantial

unrealized gains. And some of those shares were bought just about 12 months ago.

The tax benefits -- which include deducting the amount of the charitable donation AND escaping the unrealized gains on the donated stock - come from the fact that the deduction for a donation of property to charity is equal to the property’s current fair market value. And when the donated property is an investment, the donor does not have to recognize the capital gain. These rules create a “double play” of tax benefits: a charitable deduction AND avoiding tax on the unrealized capital gains of the donated property.

For example, let’s say you bought stock for \$10,000 last September and today it is worth \$20,000. You plan to donate the entire amount to a charitable organization.

If you sold the \$20,000 stock instead of donating it, you would pay capital gains tax on the \$10,000 gain in value. The tax rate for long-term capital gains is 15 percent (20% for those with very high income.) Therefore, the tax savings for donating rather than selling the stock would be \$1,500 (10,000 x 15%).

In addition, you can claim a deduction of the market value of the donated shares -- the full \$20,000 -- as a charitable donation deduction. If

you are in the 25 percent federal tax bracket, this could generate another \$5,000 (20,000 x 25%) in tax savings. This brings your total tax savings to \$6,500. If you are in a higher tax bracket, your donation deduction will be even more. Also consider this: you are giving a gift that is two times what it originally cost you.

So as you can see your tax benefits from making a donation of appreciated stock versus giving cash can be substantial. And St. John the Evangelist/Diocese of Venice will be just as happy to receive the stock versus cash.





The Word & Life

The Challenge of the Cross



Our readings today speak to the heart of what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ. There is a cost associated with following Jesus. We are told that unless we carry our own cross that we cannot be his disciple. But does this mean that we should favor suffering in our lives? Does this mean that we will ultimately be miserable in following Jesus' way? No it does not! However, Jesus is telling us quite clearly that we will face challenges when we follow his way of love. His message was counter cultural in his time just as it is for the world today. That is why Jesus was crucified. He disturbed the peace. He shook people out of their complacency. Jesus' message of intimacy and approachability towards the Father in heaven ultimately distressed the religious teachers and challenged their concept of God. They sought to have him killed to silence his message. It is amazing to think that a carpenter from Nazareth would cause such a commotion and fall into the hands of the Romans, charged with civil disobedience. His cross represented the hardness of heart of the people who were closed to his message, adding to the many sins of the world that nailed him to the tree.

Reflection Questions

1. What does the "cross of discipleship" mean to you?
2. In what ways have you experienced the cross in your life?
3. How are you challenged as a disciple of Jesus?
4. When have you failed the test of discipleship?
5. How does the world's wisdom differ from Jesus?
6. How far are you prepared to go to give witness to your faith?

In the second reading, St. Paul finds himself carrying the cross of discipleship. He is now an old man, imprisoned in chains, who seeks to pass on the vital message of the kingdom of light and peace to Philemon and eventually to the world.

What is it about Jesus' message of peace and hope that brings so much contention? When we explore the significance of Jesus' teachings, we begin to see the inconsistencies in the values of the world that surrounds us. The gospel message confronts sin and makes all people accountable. When people are confronted with their sin, their immediate reaction is to close themselves to criticism. This is an instinctive human reaction. If we apply gospel values to the areas of politics, ethics, economics and social conditions, we find we are called to conversion in every aspect of life. When we take a stand as individuals and as a Christian community, it is then that we are faced with the cost of discipleship.

People become cynical and at times belittle our faith, suggesting that our values have no place in real world issues. As Christians we are asked to commit ourselves totally to Jesus' messages with every choice that we make. Sometimes we have to sacrifice popularity and choose the gospel path — the road less traveled. The cross of discipleship burdens us with the Truth that will set us and others free!






