# 2016 Catholic Faith Appeal This Weekend Is 2016 CFA Last Hurrah

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As scripture says, "And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus..."

The Catholic Faith Appeal (CFA) is one way to respond to this call. Through the generous commitment and participation to the CFA from many dedicated Catholics, the Diocese of Venice is able to provide programs to support the spiritual and material needs to help our brothers and sisters in need in the ten counties of the diocese.

How is the CFA funded? Diocese of Venice (DOV) imposes an annual assessment on every parish in the DOV. For 2016, St. John has been asked to contribute \$518,000. At this point, we have NOT met our goal for this year, and we currently stand at \$329,527.09. That is a large gap, and will require the parish to cover our shortfall from operational income and savings.

That is why we have designated this weekend as 2016 CFA Last Hurrah and the second collection will be for the 2016 CFA. This weekend you will hear comments from some of the leaders of our Parish family who receive and benefit from the wonderful programs and support from the CFA. Please give them your attention and assist us with our necessary goal.

In addition, outside the Narthex this weekend, there will be members of the Finance Council and the Pastoral Stewardship Council who will provide you with CFA literature and answer any questions you might have. Also, there will be a CFA video running that you can review. This video can also be viewed on the St. John website. Please take advantage of these resources.

We are asking each one of you to please participate in the 2016 Catholic Faith Appeal (CFA) so that together we may meet our goal.

#### 100 Straight Weeks: Campaign Support Strengthens Parish Family

Can you believe that it has been 100 straight weeks of updates on our Capital Campaign? From the introduction we began with nearly two years ago, we have not missed a week to communicate to you what our vision is for the future of our church and how we will be taking care of our heritage as a Parish Family. There were a few times where we may have diverged from this focus to relate other insights, like during the Paris attacks or on the anniversary of 9/11, but we have attempted to ensure all of you who have given generously to St. John with your time, talent and treasure can see the fruits of your labor. The **Build Our Future**, **Serve our Past** campaign has been a tremendous success, and we still have a full year plus to go in order to achieve all our goals together.

One item that we asked for your feedback on was the new naming convention for the rooms of our campus. Aside from rooms that have naming opportunities, we wanted to have a consistent way to name the rooms that we all will be inhabiting here. Those names should speak to our Catholic identity, but should also be approachable for all our guests, no matter who they are or what they believe in. Thank you all for your feedback and suggestions. We have decided to name the main rooms of the campus with cities from the New Testament. The option was chosen by our Buildings and Grounds Council after discussion of all the potential choices. There are some possible focal areas. Perhaps we use the cities of the steps of Saint Paul, or the cities that framed Jesus' ministry? The only caveat for the names is that they must be short and easily pronounceable, so that it can be simple for someone to say, "We are meeting in the Rome Room", for example. It would be harder to say, "We are meeting in the Amphipolis Room". If you have any suggestions of specific cities, please let me know. We will need at least six, replacing the Seminar Room, Library, Choir Room and Adult Meeting Space, while needing new names for the Multi-Purpose rooms of the Life Center.

There are, however, still several naming opportunities for the Life Center that you could consider, if you are looking for a Christmas gift for a loved one that will last forever. Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent, gets its name from the first word of its Introit, or Entrance Antiphon, for the day: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." (Phil. 4:4-5, the second reading of the day) Why do we rejoice? Because the 3rd Sunday of Advent always means that we are more than halfway to Christmas (cf. the modern 'celebration' of Wednesday as 'hump day' of the work week). Thus, the liturgical color of the day is rose, the color of joy! Interestingly, the 4th Sunday of Lent is Laetare Sunday for the same reason. These are the only two Sundays of the church year when the liturgical color is rose.

### A Dream Come True

ohn the Baptist is the great model of preparation as we move forward through this holy season of Advent. He spent his life preaching repentance and urged people to prepare themselves to meet the promised one. In today's gospel, we hear of John's longing to know whether or not Jesus was the dream of God. John is in prison because of his witness to the truth. Even though he gives witness to Christ at the Jordan River, he begins to doubt in his isolation — he needs reassurance. Jesus' response is very clear: "Tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and poor have the good news proclaimed to them." This is the prophecy of Isaiah fulfilled; the dream of the people of Israel comes true. John the Baptist was the messenger, and Jesus was certainly the message. Jesus continues to reassure us that he is the answer to our prayers; it is through him that God's dream for each of us is realized. The coming of the Messiah brought with it the advent of healing and restoration. This is what we are asked to focus on as we approach the sacred time of the Incarnation. In the Christmas event, humanity is redeemed, restored, and made whole by the events surrounding Jesus' life, death, and



resurrection. As we approach the story where extraordinary events surrounded the unlikely location of a Savior's birth, we are reminded that all this took place for each one of us.

The needs of our time are not unlike the needs that Isaiah and Jesus discerned. The world still requires healing. People remain feeble, weak, frightened, poor, and needy. In a sense we long for Jesus in the midst of our challenges just as much as John the Baptist longed to know if Jesus was the one who is to come. We are asked to wait patiently for the Lord as we discern his presence in our lives. Faced with many challenges, we must remember that Jesus walks with us throughout those experiences offering us hope. How do we know this for sure? The answer lies with faith. Without faith we have no hope. With faith, we

have the assurance of everlasting life and are given the promise that we will never be left alone. Jesus is with us until the end of time!

There is a danger in viewing the past events of the gospel as if they are a reality beyond our reach. In the event of the Incarnation, we are reminded that redemption and salvation are readily available to each one of us. Every time Jesus heals someone in the gospel, he is teaching us how we may be healed or how we can heal one another through faith. Jesus shows us the way to the Father every time that he reaches out to the feeble and the weak. Each of Jesus' parables and teachings give us the blueprint of how to live our lives — opening us to the heart of our God. This is what salvation in Christ means — to know God and to live in His ways. In living the gospel, we keep the dream of God alive!

#### **Prayer**



# Celebrating the Saints: Our Lady of Guadalupe and Saint Juan Diego

Under this title, Our Lady is the patron of Mexico, the United States, and all of the Americas, as well as the protector of unborn children. In 1531, she appeared in a vision to the peasant Juan Diego on Tepeyac Hill near Mexico City and charged him with asking the bishop to build a church on that spot. But the bishop demanded a sign, so Our Lady had Juan gather flowers in his cloak in December to take to the bishop. When Juan opened his cloak, the colorful image of Guadalupe was emblazoned on the cactuscloth. That icon is preserved in the most famous shrine in the Western Hemisphere, and Our Lady of Guadalupe continues to inspire poor and oppressed people worldwide. (info: myusccb@usccb.org)



Beginning in January two programs will be offered.



Look for the details on when and where, but decide this is the year you will begin.



Still today, the Mount Athos monks perpetually pray the earliest known prayer of the Desert Fathers. You will learn the three dimensions of the Jesus Prayer according to St. Augustine, and be able to read what the Catechism of the Catholic Church reveals about this powerful mystical prayer.


