Sacrament of Baptism

The Diocese requires that parents seeking baptism for their child attend a baptism preparation class. To schedule a baptism class, parents must be registered practicing members of St. John's for a minimum of two months. Classes are offered once a month and baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of each month after the 1:00 p.m. Mass. Please call the parish office to register for a class. Upon completion of the class and fulfillment of the godparent requirements, parents may schedule a baptism date.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Those who wish to be married in our parish must complete the Marriage Preparation Program. The Diocese requires a six month notice.

#ToKnow, #ToLove, #ToServe – State of the Parish: Budget and Expenses

St. John has had a banner year when it comes to our mission, our support of the community, and our growth of programs. The only way we have been able to successfully execute the new efforts along with our normal whirlwind of functions and activities is due to the entire Parish Family's active involvement, including the continued generosity of all of our parishioners. In the interest of complete transparency and collaboration, I wanted to provide you with the details from the past year's financial operations. This week, we will discuss last year's expenses and provide insight into our brand new budget process for the upcoming year.

The breadth and depth of St. John's missionary, ministerial, liturgical, operational and functional environment is truly aweinspiring. We literally support tens of thousands of people in our Parish Family and the local community with the efforts of our volunteers, staff, and clergy. The overall spending on all these good works can be seen as the Expenses of the parish. The Expenses, which are paid via our Offertory income (from last week) as well as all the various other income mechanisms the church has, allow us to see exactly how much we are doing as a community, and where we are growing.

For Fiscal Year 2015, running from July, 2014 to June, 2015, our overall expenses to support these efforts was \$3,014,056.13. This is certainly a milestone year. Not only have we become a \$3 million operations for the first time in our history, but the focus on major support efforts for the community has never been larger, creating a 9% increase over FY2014. At the same time, we have created several efficiencies to ensure the gifts you bestow on our parish are used for the Mission of St. John. This increase of expenses illustrates the growth of our parish in several ways. Here are a few highlights:

• Capital Repairs and Improvements due to last summer's extensive issues with damage and cleanup totaled over \$526,000. This includes the priorities that the Buildings and Grounds Council agreed for life safety for our Parish Family, including brand new fire systems in both the Church and the Parish Life Center

(PLC) as well as new air conditioning systems and cleaning in both buildings to ensure comfortable and healthy air flow.

- Providing over \$120,000 in tuition assistance for the youth of our parish to attend Catholic elementary, middle and high schools in the area who need support in order to pay for such an education.
- Ensured the upgrade to the Casa Maria Soup Kitchen in Immokalee with over \$40,000 in direct support via generous donations.
- Begun "Green" initiative for our church, including new Smart Meter




and the replacement of our lighting systems with LED, which will conserve power and lessen the heat from lights, which will provide a return on investment in less than three months due to the decrease in our power bill.

• Our salary cost is only 25% of our total expenses, a very small percentage compared to most churches, where the normal amount is between 40% and 50%.

As we have entered into this new era for St. John, with increasing programs for our Parish Family and the new Life Center's worth of activities, we have instituted a new budgetary process. This new process begins with redefining how we manage our income and expenses, including a new chart of accounts. A chart of accounts is a created list of the accounts used by an organization to define each class of items for which money is spent or received. Our new chart of accounts is tailored towards the organizational structure and programs of St. John, with the top levels being: Pastoral, Liturgical, Operations, Religious Education, and Family Mission. All functions of this church fall into one of these categories and will be easily traceable to the specific use of the funds provided for it purpose. For the first time ever at St. John, the staff and councils have created monthly budgets to ensure we know what we are spending and why we are doing it. You will see this change in upcoming bulletins in the fact that the "Weekly Budget" in the Collection Summary will be modified based on those budgets. You will be able to see how we are doing every week in real time.

We are anticipating continued growth in our expenses, similar to our income, due to our future plans, so please stay tuned for even more details on new and renewed programs and events that will showcase our focus To Know, To Love, and To Serve God, in His Church and Our Community.

