Dear Parish Family of Saint John the Evangelist,



#ToKnow – Thank You for Your Feedback!

Over the past several weeks, I have asked for your feedback on several essential decisions for our Parish Family. As many of you may have figured out by now, I hope the focus of St. John is to be welcoming, collaborative, engaging and open. I personally feel that the only way to create that type of environment is to be inclusive and transparent, which is why I have made communication such an important part of our parish. There are some decisions that should be made together, not in an authoritarian manner. These recent requests have given all of us an opportunity to be part of the solution to issues. Many of you have answered that call and have provided valuable feedback and suggestions that will make the future of St. John even brighter. Here are the results of your feedback:

- Musician and Liturgist: As you have read on the cover, Gary Prettyman has been chosen as our new Musician and Liturgist, and he has accepted the position. Gary was extremely well regarded by all of us and your feedback made the decision even easier.
- New Name of PLC: Our current Parish Life Center will be renamed so as not to create confusion with the new Life Center, whose construction planning is already underway. Your feedback provided a unique option that was not considered by the staff, and it was so good (and was the "write-in candidate that even won a majority of the vote), we are going with it: Parish Activity Center, or PAC. This is a perfect representation of this building, where so many activities will continue to be housed, from Faith Formation to ballroom dances, receptions to meetings.
- Hymnal vs. Missal: This is the most contentious feedback, with our Parish Family seeing the value in the current Hymnal, but desiring to have a more readings-centric Missal. We are negotiating with our publisher now to see how to best resolve this issue, but it is certainly looking like we want to move back to the Missal.

Thank you so much for all your active participation in our Parish Family! It is only together that we will accomplish God's work on Earth.

#ToKnow – Capital Planning and Budgeting: A New World for St. John

It has taken over a year to develop and enhance the financial structure of Saint John the Evangelist to become a transparent and mission-focused effort that provides for the spectrum of services and community of our Parish Family. With the help of the Finance Council and our Capital Planning Committee, we have identified both near-term and long-term needs as well as being able to schedule those requirements in a disciplined way. For example, this year we have significantly constrained our capital investments due to the anticipated (and now the reality) of our construction and renovation efforts. Following is the list of

We are now in a position where we have a solidified structure to our operating expenses as well, as I discussed a few weeks ago. That allows us to develop budgets not just based on plans, but also based on past experience. Last year was the first time St. John established a truly budgetary process, where organizations were required to provide their planned spending monthly basis, rather than whole annual numbers. This allows us to manage both our cash flow as well as plan for those above capital expenses so we do not put a strain on the gifts you, our Parish Family, continue to provide. It is our responsibility as the stewards of these gifts to be as efficient and mission-driven as possible. We have cut overhead costs with simple but effective steps like centralizing our office supply purchases and paper goods. We have put in place appropriate safeguards, to include procedures for counting and approving the fund-gathering and reimbursement process. Some of you may have noticed small changes, like ensuring two ushers are with the Offertory basket when it leaves the Sanctuary, and even making that part of the Recessional after Mass

A crossroads is upon us, however. St. John is about to embark on a new financial structure, along with a completely different operational environment. We now have persistent programs and activities staring up that will include costs and fees associated with them, from memberships to concert tickets, to food and drink, to sports leagues. It will require an entirely different effort on the part of our Parish Family to accomplish these programs, and that will alter the financial environment of the church as well, hopefully, bringing more income and most importantly, more people to our Catholic Faith.

thirsty" by donating to the food pantry. Organize a food drive to



A Courageous Walk Through the Narrow Gate

n the course of history, humanity has witnessed how countless individuals try to make their faith exclusive and absolute. We have all witnessed in our contemporary history how people will go to great lengths in proving a point for their faith. When we look at the current crisis of the threats of terror, where Muslim extremists are prepared to blow themselves up in order to teach the infidels of the world a lesson, we know how people can make absolute their convictions about their individual faith. Such people believe that their "martyrdom" will solidify their place in paradise. Similarly, there are some within the Christian community who honestly believe that recent natural disasters and diseases are God's punishment upon those who have not accepted Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior. In the Church's history we have witnessed how people were led to their deaths because of their denial to accept certain truths. Whenever we encounter such radicalism, faith becomes obscured and the reality of God's mercy and compassion is forgotten.

