### Our Church Building Needs Us: Renovations for St. John

Through the continued generosity of all our Parish Family, year round and seasonal, meeting the remaining goals of the **Build Our Future**, **Serve Our Past** capital campaign will allow us to provide the current and future maintenance needs of the existing facilities here at St. John. We have already been overwhelmed by the generosity already provided, but we must continue our efforts together to reach our Pinnacle Goal of \$14 million. Our church, the original building that has housed us all for well over a quarter century, is in significant need of major renovations. From small changes that most would barely recognize to major functional efforts, below is a list of a few of these areas we still need your support to achieve:

- *Roof:* St. John's church still has the original roof, now about five years past its useful life expectancy. In order to replace this roof, we will not only have to take the current roof off, but we will have to bring all the infrastructure surrounding the roof (insulation, air flow and ductwork) up to code and replace the components that no longer work.
- **Skylight:** Did you know there is actually a skylight above the altar? Through time and wear, it has sealed over. We must decide if we will keep it or make it part of the standard roof and ceiling.
- Air Conditioning: As many of you have told me recently, now that the AC is working properly, it may be too strong, chilling our seats with the constant flow of air to remove the moisture and heat from the 1,300+ people during a full Mass. Unfortunately, it was not designed to cool the altar at the same level, thereby requiring more air flow than needed just to get to the priests and deacons, who are covered in their vestments. We must re-engineer the air conditioning to get as many people comfortable as possible.
- Confessionals: If there is one "constructive criticism" I have heard about our church the most (and I will tell you I hear on a daily basis just how beautiful our church is), it is the Confessionals. I have been told they look like an office cubby, where someone might as well be doing paperwork than engaging in a Holy Sacrament. We should take the time to develop these spaces to be welcoming and warm places for us to receive the gift of Reconciliation.
- Overflow: Anyone who has been to our Masses has experienced the wonderful expression of joy, love, and mercy that the Catholic faith and Mass provide. However, especially with our seasonal Family Members here, it can be quite packed within the church. It is all of our responsibility to create an overflow capability that can handle the swelling of our Parish Family.

These are just a few examples of the renovations we will be undertaking. If you have yet to make a commitment or provided for our campaign, we ask that you prayerfully consider how you can help us make our goals for the capital campaign a reality for all our Parish Family and the local community here in Naples. While we have begun the work our current blessings have allowed us to accomplish for the **Build Our Future**, **Serve Our Past** capital campaign, we still need our entire Parish Family to give in order to reach our additional goals. ### #ToKnow, #ToLove, #ToServe — How St. John Will Focus on Giving to Others As Well As Giving Up for Lent

During this Year of Mercy, understanding the love and gifts that God has given us, even if we are in pain or experiencing loss, is essential so we can "be merciful, like the Father". Pope Francis explains how this Mercy is so important, especially during Lent:

God's mercy transforms human hearts; it enables us, through the experience of a faithful love, to become merciful in turn. In an ever new miracle, divine mercy shines forth in our lives, inspiring each of us to love our neighbour and to devote ourselves to what the Church's tradition calls the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. These works remind us that faith finds expression in concrete everyday actions meant to help our neighbours in body and spirit: by feeding, visiting, comforting and instructing them. On such things will we be judged. For this reason, I expressed my hope that "the Christian people may reflect on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy; this will be a way to reawaken our conscience, too often grown dull in the face of poverty, and to enter more deeply into the heart of the Gospel where the poor have a special experience of God's mercy" (ibid., 15). For in the poor, the flesh of Christ "becomes visible in the flesh of the tortured, the crushed, the scourged, the malnourished, and the exiled... to be acknowledged, touched, and cared for by us" (ibid.). It is the unprecedented and scandalous mystery of the extension in time of the suffering of the Innocent Lamb, the burning bush of gratuitous love. Before this love, we can, like Moses, take off our sandals (cf. Ex 3:5), especially when the poor are our brothers or sisters in Christ who are suffering for their faith. - Pope Francis Lenten Message 2016

I hope you take advantage of this weekend's opportunities to learn about how St. John will be supporting efforts to give back within our parish, like the Ladies of Charity and Knights of Columbus, to give locally, with Guadalupe Social Services at the Ash Wednesday's Feeding Hunger Filling Hearts and A Simple Gesture next weekend, and internationally with Shelter Box outside of the Masses, and the Jamaica Outreach Program. All of these programs help us live out the works of mercy that bring us closer to each other and to God.


hen we examine our faith and our lives, many of us may feel unworthy of God's love because of human weakness. In today's Sacred Scriptures, both Peter and the Prophet Isaiah were called by name to follow the Lord. Both felt unworthy of His call. It is such a sobering thought to know that God calls His people just the way they are. As

the Scriptures unfold, divine revelation leads to knowledge and truth. It is through this wisdom that we are transformed. As we contemplate the message of the prophets, the wisdom of Jesus, and the collective faith of the early Church, we may think that we are not worthy of the unfolding mystery of God's love. However, salvation history teaches us that we *are altogether worthy of the grace bestowed upon us* through these sacred events. Isaiah must have spent a great deal of time in prayer to discern God's wisdom. This same wisdom is gifted to each one of us.

We know Peter walked the dusty roads of Galilee with Jesus witnessing with his own eyes the action of God in the world. The gospel event of the "great catch" symbolizes the power of God breaking into the world. The abundant catch the apostles experienced was Jesus' reminder to them that they must go and gather just as many souls for the kingdom of God. Peter failed in many ways to comprehend the message of Jesus' ministry. He failed to see the importance of Jesus' suffering, even though he was the first to proclaim Jesus to be the Christ. Peter denied his humble teacher three times, weeping bitterly at his failure. But Jesus makes all things new by asking Peter a three-fold reconciliatory, "Do you love me?" After which Peter is told, "Feed my sheep." Peter made mistakes as he followed Jesus. In spite of Peter's humanity, Jesus continues to ask him to follow him and lead by word and example.

So where does this leave us? Through the very human story of our salvation history, each of us is called to give witness to the gospel, regardless of our failures and mistakes. We cannot hold on to our past sins and be held captive by them — we are asked to move forward positively and be "fishers of men". Concretely,

we are asked to recognize our fragility and embrace at the same time, the divine call to serve others. We serve others by engaging in the ministries of the Church and serving in local community organizations that continue Jesus ministry. Maybe some of you are already serving the Lord by being a caretaker to a spouse, or a parent. Maybe you are a parent who is helping your children grow into maturity. There are many unconventional and conventional ways to serve the Lord. By responding to the needs that exist around us, we answer God's call. Each of us is given a vocation in life. Through prayer and reflection we can come to know God's will for each one of us.



### Prayer

Lord, no matter how unworthy we might feel at times, help us to be generous in answering your call. Inspire us to move beyond our sin and weakness, and move forward in your gracious love. The world is hungering for your presence and the reality of your kingdom. Let each one of us be a reflection of the message of your kingdom. Amen.