Annual Undy Sunday Weekends of August 8-9 and August 15-16


Catholic Charities of Collier County is once again sponsoring its annual Undy Sunday the weekends of August 8-9 and August 15-16.





God's Bountifulness

s we enter into the story of Sacred Scripture we are confronted by what it truly means to be a person of faith. All of us are called to examine the foundation of our lives and to contemplate how God nourishes us with his Word and presence. In our first reading we recall the great event of the Exodus and how God had delivered the Israelites from the cruel Egyptian slave drivers and the terrible reign of the Pharaoh. As they journey through the wilderness with Moses they soon forget what the Lord has done for them and start to grumble and complain. Their current situation of suffering, impoverishment and lack of food cloud their ability to trust that God will see them through. Even in the midst of their failure to trust in the Lord, He hears their cries and provides. Quail and manna are gifted to feed their hunger. Bread from heaven satisfies these hungry souls. God's generosity and bounty are offered freely.

Likewise, in the reading from St. Paul to the Ephesians, he encourages the Christian community not to lose sight of God in their lives. A life without God is one which is open to corruption, deceit and futility. Paul reminds these believers that they are to live the truth in love by allowing the righteousness and the holiness of his truth to shape their lives. In Paul's view, living such truth offers a renewal in spirit; a new consciousness of the blessing of God in their relationships with one another and the world.

In today's gospel, Jesus knows the hearts of those who seek him out. They look for signs in order to figure the purpose of God in their lives. Jesus tells the people not to be satisfied by the fill of the meal which he had just offered, but to take the food that will not perish and which will be preserved for eternity. Of course Jesus is talking about himself. He truly is the bread which has come down from heaven, gifted by the Father, to satisfy the hunger of the soul. Jesus could not be any clearer when he said, "I am the bread of life, whoever comes to me will never hunger and whoever believes in me will never thirst." By digesting the wisdom of Christ and integrating that wisdom into hearts, our lives and our relationship, we are given food for the journey that will ultimately lead to heaven.

As we continue through the liturgical season of Ordinary Time this summer, we will hear more from the Bread of Life discourse from John's Gospel. Jesus will tell his listeners that this very bread that he offers is his flesh for the life of the world. Our Scriptures will encourage us. Let us contemplate our belief in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and see how we can spiritually be transformed. We have all heard it said, "You are what

you eat." When it comes to our belief in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist this is of profound significance. As we digest the body of Christ, we are called to become the Body of Christ – to become what we eat.

The food that Jesus gives us is different from the food the world offers us. Christ's food nourishes our very mind, body, soul and spirit. Whenever we feel down or lonely in life, Jesus nourishes us with his very presence – "...whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me willnever thirst." This is Jesus' promise to all of us. The words and actions of Jesus give us much food for thought. Jesus constantly shows us what is expected of us in our relationship with others. Jesus always brings people to the dignity of self – he heals, forgives and restores what is broken. Jesus' example is our food for the journey that will bring us one

day to everlasting life. We are all asked to share in the mission of the Church to feed the hungry and clothe the naked. We can do this in material ways, but sometimes there is a deeper call present to minister to the hunger of the heart.

A Note About Sacramental Preparation

The Diocese of Venice requires that students must attend a minimum of two consecutive years of Faith Formation to receive First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Students must be at least 7 years old by September 30, 2015, and in the 2nd grade to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Students are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of 10th grade. They must be at least 15 years old.

Because of the increased number of children preparing for First Reconciliation and First Communion beyond 2nd grade, we have added preparation classes on Sunday mornings so that these children can enjoy to the fullest, their Faith Formation classes without being "pulled out" for instruction. We will have a special teacher for them on Sundays from 9:00 - 9:30 a.m. It is our hope that this format will allow children preparing for the sacraments to make the most of this special time. This additional class time is for children in YEAR 2 of their preparation only. YEAR 1 students need only attend Faith Formation classes with their grade level. Their catechist will be made aware that they are in Year 1 of their preparation for instruction purposes.