In the gospel today, Jesus is approached with the question, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" The questioner was most probably a Jew who would have believed that only his race was beloved in



the eyes of God. Such exclusivity would have been shared by the contemporaries of his day. Jesus' response shows that he is not necessarily concerned with numbers but rather the choices people would make in the course of their lives. He tells the inquisitive person and the other listeners to strive to enter the kingdom through the narrow gate of God's mercy and compassion. To bear a particular faith identity was not enough to secure salvation in Jesus' name. He uses the image of the master of a house who refuses admittance to those outside because he did not recognize them. The people who stand knocking at the door remark that they should be known through their sharing a meal with the master. However, such an encounter is not adequate to create a lasting impression where he would remember them. Jesus then surprises his listeners by telling them the kingdom will be inherited, not only by the Jews, but also by the Gentiles from the four corners of the earth. Jesus also remarks that if the chosen refuse to accept him, they will be last to enter the kingdom. For the Gentiles, who were offered his message and accepted it, will inherit the kingdom and become God's elect.

As we listen to God's Word today, we are being taught a profound reality. There is a special dignity enjoined on all us who bear the name "Christian". This by no means gives us the right to view ourselves as better than those who may be outside the faith. Our membership in the Church is not exclusive; rather it is a gift that is to be handed on to others. The conditions of our membership are demanding. We

are asked, by Christ, to enter the narrow gate. Each one of us is helped through this narrow opening through our efforts to do what is just and right. Our hunger for justice, equality, compassion, and concern, help us to walk through the narrow way. We are led to the threshold that admits us into the kingdom of God's joy by the experiences we have forged in our lives and in the way we have reflected God's wisdom. This requires conversion of heart each and every day where we internalize the virtues of charity and holiness. Each one of us is asked to include all those around us when we discern how we are to be converted. Our participation in salvation

history and our membership in the Church should never be taken for granted. All of us are asked to be aware of the special vocation given us by God and to be accountable for the gospel challenge which calls us to love all peoples.

Lord, help us to understand what it means to enter the narrow gate. Lead us in the ways of salvation. Help us to be truly compassionate as we seek to enter into your way of love and concern. May we soon be restored to a way of life that brings us security and peace. Amen.

Faith Formation & RCIA

Inquiries Welcome

You may have a friend or family member who has never been baptized, or baptized in another Christian faith. An acquaintance or coworker may have asked you questions about the Catholic Church. Someone may indicate to you that he/she is searching for a sense of community or a desire to hear more of the Good News of Jesus, the Gospel.

They are all cordially invited to inquire about the Catholic Christian Faith by attending an open informational meeting in early September, look for the date and time. This is their opportunity to ask questions about "things Catholic" such as what do Catholics believe and what do Catholics do? This is their opportunity to raise the issues that are on their minds or in their hearts. This is their chance to get information with no commitment!

Those who have never been baptized can investigate what it means to be Christian. Those baptized in another Christian tradition can explore the process to come into full communion with the Catholic Church. And those baptized Catholic as infants but never raised as Catholic can learn about being Confirmed and receiving the Eucharist.

The three phases of the parish-based process to become Catholic will be outlined. The first phase, appropriately called the period of inquiry, is an informal opportunity for interested individuals to begin the journey that may or may not result taking the next step toward full membership in the Church.

For those who choose, the next step is to enter the more formal process of the Rite for Christian Initiation for Adults (commonly abbreviated to RCIA) which begins in late November and culminates with the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) that are celebrated at the Easter Vigil in April.

The first step begins with you, today, as you invite your family members, friends, co-workers, or others to explore what it means to be Catholic. I'm available to either meet with you or any other interested individual or to facilitate a meeting with a member of the clergy.

Help Wanted

Whether you know of someone interested in learning more about becoming Catholic or not, there are other roles you can play in the Evangelizing Mission of the Church. Join the RCIA Team. Join the Adult Faith Formation Team.

There are needs for many different parishioners to fill many different roles.

Ambassadors of Welcome: Do you love meeting new people and networking? Are you someone who enjoys setting a table of refreshments and snacks for guests and visitors? Do people feel welcome and valued when they are with you? If so, you are a perfect candidate to provide that personal touch to the weekday and evening adult programs at our parish.

Sponsors: God does not choose the gifted, but gifts the chosen. Sponsors walk with the Inquirers, Catechumens and Candidates as they journey toward initiation into the Catholic Church. A sponsor is a person of faith and a practicing Catholic who becomes both coach and cheerleader. Many times great sponsors are involved as Eucharistic ministers, lectors, catechists or choir members. They may have been initiated into the Church as an adult through the RCIA process, or had a spouse, relative or friend who was. Training and guidance are provided.

Facilitators/Catechists: Even though you may not think of yourself as a "teacher" you may be valuable assisting in one of

the many faith formation programs. Adults learn most effectively through storytelling or "witnessing". When you speak from the heart and from your personal experience true communication occurs.


