The Casa Maria Soup Kitchen is part of the Guadalupe Social Services Catholic Charities organization in Immokalee. GSS serves hundreds of people in need on a daily basis with a food pantry, emotional and immigration counseling services, a free clothing donation room, and showers for those without water. The Soup Kitchen serves lunch Monday through Friday every week, feeding every single person who comes hungry, from infants to seniors. During Saint John the Evangelist's most recent visit on Tuesday, July 26, there were so many in need, an additional seating was required to ensure everyone was able to fill their stomachs and their souls with the generosity of the community and our volunteers.



This Soup Kitchen has only one staff member, so all the effort is accomplished with volunteers. From prepping the meal by cutting vegetables and pulling chicken to serving the food and drinks with a smile, to washing the dishes and the floors, the youth of our Parish Family showcased the best possible illustration of our faith in action. St. John is responsible for volunteering at the Soup Kitchen every fourth Tuesday. During the summer, our Youth take the lead in supporting the effort, but we need all the help we can get each month. 

#ToKnow – Financial Picture of St. John: The Expenses of a Parish Family

Sometimes, when you are looking at rows and rows of costs illustrating just what was spent over the past year and on what it was all spent on, you could start to glaze over, or even gloss over it in your attempt to just get to the "bottom line". Numbers have a tendency to do that. To me, however, our parish expenses showcase the enormous tapestry of support, engagement, learning, healing, faith, connection, and excitement that is Saint John the Evangelist. The breadth and depth of St. John's missionary, ministerial, liturgical, operational and functional environment is truly awe inspiring. We literally support tens of thousands of people in our Parish Family and the local community with the efforts of our volunteers, staff, and clergy. The overall spending on all these good works can be seen as the Expenses of the parish.

A few comments to assist you in understanding our Expenses, especially in relation to last week's discussion of our Offertory Income:


- Our Expenses are the total amount spent by St. John on all our efforts. That number is significantly larger than our Offertory collection, which is what we consider to be our Income. Your gifts for specific programs and events, along with special collections and second collections are not considered Income for the Parish, but we use that capital as you direct us to.
- Our Capital Campaign and our Catholic Faith Appeal are not considered Income to St. John (which is why they are not taxed by the Diocese), but any funds that we spend from those sources are part of our Expenses.

As you can see, we have increased again this year in our overall Expenses by roughly 7%. We have actually decreased our operational expenses with new vendors for church materials and even continue to reduce our wages to less than 23% of our total Expenses. That is considered extremely low, since most Catholic Churches' wages are between 40% to 50% of their Expenses. The increased Expenses are due to several major mission-focused factors:

- New roof for the Parish Life Center we were so blessed by your gifts that we did not need to dip into our Capital Reserves to pay for this essential renovation.
- Significant support increase to Guadalupe Social Services — through the amazing support of a single donor, St. John provided for the full renovation of the Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry of the Catholic Charities programs in Immokalee.
- Increased support for Catholic schools in Naples, FL
 — including tuition assistance for our Parish Family
 members.
- Increased direct support for counseling services for Parish Family members who require assistance to deal with grief, personal troubles, or physiological concerns if they are not able to afford these essential services.



- Capital Campaign expenses to ensure proper communication and engagement for the future of our church.
- Institution of new programs for the Parish Family, including the Adult Faith Formation efforts, a Divorced and Separated Support Group, the Catholic Youth Organization, and many others.

Next week, we will discuss the FY2017 budget of the parish. This will be the first year of our new programmatic focus, and you will see the continued increase in investment and opportunity that we have together to make a real difference in the lives of the community with positive and engaging efforts.




Day of Remembrance for the Unborn September 10


Undy Sunday Weekends Set for August 6-7 and 13-14





Did you know?

Canon 1246, §2 - Holy Days of Obligation

On December 13, 1991 the members of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops of the United States of America made the following general decree concerning holy days of obligation for Latin Rite Catholics:

In addition to Sunday, the days to be observed as holy days of obligation in the Latin Rite dioceses of the United States of America, in conformity with canon 1246, are as follows:

January 1, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter, the solemnity of the Ascension August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary November 1, the solemnity of All Saints December 8, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

December 8, the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception December 25, the solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord Jesus Christ

Whenever January 1, the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or August 15, the solemnity of the Assumption, or November 1, the solemnity of All Saints, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated (temporarily waived).

The Value of Preparedness

f all of us knew the time and place of our death, we would do our best to avoid that place! All joking aside, we must acknowledge the fact that death is as natural as birth. We all have to die, but it is not up to us to know the day or the hour. Jesus tells us to be prepared for that moment when it arrives. He advises us to get our own house in order so one day we will be ready to enter the Father's house.

In the gospel today, we hear Jesus present two parables. The first talks of the need for the servants to be ready for the Master's return from the wedding. Veiled inside this parable is the message that Christ will return some day and we are expected to be attentive to his needs. In a concrete way, we are reminded elsewhere in the gospel, by Jesus that we tend to His needs by attending to those around us. Similarly, the second parable is offered in response to Peter's question, "Lord, is this parable meant for us (apostles) or for everyone?" In response,




Jesus offers the apostles the parable of the servant who is left in charge to distribute the food. We hear that if the servant wastes the resources of his Master, he will be severely beaten and punished because he knew what was expected of him. This parable is meant for all of us. We are well aware of the expectations that God has for us. The expectation is that we live as Christ asked us to live and be accountable to the gospel message.

We have often heard the remark that each one of us should live each day as if it were our last day. When people find out that they are terminally ill, they tend to seek reconciliation and to heal past resentments in order to prepare themselves to meet God. It is unfortunate that it takes something so dramatic to give people a push in this regard. God has entrusted us with such a special gift – the gift of life itself. He endows us with this gift to nurture it and bring forth from what is life-giving, using the freedoms that are so rightly ours. Our choices and life mission should always reflect the choices and life mission of Jesus, that is, to do the will of the father and to accept the truth in love.

We should all take stock of our everyday activities to see where Jesus is present in our lives. If we cannot find the reality of Jesus in our experience,

then we must ask ourselves what we can do to make this a reality. It is evident, as we survey those around us, that many are living only for this world. This lifestyle is true poverty. We realize that our current experience of life is nothing compared to what has been prepared for us by our Father in heaven. This knowledge is the key that unlocks the fundamental options in life. Our choices and the accomplishments that we achieve in the name of Jesus are what ultimately pave the way to our true destiny.

Lord, may we be ready to meet you when you call us from this life to yourself. Help us to rid ourselves of the barriers that keep us from each other. May we, with your help, cherish the gift of the present moment. Let our lives become a prayer to you as we set our hearts on the life of the world to come. A Note About Sacramental Preparation

The Diocese of Venice requires that students must attend a minimum of two consecutive years of Faith Formation to receive First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, or Confirmation. Students must be at least 7 years old by September 30, 2016, and in the 2nd grade to be eligible to receive the Sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Students are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at the end of 10th grade. They must be at least 15 years old.




